The Shooting Sports Project is unique in that it is oriented to the individual and is an activity that can be practiced throughout life. It is also a project where the entire 4-H family can participate.

Because shooting is a skill that requires concentration, individual effort, and considerable financial resources, it is important that the 4-H member keep good records as to what is learned, how it was learned, leadership roles, expenses, property inventory, and other essential facts.

Following are types of records which can be utilized by the member. Good records can be helpful to the leader/coach in working with the member and will make the shooting more meaningful to the member.

EXAMPLES

DATE: *November 16, skeet, 2 rounds, 23 & 25. 60 degree weather and windy. I felt good. Low house bird climbing, High house bird erratic due to wind gusts. Moved my right foot back 2" more than normal to get on Low house bird faster.*

DATE: *October 6, smallbore practice. Very uncomfortable in prone position. Sling irritated bruise on left arm and could not concentrate. Quit and went home.*

LEADERSHIP RECORD
