

**JUNIOR Fair Exhibit Guide NWSF 2025**  
**Department Younger Youth #17**

**By participating in the Northern Wisconsin State Fair, you agree to:**

1. Use only this year's Guide
2. Register online at <http://nwsfa.fairwire.com>
3. Pay fees at the time of online registration. A registration worksheet with fee details is available online.
4. Register All exhibits prior to the deadline.
  - Work must have been created by the exhibitor since August 1 of the previous year (during the past 11 months).
5. Respect all fair leadership including but not limited to: Department Leaders, volunteers, judges, employees, board members, etc.
6. Department Leaders have the right to remove deteriorating exhibits during the fair.
7. Read all the general information found at the beginning of the guide.
8. Follow the IAFE Code of Ethics and all ethics guidelines as set forth by the NWSFA Board.
9. Acknowledge the ATCP 160.07(1) rule regarding classes with only a few exhibits being moved into an 'Any Other' or Miscellaneous class at the time of judging.
10. Understand that large classes may be broken into heats.
11. Respect the decisions of the certified specialty judge. Junior Divisions will use the Danish system, with some modifications noted in specific department pages.
  - Judges MAY choose to award Best of Show or Judge's Choice ribbons to exceptional exhibits. State Fair rules will be followed.
12. Follow the schedule on page 1 of this Exhibit Guide or on our registration webpage.
13. Each worthy exhibit will receive a uniform premium of \$1.50 and a ribbon of the judge's choice.
14. Authorize the use of your image in pictures, audio, and video productions for the advertising and marketing needs of the NWSF.

**Items specific to this department exhibitors agree to:**

- This department is intended to encourage younger youth to showcase their own work in a variety of areas.
- Open to youth in an approved organization who have completed grades Kindergarten, 1 or 2.
- This would include 4H Cloverbuds.
- Youth entering this department are NOT allowed to exhibit animals at the fair.
- Enter one exhibit per class, up to a total of EIGHT in this department.

**Department Younger Youth #17**

**Division A - Veterinary Sciences** (Similar to B10) **Class # - Description**

1. Poster about an animal, not larger than 18x24. Tell about the type of animal (bird, mammal...) size, color, habitat, sounds, life cycle, etc.
2. Drawing of an animal, with photo of that animal included. Not larger than 18x24.
3. Model of an animal, with an explanation about how it was made, and about the animal.
4. Display of insects. Five (5) mounted insects or the life cycle of one insect.
5. Eggs. One dozen, uniform size and color, in egg carton, clean

**Division B - Plants & Soil Sciences** (Similar to B14)

1. Vegetables you have grown. Plate of four, in a baggie.
2. Fruits you have grown or picked (currently in season). On a plate, in a baggie.
3. Drawing of a garden, containing fruits and/or vegetables.

**Division C - Flowers & Houseplants** (Similar to B15)

1. Houseplant you have grown. Tell about the type of plant and how to care for it.
2. Container garden you have grown. Examples: terrarium, dish or fairy garden.
3. Vase of cut flowers. With explanation about the type of flower and where they grew. No protected flowers.
4. Poster showing parts of a plant.
5. Workshop creation. Made at a sanctioned workshop with your organization.

**Division D - Natural Sciences** (Similar to B16)

1. Nature Craft. Made from items available outside in nature.
2. Nature Display. Made from interesting objects from nature.

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3. Pressed flowers or leaves. Collection of 5 items with identification labels.
4. Poster related to outdoor safety.
5. Poster related to seasons of the year.

### **Division E - Cultural Arts** (Similar to B18)

1. Drawing pencil, colored pencil
2. Drawing crayon, marker
3. Drawing mixed media
4. Painting
5. Painted rocks
6. Stamped art
7. Card or stationery paper
8. Jewelry project
9. Leather Craft, from a kit.
10. Ceramic, handmade item
11. Other simple craft article made from a kit.

### **Division F - Photography** (Similar to B20)

- Each exhibit should include a group of four photographs. Mounted on white tag size 11x14 (legal size).

1. Landscape
2. Wildlife
3. Pets
4. People
5. Selfies
6. Places
7. Farm Machinery

### **Division G - Computers / STEM** (Science, Technology, Engineering, Math) (Similar to B21)

1. Craft created by using a computer or computer software.
2. Coding demonstration of a robotic toy. Item should be taken home for safe keeping. A photo may be left for display.
3. Model put together by the exhibitor. Emphasis on the engineering process or architecture
  - (Lego, Knex, etc.)

### **Division H - Woodworking** (Similar to B22)

1. Simple woodworking project you have made.
2. Drawing of woodworking tools
3. Drawing of a wooden structure or building

### **Division I - Electricity** (Similar to B23)

1. Poster about electricity or magnets
2. Poster about safety around electricity, not larger than 18x24

### **Division J - Mechanical** (Similar to B24)

1. Model airplane or rockets assembled by the exhibitor
2. Poster of an aerospace item.
3. Any other mechanical project was made by the exhibitor.

### **Division K - Foods & Nutrition** (Similar to B25)

1. Healthy snack made by youth. Bring the recipe on an index card.
2. Dessert made from a mix (small plate of three). Bring the recipe cut from the box.
3. A plate of brownies from scratch (small plate of three). Bring the recipe on an index card.
4. A plate of muffins from scratch (small plate of three). Bring the recipe on an index card.
5. A plate of your favorite cookies (small plate of three). Bring the recipe on an index card.
6. A nutrition poster, not larger than 18x24.
7. Any other baked item not listed

### **Division L - Clothing** (Similar to B26)

1. A simple sewing article you have made.
2. A T-shirt or sweatshirt decorated or painted by the exhibitor.
3. A pillow made or decorated by the exhibitor.

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### **Division M - Knitting & Crocheting** (Similar to B27)

1. A simple knitting project.
2. A simple crocheting project.
3. A simple needlework project.

### **Division N - Home Furnishings** (Similar to B28)

1. Poster about home safety.
2. Drawing of the layout of a building, home, or business.
3. A simple tie-blanket
4. Table decoration

### **Division O - Family Living** (Similar to B29)

1. Craft showing the exhibitors family unit.
2. Toy made by the exhibitor

### **Division P - Health & Citizenship** (Similar to B34)

1. Poster about first aid.
2. First aid kit assembled by the exhibitor
3. Poster about being a good citizen. A child can be a citizen of their school, town, county, etc.
4. Poster about being part of a youth organization.

### **Division Q – Any other Younger Youth Project**

1. Any other project not listed above.
