Showmanship Attire: Collared shirt, jeans, belt, shoes with closed toe AND closed heel (slip on or lace up), leather boots preferred.

1. All project animals must be owned or leased by June 1st. Please refer to 4-H rules if borrowing an animal.
2. 4-Hers must be registered in a Goat Project Area by June 1st.
3. Each 4-H member may enter 7 animals in the pygmy goat show (stall space permitting). Exhibitor entry limit of two animals per class.
4. 4-H members must show in Fitting and Showing to earn premiums. Exhibits must choose at least one goat fitting and showing contest to participate in from pygmy, pack, and novelty provided they are also showing in type/pack/driving. For example, an exhibitor showing a Mini Silky in Novelty Type and Pack Goat Performance may enter either one or both Novelty Fitting and Showing and Pack Fitting and Showing.
5. Two 4-H Youth Members may jointly care for and show one animal if the animal is not entered into market animal projects. These members may not compete directly with one another.
6. Overall 4-H pygmy goat show (pygmy, pack, and novelty) showman will compete in 4-H Large Animal Round Robin Competition on Saturday.
7. Grand and Reserve Champion rosettes will be awarded. Showmanship and Overall Type Trophies will also be given during Awards Ceremony.
8. Vets and superintendent reserve the right to refuse entry to fair based on health or safety reasons.
9. No does allowed past 3 months pregnant. No Bucks will be allowed.
10. Water must be always in pens.
11. No horns.
12. A novelty goat is defined as a small goat that is purebred or cross-bred lineage; is up to 23 inches in height and weighs no more than 65 pounds.

The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infectious diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:

- ORF
- Infectious Foot Rot
- Ring Worm
- Warts
- High Fever
- Respiratory Disease

No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs):

- Lice
- Evidence of Diarrhea
- Dry, Hoarse Cough
- Mange
- Pale Mucous Membranes

Adequate Body Condition – Minimum BCS of 2.5/5

- 1: Emaciated
- 2: Thin
- 3: Good Condition
- 4: Overweight
- 5: Obese
- Feed and water should be available at the Fair at all times

Castrated Properly

- Do your best to have castration done ahead of time so the site has time to heal properly

Dehorned properly and completely healed
