

# PREMIUMS AND SPECIAL AWARDS

## Award and Premium Information

1. All exhibitors are eligible for standard awards and premium payouts. Special Awards will only be paid to residents of the northern 10 counties of Idaho. **The possession of ribbons and exhibit cards does not entitle the holder to awards.** The awards on exhibits are paid only on the record of awards returned to the Fair Office by the Superintendents.
2. Individual exhibits are limited to one cash award in any one class.
3. The American System is used, and decisions of the judges are final. Judges choose (1) first, (1) second, and (1) third place winner in each class; however, the judges reserve the option to withhold ribbons and awards in a class where there is no deserving entry. Disrespect shown to any award or to any judge by an exhibitor forfeits all awards made to him/her. Violation of any of the rules listed will cause the exhibitor to forfeit all awards.
4. Grand Champion awards are presented to the "Best" entries in each department. "Best" is defined as "that which demonstrates the best technique, skill or animal in the eyes of the judge".
5. Special Premium awards are sponsored by local businesses and individuals. A first and second place is awarded to entries that the judges determine warrant special recognition. Special Awards and premiums will only be paid to residents of the northern 10 counties of Idaho.
6. Open class cash awards will be available for pickup on Saturday, August 26 from 4 pm to 7 pm and Sunday, August 27 from 11 am to 4 pm at the south end of Building 8. Premiums may also be picked up from the fair office Monday, August 28th 3 pm to 7 pm and Tuesday, August 29th through Friday, September 1st during regular Fair Office hours, 9 am to 4 pm daily. Exhibit awards are paid to the entry record returned to the Fair Office by department Superintendents, possession of ribbons does not entitle the holder to awards. **Award premiums not claimed by September 1, will be considered a donation to the Fair's general fund.**
7. All protests must be in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$50, which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Protests must state plainly the case of the complaint or appeal and must be delivered to the Fair Manager within six hours after the cause of protest.

## General Awards

Department premiums vary; livestock exhibitors see individual departments for premiums and awards.

**Grand Champion:** \$15 & rosette ribbon to the best overall entry in each department.

**1st place:** \$7 & blue ribbon

**2nd place:** \$5 & red ribbon

**3rd place:** \$3 & white ribbon

\*\* Cash awards will be available for pick-up during Premium Payouts.

## Premier Exhibitor Award

The adult exhibitor accumulating the most overall points will be awarded \$40 and a special award. Second place earns \$30 and a certificate. **Youth premier exhibitor** will be awarded \$25 and a plaque. Second place youth earns \$15 and a certificate. Points for ribbons are as follows: Special Placing: 6 points, Blue: 5 points, Red: 4 points, and White: 3 points. Premier Exhibitor will only be paid to residents of the northern 10 counties of Idaho.

## Superintendent's Award

A rosette ribbon will be awarded by the department Superintendent to the entry that merits special recognition. Entry does not have to be a placing exhibit to qualify.

## First Time Exhibitor

This category was created to offer the opportunity of exhibiting without the nerves and intimidation that potential exhibitors may have. Each exhibitor entering for the first time will receive this award in hopes to encourage future creations. This information will be requested when exhibitors first register. Unfortunately, there is no premium for this award.

## Special Entry

We encourage all community members to get involved, this award is for exhibitors with special needs and other circumstances. For questions whether you are a qualified exhibitor in this category, please contact the fair office. We trust that exhibitors are mindful and honest when entering. Unfortunately, there is no premium for this award.

## Premium Payouts

Exhibit awards are only paid to the entry record returned to the Fair Office by department Superintendents, possession of ribbons does not entitle the holder to awards. Only exhibitors residing in Idaho's northern 10 counties are eligible for special award premiums.

**All premiums will be paid out of the South end of Building 8.**

Open class livestock cash awards will be available for pickup on Sunday, August 20 from 4 pm to 8 pm and during all other open class premium pickup times. 4-H, FFA, and Youth Stock Show award premiums will be available with open class premium payouts during fair Saturday, August 26 4pm – 7 pm, and Sunday, August 27 from 11 am – 4 pm. Premiums may also be picked up from the fair office Monday, August 28th 3 pm to 7 pm and Tuesday, August 29th through Friday, September 1st during regular Fair Office hours, 9 am to 4 pm daily. **Award premiums not claimed by September 1, will be considered a donation to the Fair's general fund.**

### Special Premium Awards

Judges will award entries warranting special recognition first place \$10 & a rosette ribbon, and second place \$5 & a rosette ribbon. Only to be awarded in the areas listed based upon sponsor associated with each award.
