Llama and Alpaca Rules:

- Seniors may apply to use two llama/alpaca projects. This must be approved by the Superintendent and is subject to approval based on space restrictions.
- Available space is usually full. Priority will be given to clubs exhibiting the previous year.
- Ownership must be established, or contract written and dated by May 1st.
- You must enter fitting and showing and skills handler to receive premiums in other animal classes.
- Exhibitors must adhere to club guidelines. Failure to do so may result in the loss of premiums.
- Llamas and alpacas must be at least 6 months old unless accompanied by their dam.
- No ungelded males over the age of two years are allowed. Gelding must be done at least one month prior to Fair.
- The Superintendent will excuse animals that are not safe for the public and/or exhibitors from the Fairgrounds.
- Animals of opposite sex must not be stalled together unless gelded or spayed.
- Exhibitors are responsible for their own animal's care in the a.m. and p.m. This includes assigned herdsmanship duties.
- Llama/Alpaca exhibits must remain in the llama/alpaca area unless granted permission otherwise from the Superintendent, Competitive Exhibits Office, or Fair Manager.
- Superintendent has the right to accept or refuse any entry.
- All non-4-H display items must be approved for posting or displaying by the Fair Manager and/or their delegate. Farms who supply animals for use by 4-H youth are not considered sponsors.
- Any llamas/alpacas with drop pasterns or other health or physical problems will not be accepted as an entry in this department by the Veterinarian.

All 4-H exhibitors must participate in showmanship.

FOR VETERINARIAN USE ONLY – CHECKLIST TO BE MET FOR THE NORTHWEST WASHINGTON FAIR

The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infectious diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:

- ORF
- Infectious Foot Rot
- Ring Worm
- Warts
- High Fever
- Respiratory Disease

No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs):

- Lice
- Evidence of Diarrhea
- Dry, Hoarse Cough
- Mange
- Pale Mucous Membranes

Adequate Body Condition – Minimum BCS of 2.5/5

- 1: Emaciated
- 2: Thin
- 3: Good Condition
- 4: Overweight
- 5: Obese
- Feed and water should be available at the Fair at all times

Castrated Properly

- Do your best to have castration done ahead of time so the site has time to heal properly
