By participating in the Northern Wisconsin State Fair, you agree to:

1. Use only this year's Guide
2. Register online at <http://nwsfa.fairwire.com>
3. Pay fees at the time of online registration. A registration worksheet with fee details is available online.
4. Register All exhibits prior to the deadline.
 - Work must have been created by the exhibitor since August 1 of the previous year (during the past 11 months).
5. Respect all fair leadership including but not limited to: Department Leaders, volunteers, judges, employees, board members, etc.
6. Department Leaders have the right to remove deteriorating exhibits during the fair.
7. Read all the general information found at the beginning of the guide.
8. Follow the IAFE Code of Ethics and all ethics guidelines as set forth by the NWSFA Board.
9. Acknowledge the ATCP 160.07(1) rule regarding classes with only a few exhibits being moved into an 'Any Other' or Miscellaneous class at the time of judging.
10. Understand that large classes may be broken into heats.
11. Respect the decisions of the certified specialty judge. Junior Divisions will use the Danish system, with some modifications noted in specific department pages.
 - Judges MAY choose to award Best of Show or Judge's Choice ribbons to exceptional exhibits. State Fair rules will be followed.
12. Follow the schedule on page 1 of this Exhibit Guide or on our registration webpage.
13. Each worthy exhibit will receive a uniform premium of \$1.50 and a ribbon of the judge's choice.
14. Authorize the use of your image in pictures, audio, and video productions for the advertising and marketing needs of the NWSF.

Items specific to this department exhibitors agree to:

- Projects may only be entered once. May not be entered a second year.
- Posters may not be larger than 18x24
- ALL exhibits MUST be on a metal hanger for display. You may cover it with plastic if desired.
- Be prepared to discuss the following information: fiber content, intended care, intended use, type of interfacing used if interfacing is necessary, preparation of fabric and notions.

Clothing - Class # - Description

1. Shorts or slacks, elastic waistband, or drawstring
2. Shorts or slacks with waistband
3. Shorts or pants and top (two items)
4. Skirt with elastic waistband.
5. Skirt with waistband.
6. Skirt with blouse (two items)
7. Skirt with top (two items)
8. Simple top (blouse, T-shirt, vest, halter) made of knit material.
9. Simple top (blouse, T-shirt, vest, halter) made of woven material.
10. Jumper
11. Jumper and top (two items)
12. Dress - one or two-piece general wear.
13. Dress – special occasion wear.
14. 2-piece sleepwear or pajama, fleece
15. 2-piece sleepwear or pajama, other fabric
16. Bathrobe

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17. Beach or swimwear or coverup
18. Jacket, windbreaker.
19. Jacket, coat, or cape (tailored, not wool)
20. Jacket coat or cape (not tailored, not wool)
21. Jacket, coat, or cape (wool or part wool)
22. Blazer
23. Unlined or summer suit
24. Suit-wool or part wool
25. Tailored garment
26. Active sportswear
27. Costume
28. Specialty outfit (e.g., tennis outfit, ski outfit, snowmobile suit, exercise outfit, etc.)
29. Equestrian attire for rider or horse not already entered in B-06
30. Advanced garment for self (must have zipper or buttons, set-in sleeves, collar)
31. Item made for travel (e.g.: tote bag, laundry bag, gym bag, lunch bag, book bag, zippered case)
32. Article made for home (e.g.: stuffed animal, pillow, quilt sampler, toy) not pre-printed.
33. Articles made for home (potholder, oven mitt, pillow, stuffed animal, doll clothes)-can be pre-printed.
34. Quilted or decorative stitchery garment (must be quilted or stitched by exhibitor)
35. Any other sewn article not mentioned.
36. Display of two simple items made to care for sewing supplies (e.g.: needle case, mending kit, pin cushion)
37. Display of two simple accessories made for self (e.g., scarf, sweatband, sash, belt, tie, scrunchie)
38. Display of three sewing skills, made by the exhibitor.
39. Display of laundry products and their description; clothing cost comparison, buymanship, etc.
40. Display of fabric identification and weaves, seam finishes, hand stitches, sewing tools, fabric stain removal, sewing terms, etc. Minimum of six examples.
41. Any other clothing related item
