#### **SHOW RULES**

- 1. This is an ADGA Sanctioned show, therefore ADGA Rules shall govern.
- 2. The Junior and Senior Doe are separately sanctioned by ADGA for the following breeds: Alpine, La Mancha, Nigerian Dwarfs, Nubian, All Other Purebreds and Recorded Grades.
- 3. State of Alabama health rules and import requirements shall be observed for all goats entering the state of Alabama participating in this show.

All goats entering the state of Alabama are required to have a Certificate of Veterinary Inspection by an accredited veterinarian, within 30 days of the show. The inspection certifies the animals are free from symptoms of contagious diseases. These include, but are not limited to: sore mouth, pink eye, ringworm, abscesses, CAE, and E. coli. The following written statement is required on CVIs:

"All animals are free from scabies, lice, foot rot, scrapie, blue tongue, and have not been exposed to Brucellosis, TB, or scabies, and are not from herds which are not under quarantine for scabies."

Additionally, the State of Alabama requires all goats, 6 months and older, must come from a Certified Brucellosis free herd, or be negative to a Brucellosis test within 30 days prior to show date. ALL goats of any age, must come from a Certified free TB state, a Certified free herd, or be negative to a TB test within 30 days prior to show date.

Please ask your veterinarian to state your herd or state certification for Brucellosis or TB on your certificate if applicable.

Presenting obviously unhealthy animals may, subject to the ruling of the show chairman, result in the entire herd's disqualification from the show.

4. All goats must be checked in and CVI's checked **prior to unloading.** Please do not unload your goats prior to check in. A Dairy Goat Show Committee Member will examine all CVI's, certifications, and/or neg Brucellosis test paperwork at check in, and clear you to unload.

The state of Alabama will provide a state designated certified animal technician to assist with any animals which show symptoms of infectious/contagious disease after check in.

By application for admission, each exhibitor agrees to show their animals subject to these rules. Presenting obviously unhealthy animals may, subject to the ruling of the Dairy Goat Show Chairman, Mickey DeShazo, result in the entire herd's disqualification from the show.

- 5. Goats under 6 months of age may be shown, with stamped duplicate application for registration issued by ADGA. Original Registration Certificates are required on all goats 6 months or older.
- 6. The base date for the show is Monday, November 7, 2022, the date the animal is to be judged.
- 7. Any exhibitor, or owner, in any way involved in showing a fraudulent entry will automatically forfeit all prize money won by himself or his farm and will be barred from future participation in this show.

- 8. Animals must be in place by 8:00 PM on Sunday, November 6, 2022. Release will be November 7<sup>th</sup> at the conclusion of the show. Animals may arrive any time after 2:00 pm on November 6<sup>th</sup>. There will be no pre-show milk out.
- 9. Entry fee is \$6.00 per animal. Pen fees are \$5.00 per pen, and are due with your entry fees. Exhibitors will no longer be required to clean their pens before leaving the fairgrounds. The deadline for online registration is October 10, 2022. No entries will be accepted after October 10, 2022. Any entries received after this date will be returned. NO EXCEPTIONS! - 10. Judging will begin at 9:00 AM. Current order of show: Sr. Does, Showmanship and Jr. Does. Order of all shown will be Alpine, La Mancha, Nigerian Dwarfs, Nubian, All Other Purebreds and Recorded Grades.
- 11. No horned animals are allowed.
- 12. All animals shown in special classes must be shown in the regular classes.
- 13. The National Peanut Festival Association, Inc., or the show chairman will not be held responsible for any animal or personal property.
- 14. No pens are to be rearranged. The only exception is the center gates may be opened.
- 15. AFTER UNLOADING, ALL TRAILERS NEED TO BE MOVED TO THE DESIGNATED PARKING AREA. ANY TRAILER NOT PARKED CORRECTLY & LEFT UNATTENDED WILL BE TOWED.

The National Peanut Festival Association reserves the right to make and post rule changes as needed. The order of the show is subject to change.
