Rules:

1. This open show is sanctioned by the American Dairy Goat Association for the following breeds: Nigerian Dwarf, Nubian, LaMancha, Toggenburg, Recorded Grades, and AOP. **Animals will be shown in this order and order is not subject to change. ADGA RULES SHALL GOVERN.**
2. **The Junior and Senior shows are separately sanctioned and the order of the show is NOT subject to change.**
3. Entries are not limited, but each exhibitor will be eligible for only two monies in each class. Premiums will be paid based on results in Ring 1 ONLY. Premiums will not be paid in Ring 2. Two show rings will be held simultaneously for each division beginning with Ring 1. Showing will begin in Ring 2 in the same breed order one hour from the start of Ring 1 and after the completion of the first breed shown in Ring 1 and continuing through breed order in both rings concluding with the last breed finishing in Ring 2. No group classes in Ring 2. **The Shows are limited: once barn reaches capacity, additional entries MAYBE returned. Entry date will determine order of entries received.**
4. Pens are approximately 6 foot square. Each exhibitor will be allowed one (1) tack pen, provided availability of pens. No pens are to be taken down to make to make larger pens.
5. All Tennessee Health rules shall be observed. Refer to the Tennessee Dept. of Agriculture rules listed earlier in the catalog for Health Certificate and Brucellosis requirements. In addition to the Dept. of Agriculture Health Requirements, an exhibitor must have in his or her possession a certificate or statement from a licenses veterinarian dated within 30 days prior to the show date declaring the herd to be disease free and healthy. Anyone failing to present the required statement or certificate will not be allow to show. **Anyone presenting for exhibition an unhealthy animal, an animal not in proper show condition, an animal that would pose a risk to the general public, or animals not presenting The Nashville Fair in a positive way risks having the entire herd refused or specific animals quarantine at the individual or collective discretion of the Dept. Head, the Livestock Supt. Or Official State Fair Veterinarian are final. No entry fees will be refunded.** Any questions regarding

infectious or contagious disease of a herd shall be brought to the attention of the Superintendents.

“Federal law requires that all sheep and goats on exhibition have scrapie ID ear tags, or other approved ID.” Other approved ID for dairy goats is their unique ADGA tattoos reflective on their ADGA registration paperwork

6. Goats under 6 months of age may be shown with stamped duplicate application for registration. Original registration certificates are required on all goats 6 months or older. The show will follow the most current rules of ADGA regarding registration certificates.
7. There will be no pre-show milk out.
8. Animals must be tattooed prior to arrival and presented for showing in a cleaned and groomed manner.
9. Exhibitors must comply with all applicable General Livestock Rules set forth in this catalog.
