## What are the Oakland County Fair Auctions? What is sold?

**Small Animal Auction** – Rabbits (individuals and pens of three); chickens (broilers and roasters in pens of three); ducks (pens of three); geese (pens of three); and turkeys (sold individually). All are sold by the pound.

**Large Animal Auction** – Beef, calves, goats, lambs, and swine. All are purchased individually by the pound.

**Exhibit Hall Auction** – Handmade items created by our outstanding youth. Includes projects in the areas of baking, canning, sewing, woodworking, and much more. Items are sold by the lot.

## Why should I purchase from the Oakland County Fair Auction?

To support and encourage young people participating in one of the most active youth programs in the state. Our programs produce the outstanding citizens of tomorrow.

As a buyer, you will get the highest quality market animals and crafts.

As a buyer, you will also have a buyers thank you sign posted in the livestock arena, the poultry barn, the rabbit barn, or the Ellis Barn.

After the sale, your name as a buyer may be submitted to local newspapers and will appear in next year's Fair Program Book and Auction Sale Catalog.

You will receive a photograph of the exhibitor and their auction lot. To be in this photo please go to the photo area once you have secured the final bid.

Buyers also receive a parking pass for the following year's auction day and attendance at the Buyers' Dinner.

## How do I buy at the auction?

Plan to arrive early. Sale catalogs for each auction will be available on auction day and will include information on each lot, as well as sale order. Animal sale weights will also be included.

The catalog allows you to compare animals in the barn and select several alternative animals to meet your needs.

Exhibitors will be available to preview their animals with you prior to the sale. When an animal you would like to purchase is in the ring and at the price you desire, signal the auction staff by raising your hand. If you receive the final bid, make sure the auctioneer can see your buyer's number so that it can be announced and recorded.

## Is there a registration procedure?

Registration begins half an hour before sale time at the clerk's table. You will need to provide your driver's license and phone number.

You will then be given a buyer's number.

**New in 2023** you will also need to provide a credit card during check in. You can use a different form of payment when you check out.



## How is payment handled?

You may pay by cash, check, or major credit card anytime during or immediately following the sale.

## I'd like to buy an animal to help out the fair youth, but can't really use the meat. What can I do?

You can donate the animal back to the Oakland County Fair.

If you choose to do this, indicate your decision to the auctioneer or the ring personnel at the time your final bid is taken. The animal will go into the auction ring to be auctioned a second time at the end of the sale.

The money that you originally bid will go to the youth owner.

The second bid will go as a donation to the Fair, a 501c(3) organization, to improve the fair for future generations.

## I'd like to buy, but I can't handle a whole beef or hog. What should I do?

You can join with a relative, neighbor, or friend and split the cost and meat. You can each have cutting and wrapping done to your individual needs.

## What do I do once I have purchased at the auction?

**Small Animal Auction** - All chickens and turkeys are processed prior to the auction. Processed birds can be picked up the night of the sale after payment. For all other species a refrigerated truck will return the packaged meat to the fairgrounds for buyers to pick up. The dates and times of this pickup will be posted in the sale catalog. If you wish to take home your duck, goose, or rabbit, you can take them after payment.

**Large Animal Auction** - You will need to telephone the processor you select Monday after the auction to provide your cutting instructions. The processor will tell you when your frozen meat will be available to pick up.

**Exhibit Hall Auction** - Items can leave the fairgrounds after payment.
