Entries: Fleece exhibits will be received Thursday, September 9, 2022 from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

No Entry Fee Special Rules

- 1. All entries and awards in this department are subject to the General Rules and Regulations.
- 2. This department will be open to receive fleeces the first Thursday of fair between 9:00 am 5:00 pm in the Jr. Livestock Pavilion Show Ring. If fleeces are shipped, carrying charges must be prepaid and exhibits must arrive not later than the first Wednesday of fair. Fleeces must be properly presented for show, in a clear plastic bag. Each fleece should be well cleaned and skirted. One fleece per bag.
- 3. Eligibility each fleece entered must:
 - a. Have been shorn in the past 12 months. The base date is September 2, 2022
 - b. Represent no more than 15 months growth for yearlings, and 9 months growth for mature animals. Spring fleeces must have been shorn January 1 of the current year to June 30 of the current year. Fall fleeces must have been shorn September 3, 2021 to December 31, 2021 or July 1, 2022 to September 2, 2022
- 4. Points of disqualification:
 - a. Improperly prepared for the show. This includes washing, carding and any other preparation other than hand skirting.
 - b. Contamination with sisal or polypropylene fibers.
 - c. Inclusion of parts of another fleece.
