## General Rules

### Classes subject to change

1. Age limit of 18 years old and younger are allowed to enter the Junior Agriculture Division.
2. Contestants will not be allowed more than one entry in the same class, but may enter open classes.
3. Ribbons will be awarded in each Section.
4. **Premiums will not be paid except as noted in Section 6 – 7, Class 205 – 206.**
5. Precautions are taken for the safety of all entries, but in no case, will the New Mexico State Fair, the state of New Mexico, employees, contractors or volunteers be held liable for the loss or damages to any entry while in the Fair's possession. Participants are encouraged to carry their own insurance.
6. Participant recognizes that marketing of the Fair and its grounds requires use of photography and video. Participant hereby expressly grants to the Fair the irrevocable, assignable right and license to take, use and publish participant images and work without the need for any other approval. Images and work will not be used for profit.
7. Participants are responsible for picking up their own entries or provide written authorization for pick-up by another individual.
8. **NEW: Entries** must be picked up Monday, September 15, 2025 from 9:00am – 5:00pm. Any entries or items remaining on the Fairgrounds after this date will be considered abandoned and shall become the property of the NM State Fair to be disposed of at its discretion.
