Late entries will be charged a fee of \$25.00 per head through July 12. After July 12th late entries will not be accepted.

1. Entries in FFA Dairy are open to registered and grade animals cared for and fitted by FFA Chapter members.
2. **The same cattle cannot be shown in 4-H and FFA.**
3. Open Class Dairy shows the first 5 days meaning dairy shown in Open and FFA will be at Fair all 10 days.
4. All animals must have a double tie at night. No baling twine or wire.
5. No dairy animal with horns will be permitted to exhibit except those entered in the Junior Heifer calf class. Horns, as defined for all other age classes, shall include "scurs", "nubbins," or "stubs", which extend beyond the skin more than one inch.
6. All milk must be put into tank and will become property of the fair. All medicated animals must be milked last if using the parlor.
7. A respiratory complex vaccine is strongly recommended four weeks prior to the fair.
8. Bovine Veterinary Checklist should be completed and presented at Vet Check.

## DIVISION A - FITTING AND SHOWING

All FFA exhibitors must participate in showmanship. Overall showman will compete in the FFA Round Robin Competition.

5. Junior yearling heifer, born after March 1, of the previous year and before May 31, of the previous year
6. Winter yearling heifer, born after December 1, of 2 years previous and before February 28, of the previous year
7. Senior yearling heifer, born after September 1, of 2 years previous and before November 30, 3 years previous

### FOR VETERINARIAN USE ONLY – CHECKLIST TO BE MET FOR THE NORTHWEST WASHINGTON FAIR

#### ID Prior to arrival:

- REQUIRED: Legible Bangs Tattoo on females over 12 months of age.
- RECOMMENDED: USDA Metal ID or Brucellosis Tag & USDA NAIS ID & RFID Tag

**The goal of the Veterinary Inspection is to minimize the potential for contagious and infectious diseases (including parasites). Examples of Infectious Disease and Parasites include:**

- Infectious Foot Rot
- Snotty Nose/Respiratory
- Ring Worm
- Pinkeye
- Coarse, Dry Cough
- Evidence of Diarrhea
- Warts
- High Fever

#### No Visible External Parasite Burden (or related clinical signs):

- Mange
- Lice

#### Adequate Body Condition – Minimum BCS of 2.5

- 1: Emaciated
- 2: Thin
- 3: Good Condition
- 4: Overweight
- 5: Obese

- Feed and water should be available at the Fair at all times

**Dehorned properly and completely healed**
