Show Clothes & Equipment: Collared shirt, jeans, belt, shoes with closed toe AND closed heel, leather boots preferred but not required.

SWINE GENERAL RULES:

1. All project animals must be owned by June 1st.
2. Fitting, feeding and stall duty/cleaning tasks done by exhibitors only.
3. Animals will be shown by weight.
4. **Limited to one animal per exhibitor in 4-H Market Hog and FFA Swine.**
5. Animals shown in 4-H Market Hog Department are not eligible for show in 4-H Breeding Swine or FFA.
6. 4-H members must show in fitting and showing in order to show in type and receive department premiums.
7. Rosettes for Grand and Reserve awarded if deserving. Grand Champion Overall Showman qualifies to compete in the 4-H Round Robin on Saturday.
8. All tack, feed, etc. must be stored within allotted areas. You may be asked to share tack space with other clubs.
9. No pens may be separated or broke into smaller pens without permission from the Superintendent.
10. **All swine must have USDA identification.**

DIVISION A - FITTING AND SHOWING

All 4-H exhibitors must participate in showmanship. Overall showman will compete in Round Robin Competition on Saturday. Age for showmanship determined by 4-H age as of October 1.

1. Novice, first year fitting and showing swine
2. Junior 8-10 years of age, as of October 1 of previous year
3. Intermediate, 11-13 years of age, as of October 1 of previous year

FOR VETERINARIAN USE ONLY – CHECKLIST TO BE MET FOR THE NORTHWEST WASHINGTON FAIR

The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infectious diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:

- Erysipelas • Evidence of Diarrhea • Ring Worm • High Fever
- Snout Health/Respiratory • Evidence of Coughing

No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs):

- Lice • Mange • Ticks

Adequate Body Condition – Minimum BCS of 2.5

- 1: Emaciated • 2: Thin • 3: Good Condition • 4: Overweight • 5: Obese
- Feed and water should be available at the Fair at all times

Castrated Properly

- Castration site must be completely healed

Swine Handling: Very Important at Fair Time

- Prevent Fighting
- House Properly
- Prevent Overheating/Hyperthermia
