September Status: Oregon Wheat

With harvest coming to a close in Oregon and fall planting beginning for the 2024 winter wheat crop, wheat producers are busy out in the field. Recent rain around the state delayed some of the final harvesting, but supported seeding operations for next year's crop.

Crop Quality

The final weekly soft white wheat crop quality report are now available from the Wheat Marketing Center. For soft white, the final week eight Pacific NW sampling reflects:

- Higher protein than average at 11.0% (on a 12% moisture basis).
- Lower test weight than average: 60.2 lb/bu (79.2 kg/hl).
- Falling number: 334 seconds.
- Average moisture content: 9.1%.
