Announcements

Show Sanction Details

This show is officially sanctioned by The American Dairy Goat Association. ADGA rules shall govern. Jr. & Sr. Does are not sanctioned separately. Show order is not subject to change.

Eligibility

Open to All 4-H and FFA Youth – Both In-State and Out of State Open to all youth ages 9 - 19 In-State

Entries

The entry deadline is midnight August 1 of the current year. Entries will only be accepted online through the New Mexico State Fair website. The entry fee is \$15 per goat. The entry fee for the Showmanship Class is \$5. There is no limit on the number of goats each exhibitor may enter. Late Entry Fee: Late Entries will be accepted until August 10 of the current year with a late fee of \$250 per animal. ALL ENTRIES MUST BE ENTERED & PAID ONLINE.

Fees

Youth Show: \$15.00 for each class entered in the Youth Division.

Youth Show Showmanship Class: \$5.00.

Open Show: \$15.00 for each class entered in the Open Division.

Dairy Goat Arrival / Departure

Arrival: Friday, September 16 between 8:00 am to NOON Departure: 2 hours after conclusion of Open Dairy Goat Show

Special Rules

1. Rules:

- a. All rules governing livestock in the General Rules and Regulations and Junior Livestock rules apply to this department.
- b. Youth exhibitors may enter eligible animals in open classes and/or milking competition by completing an "Open Livestock Entry Form" and paying the additional entry fees.
- c. Animals shown in the youth department must have been continuously owned or leased (as indicated by registration or recordation papers) by the exhibitor not less than 90 consecutive days prior to the opening day of the Fair. Lease forms where applicable must be presented at check-in.
- d. Animals must be shown in individual classes to be eligible to be shown in a group class. Group classes require an entry fee.

2. Entry Regulations:

- a. All animals must be entered in the name of the owner or of the person leasing the animal.
- b. Ownership must be dated at least 90 days prior to the opening day of the fair.
- c. Only does are eligible.
- d. No entry will be accepted without registered tattoo recorded on entry card.
- e. The animal's tattoo must be legible or the entry will be disqualified and no premium will be awarded.
- f. All goats, regardless of age, must be registered with the American Dairy Goat Association, the American Goat Society or the Canadian Goat Society.
- g. Stamped and duplicate applications will be accepted on animals less than 6 months of age.
- h. **No** signed transfers will be accepted as per ADGA rules. See Livestock Division 4 to enter animals in Open Show also.
- i. Tack Pens: Limit two per exhibitor upon availability. Check with Superintendent at time of check-in. \$8.00 per pen.
- 3. Exhibitors are required to be neatly and appropriately attired. Exhibitors may wear white shirts and denim jeans or dairy colors while exhibiting.

Youth Show Group Classes

Each animal in a group must be shown as an individual in the appropriate class.

All Group Classes in Youth Show are not defined the same as Group Classes in the Open Show since Youth Show is sanctioned differently. Youth Show Group Classes are defined as follows:

1. Junior Get Of Sire:

- a. Shall consist of three does under two years of age that have not freshened, the get of one sire
- b. Sire must be named on entry form
- c. Each exhibitor limited to one group entry per named sire
- d. All does need not be owned by exhibitor

2. Senior Get Of Sire:

- a. Shall consist of three does, at least one in milk, the get of one sire
- b. Sire must be named on entry form
- c. Each exhibitor limited to one group entry per named sire
- d. All does need not be owned by exhibitor

3. Dairy Herd:

- a. To consist of four does in milk
- b. All animals must be owned by exhibitor
- c. Each exhibitor limited to one entry per breed

4. Breeders Trio:

- a. To consist of three does any age
- b. All bred by the exhibitor
- c. Each exhibitor limited to one entry per breed
- d. All does need not be owned by exhibitor

5. Dam and Daughter:

- a. To consist of Milking Dam and one daughter
- b. Dam must be named on entry form
- c. Each exhibitor limited to one entry per dam
- d. Both does need not be owned by exhibitor

Championship Awards

- **1. Junior Champion** of Junior Division in each breed is chosen from the first place dairy goats from classes 1 through 5.
- 2. Junior Reserve Champion of Junior Division in each breed is chosen from the dairy goats eligible for Junior Champion and the second place animal from the class producing the Junior Champion.
- **3. Senior Champion** of Senior Division in each breed is chosen from the first place dairy goats from classes 7 through 10.
- **4. Senior Reserve Champion** of Senior Division in each breed is chosen from the eligible dairy goats for Senior Champion and the second place animal from the class producing the Senior

Champion.

- **5. Grand Champion** The Champion from the Junior Division and Senior Division shall compete for Grand Champion.
- **6. Reserve Grand Champion** shall be selected from a class of the Junior or Senior Champion that has not made Grand Champion and the animal that stood Reserve to the Grand Champion.
- 7. Best Doe in Show is selected from the Grand Champion of all breeds present.

- 3. Does, 3 yrs and under 4, born Sept. 19 two years prior through Sept.18 three years prior
- 4. Does, 4 yrs and under 5, born Sept. 19 three years prior through Sept. 18 four years prior
- 5. Does, 5 yrs and over, born before Sept. 18 five years prior

Awards

Championship Awards

- 1. Junior Champion: In each breed is chosen from the first place dairy goats from classes 1 through 5.
- 2. Junior Reserve Champion: In each breed is chosen from animals eligible for Junior Champion and the second place animal from the class producing the Junior Champion.
- Senior Champion: In each breed is chosen from the first place dairy goats from classes 10 through 14.

- 4. Senior Reserve Champion: In each breed is chosen from the eligible animals for Senior Champion and the second place animal from the class producing the Senior Champion.
- 5. Grand Champion: The Champion from the Junior Division and Senior Division are selected separately for Grand Champion
- 6. Reserve Grand Champion: Is selected from a class of the Junior or Senior Champion that has not made Grand Champion and the animal that stood Reserve to the Grand Champion.
- 7. Best Doe of Breed: Is selected from the Senior Champion and the winner of the Champion Challenge Class of that breed.
- 8. Best Doe in Show: Is selected from the Best Doe of Breed of all breeds present.
