The Old Timer Show and PeeWee Show are open to age appropriate fairgoers to compete in a friendly Fitting and Showing Contest using dairy animals already being exhibited. Showmen not exhibiting a dairy animal themselves will need to make arrangements to borrow an animal. No premiums will be given. Sign up will be in the Dairy Barn during Fair.

General Dairy Rules

- Entries in the dairy class are open to registered and grade animals cared for and fitted by 4-H club members.
- 4-H Members must be enrolled in a 4-H Dairy Project by June 1st to participate in any 4-H Dairy Department activity.
- Dairy certificate and enrollment must be in the Extension office by June 1st. Dairy record agreements must be turned into the Superintendent beginning day of the fair.
- No animal will be allowed to compete for more than one premium, nor shall be entered in more than one class, except as one of a group class.
- Each 4-H member will be allowed a maximum of four animals. In case of shortage in stall space, 4 H members with the most entries will be cut first.
- The same cattle cannot be shown in both 4-H and FFA.
- All animals must have a double tie at night. No baling twine or wire.
- No dairy animal with horns will be permitted to exhibit except those entered in the Junior Heifer calf class. Horns, as defined for all other age classes, shall include "scurs", "nubbins," or "stubs", which extend beyond the skin more than one inch.
- All milk must be put into tank and will become property of the fair. All medicated animals must be milked last if using the parlor.
- A respiratory complex vaccine is strongly recommended four weeks prior to the fair.
- Bovine Veterinary Checklist should be presented at Vet Check.

DIVISION A - FITTING AND SHOWING

All 4-H exhibitors must participate in showmanship to receive premiums. Be sure the exhibitor's birth date is correct. All dairy breeds will show together.

DIVISION I – START TO FINISH EVENT

Open to all 4-H Members with a dairy project. Participant must have experience handling heifers.

Teams will be chosen and assigned at the beginning of the event. Must enter online to participate. Premium is awarded to each team member. MUST complete all phases of the event to receive premium.

1. NW Start to Finish Event

This is a 3-person assigned team event. Each team works with a non-halter broke heifer (4-6 months of age). They will wash, train to lead, clip, and prepare the heifer for a Fit and Show event. Each member gets the opportunity to show the heifer and their handiwork. Teams will be judged on participation by all members, communication between team members, helping each other to learn better or new fitting skills, and the final end result. This is a great time to practice or learn teamwork, fitting skills and showing skills, as well as provide an educational opportunity for the public! Each exhibitor must provide their own equipment including clippers. Heifers will be provided. Show attire - white shirt, clean pants, and close-toed shoes.

Exhibitors: Please notify your club leader of your intention to participate in this event.

<u>Club Leaders:</u> Please assist your club members in this event by making sure there is a set of clippers in good working condition available for their use. (One set of clippers is needed for every 3 members participating.)

SELF DETERMINED PROJECT

Enter your 4-H dairy self-determined project in the 4-H Pygmy Goat Department.

Bring into the Jansen Building to be judged, the first Thursday of the fair. Contact person is Joyce Hubbard. This class is for any project made that is associated with your 4-H dairy animals. Projects will be displayed all 10 days.

DIVISION K- CLUB HERDSMANSHIP

To be entered by Club Leader only.

Herdsmanship judging will be done on a club basis at least two times each day. Club stalls will be judged during the entire Fair. Judging will be based on condition of animals, cleanliness, attentiveness of exhibitors, arrangement of club, stall, and educational displays and decorations.
