HORSE DIVISION RULES:

1. 4-H members must prequalify at a Whatcom County 4-H Horse Qualifier Event.
2. 4-H members may use only their project horse.
3. 4-H Horses will remain on the fairgrounds August 8-12 first 5 days of Fair.
4. 4-H members must enter Showmanship, Horse Judging, and choose at least 3 classes. You will be paid only for the 3 highest ribbon classes.
5. Champions in each class, Grand and Reserve Champion in each division.
6. 4-H Leaders and Volunteers must be registered as such with Whatcom County 4-H to participate in the Leader Show.
7. Fair veterinarian must and will reject any animals with an infectious disease or ectoparasites, ringworm, warts, pink eye, strangles, contagious ecthyma, scabies, lice, mites, ticks, fleas, and all respiratory diseases. All horses must be inspected before entering the barn.
- 8. Equine Health Declaration must be filled out and presented at vet check in.**
9. Medications may be given only with permission of the Superintendent and under the care of a veterinarian. Name and reason for medication from the veterinarian must be turned into Superintendent in writing. No performance altering medications are allowed.
10. No horse will be clipped or bathed on the Fairgrounds. This is to be done prior to arrival.
- 11. Two exhibitors sharing a horse must be in different age groups. No horse may be shown by more than two exhibitors.**
12. 4-H members may exhibit only one horse at the Fair.
13. Horses must stay out of parking areas.
14. Each exhibitor must clean their own stalls to the floor. This includes removing all duct tape, staples etc. that you have used in your stall area. All clubs must strip stalls and remove decorations. Trash and shavings must be separated.
15. Removing hay or grain furnished by the Fair or local businesses is not allowed.
16. Superintendent has the right to accept or refuse any entry.
17. Reminder 4-H horse exhibitors must do a Public Presentation in the current 4-H year to qualify to show at the 4-H State Fair.

FOR VETERINARIAN USE ONLY – CHECKLIST TO BE MET FOR THE NORTHWEST WASHINGTON FAIR

The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infectious diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:

- Strangles
- Respiratory Disease
- Ring Worm
- Warts
- High Fever

No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs):

- Mange
- Lice
- Gastro-Intestinal (i.e. Evidence of Diarrhea)

Adequate Body Condition – Minimum BCS of 4/9 – Henneke Scale

- 1-2: Severe Emaciation
- 3-4: Thin
- 5-6: Healthy
- 7-8: Overweight
- 9: Sever Obesity

- Feed and water should be available at the Fair at all times.

Lameness/Prescription Drug Use

- Horses on any prescription meds, especially *Bute*, *Banamine*, *Equioxx* or *Surpass* SHOULD bring a letter of explanation from their Veterinarian.
- No horses with significant lameness, arthritis or chronic laminitis will be admitted.
