May Status: Oregon Wheat

Winter wheat benefitted from improved precipitation and good soil moisture. The drought monitor shows no areas of the state in drought at this time. While the wheat crop was smaller coming out of winter with cool temperatures, it is growing quickly. Warmer temperatures in April assisted with crop development. Thus far, there has been limited disease pressure.
