- C. Judging will be closed to the public due to space limitations.
- D. Items must be at least fifty (50) years old. (Made or produced earlier than **1976**)
- E. Items **MUST** be clean.
- F. Item should be complete-not broken or missing pieces.
- G. Exhibit tags should be attached prior to delivery.
- H. A brief explanation of interesting facts pertaining to the exhibit on a 3x5 card may be included.
- I. Articles of a collection, display or group cannot be entered separately for individual premiums.
- J. Collections shall be limited to 3 pieces.
- K. No large items will be accepted and no furniture due to space limitations.
- L. Every precaution will be taken to ensure the safety of exhibits; however, the NWSF will not be responsible for loss or damage to exhibits.
