General Rules for Knitting

- Entries must be the work of the exhibitor, completed since September 2019.
- Limit **one** entry per class per exhibitor.
- Exhibitors first 25 entries are subject to a \$1 fee per entry. After 25 entries, there are no additional fees. **Entry fees are charged to help offset the increased premiums.** (Example: 2 entries equal \$2, \$25 entries equal \$25 while 45 entries equal \$25)
- 17 & Under enter youth division.
- Where there is no competition, or entry has been incorrectly entered, judges may award first, second or third premiums or no premium, according to the merits of the entry. Judges shall not award premiums to any entry deemed unworthy; i.e., soiled or incomplete.
- Quality or brand of yarn will not be judged.

What the Judges look for in Knitting

- **GENERAL APPEARANCE:** Visual impact, presentation, clean, neat & well blocked
- **SUITABILITY OF DESIGN, COLOR & YARN:** Choice of yarn & trim type & color appropriate to pattern & function
- **WORKMANSHIP:** Stitches made correctly, uniform tension, correct gauge, no dropped stitches, blocked as needed, yarn ends joined & woven inconspicuously, construction details well executed, carried yarns neat and not too tight
- **DIFFICULTY OF PROJECT**

"The Fabric of Our Lives"

Cotton is a multipurpose crop...two thirds of the harvested crop is composed of seed which can be turned into oil, meal and hulls. Cottonseed oil is used in many human food products, while cottonseed meal and hulls are used in animal feed and as fertilizer.

The remainder of the crop is the fiber cotton, which is packaged into bales at harvest. One bale weighs approximately 480 lbs.

- 249 bed sheets
- 409 men's sport shirts
- 690 terry bath towels
- 1,217 men's t-shirts
- 1,256 pillowcases
- 2,104 boxer shorts
- 2,419 men's briefs
- 3,085 diapers
- 4,321 mid calf socks
- 6,436 women's knit briefs
- 21,960 women's handkerchiefs
- 313,600 \$100 bills
