**Special Rules**

**\*Please make sure Artwork entered is not a conflict  
or offensive to any Tribe or Pueblo.**

1. Artwork must have been made by Native American Indians of federally regulated tribes. Entry forms must be signed.
2. Artists who enter Artwork in Native American Indian Art Gallery may not enter Artwork in Hispanic Art, Fine Art Galleries, African American Art or Non-Professional Art. See rules per art department.
3. **Artist is asked to provide a completed W-9 upon registration in order for the Fair to process award premiums or art sales payable to artists.**
4. The NM State Fair is a family-oriented event. Any artwork found to be offensive or in bad taste will be removed by Fair officials.
5. Artwork will be juried by competent, non-competing artists, crafts people and qualified experts selected by the New Mexico State Fair Art Department.
6. **To be considered for judging Artist may select up to four (4) pieces per class, upon entering artwork.**
7. Awards are given according to the artworks merit. At the discretion of the judges, award will not be given due to lack of competition in class entered.
8. Honorable mention ribbons are awarded for outstanding articles other than 1st, 2nd, and 3rd prize winners.
9. Precautions are taken for the safety of all entries, but in no case will the New Mexico State Fair, State of New Mexico, employees, contractors or volunteers be held liable for the loss or damages to any entry while in the Fair's possession. **Dealers and Artists are encouraged to carry their own insurance.**
10. Authentic Native American items may be entered by the Artist or Dealer. The authenticity of items entered is the responsibility of the Artist or Dealer and must be labeled as such. Dealers must have the name and address of Artist to enter the artwork. Dealer's address will not be allowed under maker's name.
11. Please observe number of items permissible to enter in individual sections.
12. Dealers' names and address will not be allowed on back of entry tags. You may not enter artwork from a **deceased** artist or a living artist that can no longer produce his work. **Work entered by dealers may not compete for awards.**
13. Artists may photograph their own entries if they desire to do so (Please let State Fair staff know of your intentions).
14. Artwork entered must be for sale. Price must be indicated on form & entry tag. A 25% commission charge will be deducted from price indicated by Artist/Dealer at time of entry on all work sold during the fair.

15. Ribbons must remain with articles sold. A duplicate ribbon (if available) or a certificate will be furnished to artist.
16. Unsold Artwork must be picked up by presenting claim tags & form receipts given to them at time of entry. **Artists Only:** Artwork must be picked up on **Monday, September 19, 2022 from 9:00 AM - 4:00 PM.** **Dealers:** Artwork must be picked up **Tuesday, September 20, 2022 from 9:00 AM - 3:00 PM.** Any artwork remaining on the Fairgrounds after September 20, 2022 will become the property of the State Fair to be disposed of at its discretion.
17. Artist & Dealers recognizes that marketing of the Fair and its grounds requires use of photography and video. Artist & Dealers hereby expressly grants to the Fair the irrevocable, assignable right and license to take, use and publish Artist & Dealers images and artwork without the need for any other approval. Artist images and artwork will not be used for profit.

**Section 270 - Pottery  
Classes 1 – 5**

**All pottery must be traditionally handmade by Native American Indians of Native American Federally Regulated Tribes. Pottery must be traditionally Native American Indian-made and fired, (exception being ceramics) and if paint-decorated, painted before firing.**

1. Handmade: Storage jar, Seed jars, Bowls (2" or more) any type, Canteen, Wedding Vase, Plate, any design: polished, painted, unpainted, carved, incised (scrimshaw). Fetish Pots, any size.
2. Handmade: Pottery Doll, any type or design, Nativity Set, Storyteller, Sculpture Type pottery Figurines
3. Pottery (masks, wall hangings, etc.)
4. Jewelry: Traditional Pottery and Ceramic Jewelry
5. Ceramics: Storyteller, Nativity Sets, Pot's mold poured, any type

**Section 271 - Jewelry and Accessories  
Classes 6 – 10**

**Sterling Silver:** Items will not be accepted that are made of German silver (nickel) or silver plated. When chains are used as an accessory, they must be sterling silver.

**Gold:** must be 10K or finer (no gold-plating or gold-filled accepted, except in chains when used as an accessory; this must be stated on ticket).

Must be handmade by Native American Indian silver/goldsmiths (except for minimum findings), otherwise the artwork is misrepresented and will be subject to disqualification by the judges. Turquoise items must be labeled as natural, stabilized, or treated.

6. Jewelry: Bolo, Belt Buckles, Hatbands, Bracelets, Ankle bracelets, Brooch, Pendants, Crosses, Earrings, Ear cuffs, Rings, Choker-any type, Jewelry Set (2 or more pieces), etc.
7. Silver Beads – Silver tubing, Heishi Necklace (any type, any material), Fetish necklace (any material, any type), Necklaces - Mixed beads, nugget or turquoise strands
8. Cuff links, Tie bar, Tie tack, Collar tips, Boot tips, Key rings, Money clips, Nail files, Eyeglass chains, Hair pieces, any type, Buttons, Button Covers, any items not listed above
9. Concho belts, Watchbands, Watch bracelets, Squash Blossom (includes sets 2 or more pieces)
10. **Gold Jewelry:** Women's, Men's or Gold and Silver combination jewelry

**Section 272: Youth - Miscellaneous**

**Classes 11 - 16 (18 years of age or younger)**

All paintings must be completed during 2022. Art work must be framed and wired for hanging. Paintings smaller than 9"x12" after framing or larger than 12 sq. ft. will not be accepted. No prints - only originals accepted, the exception being photography.

The New Mexico State Fair Arts & Cultural Committee may select one or more Purchase Awards during the 2022 Fair from the artwork offered for sale in the Native American Art, Fine Art, Hispanic Art or the African American Arts Exhibits.

Purchase Awards will become part of the State Fair Permanent Collection.

The management reserves the right to postpone purchasing artwork until another Fair is scheduled. A 25% commission charge will be deducted from the purchase price stated by the artist at the time of entry.
