### General Rules for Honey

Please contact superintendent with entry questions and to clarify requirements!

- Limit **one** entry per class per exhibitor.
- 17 & under enter youth divisions 0390, 0391, and 0392.
- Entry is free if pre-entered online or by form in the Fair office by 12 PM, August 7. Exhibits registered during entry are subject to a \$1 fee per entry.
- Only pre-enter classes you know you have an entry for. If you are unsure, please wait and enter when dropping off all entries.



## EXTRACTED HONEY

*Division 0300 (Adults 18+)*

- Two samples constitute an entry.
- Exhibited honey may be produced in 2024 or 2025.
- Clear glass containers only. No labels, stickers, or markings.
- Liquid Honey (16 oz Queenline-style jars only)
- Exhibitors may have assistance with selecting the appropriate color class when entries are delivered.
- Creamed Honey (8 oz Wide mouth clear glass jars only)

### What the Judges look for in Extracted Honey

- Density: moisture content
- Absence of: crystals, bubbles, and foam
- Cleanliness: No lint, dust, wax, bee parts, or foreign objects
- Flavor & Aroma: No burnt or objectionable taste from honey processing or management of bees
- Color: light, amber, or dark
- Container appearance: exterior cleanliness, and accuracy of filling to the same level in both jars
- Creamed honey consistency: smooth and fine

- 02 Amber color (includes extra light amber, light amber & amber)
- 03 Dark color (includes dark amber through black – cannot see through it)
- 04 Creamed Honey
- 05 Hot Honey
- 06 Other Honey, identify -contact superintendent for requirements

## CAPPED HONEY IN EXTRACTING FRAMES

*Division 0320 (Adults 18+)*

- One frame of capped honey constitutes an entry.
- Each entry must be wrapped with clear plastic wrap (e.g., Saran Wrap, etc.) to prevent honey leakage.
- Please provide frame stand to display and protect each frame entered.

### What the Judges look for in Honey Extracting Frames

- Uniformity: appearance of honey & wax, and color
- Absence of: uncapped cells, watery cappings, granulation, & pollen
- Cleanliness: exterior frame sections & cappings

- 07 9-1/8" extracting frame
- 08 7-1/4" extracting frame
- 09 6-1/4" extracting frame
- 10 5-3/8" extracting frame
- 11 Other extracting frame, identify
- 12 Heaviest frame, (judging based on weight only)

## CHUNK COMB HONEY

*Division 0340 (Adults 18+)*

An overall Chunk Comb Honey will be chosen as a special premium exhibit.

### CLASS

- 13 Square cut, Rounds or Basswood, 2 entries in appropriate containers
- 14 Chunk comb honey and added extracted honey, 2 same sized wide mouth 8 or 16 oz jars constitutes an entry. Not required to be glass. (No labels or markings on jars, and not queen line like jars.)

- 15 Other comb honey, identify

## EDUCATIONAL DISPLAY

### Division 0360 (Adults 18+)

- Entries must be educational and address any topic related to Honeybees or Beekeeping.
- Constraints on size/dimensions may be imposed by superintendent if space is limited.

#### What the Judges look for in an Educational Display

- Educational Value
- Public Appeal
- Originality
- Attractiveness and professional appearance
- Time and effort of exhibitor

## HONEY GIFT PACKAGE

### Division 0380 (Adults 18+)

What's sweeter than honey? Giving the gift of honey! Make the ultimate gift basket that anyone would love to receive!

- Entries may be in a basket, box or other suitable container to display contents.
- Container must be covered with clear plastic wrap (e.g. saran wrap, etc.)
- A list of contents must be attached to the outside of the container.
- Contents of Gift Package may include: Items that promote the use of hive products such as honey, wax, wax products, lotion, soap, lip balms, etc and/or beekeeping tools or other items related to beekeeping. "Bee Creative"

#### What the Judges look for in Gift Package

- Originality
- Neatness of workmanship
- Variety of components & contents
- Quality of content

- 22 Other Honey, identify -contact superintendent for entry requirements

#### CLASS

- 23 9-1/8" extracting frame
- 24 7-1/4" extracting frame
- 25 6-1/4" extracting frame
- 26 5-3/8" extracting frame
- 27 Other extracting frame, identify
- 28 Heaviest frame, (judging based on weight only)

#### CHUNK COMB HONEY

An overall Chunk Comb Honey will be chosen as a special premium youth exhibit.

- 29 Square cut, rounds, or basswood
- 30 Chunk comb honey and added extracted honey
- 31 Other comb honey, identify
