## Rules:

- 1 All animals entered must be registered or recorded with their respective breed organizations. The registration certificate of each animal shall be submitted to the chairman of the show when the sheep arrive at the show.
- 2 All exhibitors must comply with all applicable General Livestock Rules and Livestock Health Requirements set forth in this catalog. A scrapie ID ear tag or other approved ID is required.
- 3 Pens are approximately 6 foot square. Pens will hold at least three (3) sheep. Each exhibitor will be allowed one (1) tack pen, provided availability of pens. No pens are to be taken down to make to make larger pens.
- 4 Lambs must have all lamb teeth. The certificate of registration for each animal will be used to determine the age and the proper class.
- 5 Yearlings must show yearling teeth.
- 6 All sheep to be exhibited must be washed, groomed, and fitted prior to entering the show ring.
- 7 Exhibitors are limited to two entries in each individual Class and one entry in any group class. Animals must show in their respective Divisions to be eligible for group classes.
- 8 Exception to Class Number may be made when an exhibitor wishes to enter a younger animal in the next older age class. In no case may an older animal be entered in the younger age Class than its birth date.
- 9 Substitutions will be allowed at the discretion of the department chair, BUT no additional animals can be entered after entry deadline.

## Breeds

- 1 Breeds will be determined at time of entry.
- 2 A breed will be considered with 15 entries from 3 exhibitors.
- 3 A maximum of 7 breeds will have individual shows with others in AOB. The breeds with the most entered.
