

### **BEEF CATTLE**

- 1. Exhibitors entering open classes in this division should familiarize themselves with the General Rules and Regulations and Livestock Entry Rules of the Ozark Empire Fair.
- 2. Exhibitors entering junior classes should familiarize themselves with Junior Show Rules, General Rules and Livestock Entry Rules before completing entry.
- 3. Junior shows are open to all youth who are 8 years of age as of January 1, but not over 21 years of age as of January 1. Entries from in-state and out-of-state exhibitors will be accepted in the junior shows of all OEF breeding beef divisions with the exception of the Supreme Beef Heifer Show. To be eligible for the Supreme Beef Heifer Show, the exhibitor's primary residence must be in one of the following counties: Barry, Barton, Bates, Benton, Camden, Cedar, Christian, Dade, Dallas, Douglas, Greene, Henry, Hickory, Howell, Jasper, Laclede, Lawrence, McDonald, Miller, Morgan, Newton, Ozark, Polk, Pulaski, St. Clair, Stone, Taney, Texas, Vernon, Webster and Wright. Entries outside of the counties listed above will be accepted for the junior show and are eligible to compete for grand and reserve grand champion, but they will not be eligible to compete for the Supreme Heifer Awards. Should entries from outside of the counties listed be selected as grand champion and/or reserve grand champion will be selected from the southwest region that represents the counties listed as eligible to represent such breed in the Supreme Heifer Drive.
- 4. A Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion Bred & Owned Female will be selected during the Supreme Heifer Drive. Grand Champion Bred & Owned Female will receive \$1,000, Reserve Grand Champion Bred & Owned Female will receive \$500. Females can compete in both the Supreme Drive and Bred & Owned Champion Drive and receive awards in both divisions. (Braunvieh & Santa Gertrudis will not be eligible for Supreme Drive).
- 5. There is no cap on the number of breeding beef divisions a junior exhibitor may show in or how many entries they can qualify to compete in the Supreme Drive or Bred & Owned Championship Drive. However, an exhibitor will only be eligible for one premium in the Supreme Drive and one Bred & Owned Championship Drive. Heifers will be picked until five different exhibitors in the Supreme Drive and two different exhibitors in the Bred & Owned Championship have been selected to pay premiums. For example, an exhibitor could win Supreme, Third and Fifth but will only be paid for Supreme and additional six, seven, eight or more heifers may have to be selected until five separate exhibitors receive an award.
- 6. In order for a beef division to be eligible for the Supreme Drive and Bred & Owned Awards, a \$500 contribution will be required of each breed. This payment is due in the OEF Livestock office on or prior to June 15. The \$500 will be distributed as follows: \$250 will be awarded to the breed grand champion and \$250 will be awarded to the breed's bred and owned grand champion. Breed grand champions & bred and owned grand champions must be shown in the Supreme Drive and/or Champion Bred & Owned Drive in order to receive the \$250 award. Otherwise the award will be presented to the reserve breed champion. Should a breed's grand champion be selected as a top five female and/or Grand or Reserve Grand Champion Bred & Owned, \$250 will NOT be awarded on top of the supreme winnings. Any exhibitor who resides in the state of Missouri will be eligible for the bred and owned award in each breed, but will not be eligible for the Supreme Drive unless primary residence is in one of the counties listed in #3 above. A breed may elect to contribute \$250 to the bred & owned grand champion and not the \$250 for the breed grand champion and vice versa. However, breeds who elect not to contribute funds to the breed grand champion and/or bred and owned champion will not be permitted to compete in the Supreme Drive and/or Bred & Owned Champion Drive. In addition, the \$250 bred & owned award will not be presented unless sponsored. Checks should be made payable to the Ozark Empire Fair Foundation.
- 7. All entries are to be made online at <a href="https://www.ozarkempirefair.com">www.ozarkempirefair.com</a>. Entry forms may be printed or picked up at the Ozark Empire Fair Office. (paper copies come at an extra fee)
- 8. Each animal must have correct registration papers, health papers, tattoos and/or identifying marks recognized by respective breed associations. These will be checked against the information given on the entry form.
- 9. All cattle will be bedded with material provided by the Ozark Empire Fair. NO OTHER BEDDING MAY BE USED. Exhibitors are responsible for tie-out bedding.
- 10. SEE SHOW RING CODE OF ETHICS IN LIVESTOCK ENTRY RULES.
- 11. Entries close **June 15** and those mailed must be postmarked no later than midnight of this date. Late entries may be accepted through July 1. Entries postmarked after midnight **June 15** and through midnight July 1 must be accompanied by the late fee of \$40.00 per head <u>in addition</u> to regular fees.
- 12. Stalls and location in the barns will be designated only by the division superintendent. Cow/Calf entries must purchase calf stall if calf is not entered individually.
- 13. Animals shall be brought to the barns by 9 a.m. each day and remain in the barns, except when showing, until tie-out time at 7 p.m. Tie-out space (three feet) per head is provided. No tie-outs permitted in the trailer lot area.
- 14. **GROOMING CHUTES:** Exhibitors may pay a \$20 charge for a grooming chute space with their stall assignments, if room permits. **Please indicate on entry blank if you are paying for a grooming chute space.** Exhibitors who do not choose to pay for a chute space will be allowed to have a grooming chute in the barn or proximity of the barn on show day only. Chutes are to be used only in assigned stalling and make-up areas. Any chutes outside this area are subject to removal and exhibitor will be fined \$25.
- 15. **NOSE RINGS:** All bulls born prior to 2022 must be shown with a nose lead.
- 16. Calves on cow/calf pairs are eligible to show in individual classes if allowed in their respective breeds. Must be entered and additional entry paid by entry deadline.
- 17. Cow/calf pairs will be considered as two head in group classes. Calves must be registered and tattooed.

**Junior Entries:** Use same division numbers as open shows. Use class numbers listed in the left-hand column of each section. **Junior animals are NOT automatically entered in open shows.** Each animal must be entered into the respective junior and open classes. No refund of entry will be made for junior exhibitors who wish to not participate in the open show.

#### JUNIOR BEEF SHOWMANSHIP

Three Classes will be offered with each "Wave" Division of cattle based on age of youth as of January 1, 2022. Classes; Y17: Junior (Ages 8-11); Y16: Intermediate (Ages 12-15); Y15: Senior (Ages 16-21)

#### Division 12- Wave 1 Showmanship- Jr./Int./Sr. (07/28 - 07/3) Division 13- Wave 2 Showmanship- Jr./Int./Sr. (08/03 - 08/06)

- 1. Pre-Entry is required by the entry deadline. An Entry fee of \$10.00 will be required.
- Entry fee's will be "Jackpotted" with 80% of the total fee's paid back to the top three (3) showman in each class age division, with 45% awarded to first, 35% to second, and 20% to third.
- 2. Fitting in Showmanship classes is optional unless stated otherwise in breed rules.

#### Earl K. Nau Scholarship

-An endowment fund in memory of Earl K. Nau has been established at the Ozark Empire Fair to provide an annual scholarship to a junior beef cattle exhibitor at the Fair. The Nau Family provides the funding of the scholarship to honor their late father.

-Applicants must be at least 15 years of age and have exhibited breeding beef cattle at the Ozark Empire Fair for at least two years. Applicants will achieve scores based on winnings in: Junior beef classes, showmanship classes, open beef classes, Herdsmanship awards and other 4-H/FFA exhibit classes

-Applicants will also receive points for participation (and ranking) in district 4-H/ FFA livestock judging competition, as well as, for service at the Fair as a volunteer in either the 4-H or FFA Exhibit Buildings or activities. The period of participation to be evaluated is from the 2020 Ozark Empire Fair through July 15, 2021.

-The scholarship winner will receive \$1,000 for tuition, textbooks or other fees associated with the pursuit of a post-secondary education. Applications must be received (mailed or delivered) in the Fair Office no later than 4 p.m., July 15. Applications are available at www.ozarkempirefair.com.

-The scholarship will be presented at the Angus Show on Saturday, July 30.

#### JUNIOR SHOW SUPREME CHAMPION FEMALE | 1 p.m. Sunday, July 31 - Arena

The **OZARK EMPIRE FAIR FOUNDATION** will award \$2,500 to the Junior Supreme Champion Female and \$1,500 to the Junior Reserve Supreme Champion Female. In addition, third, fourth and fifth place exhibitors will also be selected and awarded \$1,000; \$750 and \$500, respectively. If the junior exhibitor cannot be present to show their animal, another Ozark Empire Fair junior exhibitor in good standing may show in their place. The exhibitor must notify management and submit their replacement showman for approval by the end of the day the animal qualifies for the Supreme Drive. The exhibitor must have shown their animal in the breeding beef division show to qualify for Supreme. Santa Gertrudis and Braunvieh will **not** be eligible for Junior Supreme Champion Female. **Fitting Rule**: See Section L (Show Ring Code of Ethics and Conduct) under Livestock Rules found in Administration and General Rules. **Exhibitor Dress**: Western attire consisting of nice jeans and a collard shirt. Only western boots or dark leather shoes allowed. Cowboy hats are permitted; No ball caps allowed.

#### Supreme Beef Herd Builder Program

2022 Junior Breeding Beef Exhibitors are eligible to win a \$1,000 Herd Builder Voucher who's primary residence is in one of the counties listed above in Beef Cattle Rules #3 as eligible for the Supreme Beef Heifer Show. **Anyone who has been awarded the voucher in previous years is not eligible to win.** Vouchers are valid until May 1, 2023 and will be good toward the purchase of a registered beef animal, registrable genetics (including semen or embryos, etc.) or beef cattle show equipment (excluding feed). The voucher is to be submitted to the Supreme Beef Committee for reimbursement on or before the expiration date. Vouchers must be accompanied by a paid receipt or bill of sale, and registration papers where applicable. All documents are to be solely in the name of the junior exhibitor awarded the voucher. The number of vouchers awarded will depend upon the amount of money raised and the drawing will follow the conclusion of the Jr & Open Supreme Drives. **Junior exhibitors must be present at the time of the drawing to win.**



An animal is eligible to enter or compete in an open Charolais breeding class if registered in country of origin outside the United States and is eligible for purebred registry in the AICA Herdbook.

Animals registered in the AICA Colored Division Registry (OF and OM initialed registration numbers) must meet the parameters of the AICA Color Card.

All animals to be eligible may be approved by a sifting committee designated by the AICA. Stall space will not be provided for any Charolais cattle that have not been accepted by the sifting committee.

All animals are subject to a medical examination in order to determine age, and each animal will be present in the show ring in its natural conformation without alteration or modification. Use of artificial tailheads is not permitted.

Any animal not having a legible tattoo or firebrand number is ineligible and will be barred from showing.

Bulls from classes 36, 37, 40, 41, and 42 must have a valid, satisfactory semen test certificate in possession. This certificate is valid for the entire show season.

All animals shown in individual classes must be weaned, with the exception of the Cow-Calf Class and calves at the side of females calved after September 1, 2020. Calves at side must be purebred and registered with the AICA. Females calved after September 1, 2020, must show in individual female class appropriate to age. Nurse cows are not permitted.

All females 20 months and older exhibited at AICA sanctioned shows must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side.

AICA requires that all animals be shown with a halter and suggest that all bulls be shown with a nose lead.

Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical or other (including banding or other circulatory constriction) appearance change for cosmetic purpose, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. The act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes, or any other method per os (by esophagus) is prohibited. Silicone injection or other injection for cosmetic purpose shall be prohibited. Anabolic steroid use shall likewise be prohibited and any animal testing positive for anabolic steroid or diuretic use shall be presumed to be altered and modified."

Effective October 22, 2004, at any American-International Charolais Association (AICA) sanctioned show (including shows receiving AICA premium funding and/or qualifying as a Roll of Excellence Show), the use of a coloring agent, flock and powder is prohibited. Use of these products will result in the immediate disqualification of a given animal at such show.

North American Limousin Foundation - Standard Rules & Regulations for the Exhibition of Limousin and Lim-Flex® Cattle - Level II

- 1. Animals must be registered with the North American Limousin Foundation (NALF).
- 2. All cattle shown including calves at the side of the dam must be:
- A. 75% Limousin (NALF percentage, not actual) or greater as indicated on orange NALF registration certificates OR B. Purple-papered Lim-Flex cattle as indicated by NALF registration certificates. Percentage, fullblood, purebred and Lim-Flex cattle shall compete in the same classes and championships.
- 3. If a show does not abide by the NALF MOE show rules exhibitors will not be awarded points for that show.
- 4. Animals must be properly tattooed and will be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and match the registration certificates. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or cannot be read upon initial processing, it will be ineligible to show and not be allowed to return with a new or corrected tattoo.
- 5. To maintain a high degree of confidence in Limousin shows NALF reserves the right to disqualify any animal that has been fitted in an unethical manner. Unethical fitting shall include the following:
  - a) Any use of paints, colored show foam, graphite, colored powders or other substances; animals may be subject to a white-towel test;
  - b) The addition of any hair or hair like substances, including false tail heads and false polls (false tail switches are allowed);
  - c) The cutting, tearing or gluing of the hide or underneath the hide or removal of tissue in an attempt to alter the shape of the animal or the injection of any gas, solid or liquid under the hide to alter the normal conformation;
  - d) Any products, solutions or liquids administered internally or externally to alter the conformation of the animal is prohibited. That includes the use of steroids, growth stimulants and the act of artificially filling animals internally, which would include stomach pumping, drench tubes or any other method.
    - **EXCEPTION**: In the case of severely sick or dehydrated animals, the exhibitor may have fluids or electrolytes administered by the licensed official show veterinarian with the approval of the show superintendent or a NALF representative. That exception is not applicable on show day or weigh-in/check-in day.
- 6. Bulls older than one (1) year must show with a nose lead. The Limousin show superintendent and the show management reserve the right to disqualify animals deemed unmanageable.
- 7. Protests against exhibitors, individual animals or fitting violations must be submitted in writing, signed by five (5) active members of the NALF and presented to the show superintendent within 12 hours of the show's completion.
- 8. NALF reserves the right to mouth animals for dental development.
- 9. NALF reserves the right to collect hair samples from any animal.
- 10. Class size shall be to the discretion of the show superintendent and may not contain more than 20 head. The given classes may be split or combined only within their given division.
- 11. Calves exhibited alongside dams in the cow-calf division are not eligible to show as individuals.
- 12. Animals shown must be solid red or black above the flanks, excluding birth marks.

#### OTHER REQUIREMENTS - The following performance-data-submission requirements must be met by Dec. 1 to receive Medal of Excellence points.

- a. Birth weight (bulls and heifers)
- b. Weaning weight (bulls and heifers)
- c. Yearling weight (bulls and heifers)
- d. Yearling scrotal circumference
- e. Pregnancy test (females older than test (600 days at season's end)
- f. Breeding Soundness Exam and semen bulls older than 400 days)

**NOTE:** Failure to have performance data on file at NALF will result in disqualification from the MOE program and no points will be awarded. It is the responsibility of the breeder/owner/exhibitor to submit that information without special requests from NALF.

#### **Credibility Requirement:**

To maintain a high degree of integrity and credibility in all Limousin shows, all owners and exhibitors are expected to adhere to all NALF rules and regulations regarding the exhibition of Limousin cattle and to adhere to rules and regulations of particular shows, fairs and exhibitions.

- 1. Only registered Red Angus cattle in Category 1A (100%) and Category 1B (87% through 99%) will be eligible to show. Category 1A and 1B will show together in the same classes.
- 2. All animals entered must conform to all rules of the Ozark Empire Fair and eligibility requirements of the Red Angus Association of America.
- 3. Cattle entered must be officially registered in one of the following: Red Angus Association Herdbook, in the Herdbook of the Canadian Angus Association or any foreign Angus Association Herdbook recognized by the Red Angus Association of America.
- 4. Entries in classes are accepted with the understanding that each exhibitor agrees to conform to the rules and regulations of the Red Angus Association of America with reference to inspection of entries, such as blood typing, mouthing and such other inspections prescribed by the RAAA or the Ozark Empire Fair.
- 5. All animals must be properly tattooed and are subject to be inspected at the show. Tattoos must be legible and must match the registration certificate. If an animal's tattoo is not legible or does not match the registration certificate and cannot be read during processing, it will not be allowed to participate in the show.
- 6. Each exhibitor is required to ensure that each animal will be exhibited in its natural conformation and structure and without any alterations or modifications, with the exception of acceptable fitting, grooming and treatment of hooves.
- 7. The addition of any hair or hair-like substances shall be considered an unethical practice and will not be allowed.
- 8. All females 20 months of age or older (on announced date of show) must be accompanied by a certificate of pregnancy from a licensed veterinarian or have produced fertile eggs as certified in a written statement by a licensed veterinarian or embryologist or have a calf at side. Failure to show documentation will result in animal being ineligible to show.
- 9. All bulls 9 months of age or older (on announced date of show) must be shown with a nose lead.

### PERCENTAGE RED ANGUS | DIVISION 8

The Missouri Red Angus Association has provided premium monies for this show.

- 1. Females must be registered with RAAA and meet all requirements for Category II (equal to or greater than 87% with one or more disqualifying characteristic) or Category III (at least 50% but less than 87% Red Angus) at the time of the published entry deadline.
- 2. The sire or dam must be a registered Red Angus.
- 3. Must be 85% red hided and polled (no black hided or black animals, refer to the RAAA Breeder's Guide for disqualifying characteristics).
- 4. Cow/calf pairs may show with natural calves only. Calf must not be more than 250 days old at date of show and must be a registered Red Angus with one of the following: Red Angus Association Herdbook, in the Herdbook of the Canadian Angus Association or any foreign Angus Association Herdbook recognized by the Red Angus Association of America.
- 5. Scurred animals are considered polled unless the scurs have been removed. If scurs have been removed, the animal does not qualify.
- 6. Each animal must have a legible tattoo that matches the animal's registration papers.
- 7. Individual classes will be divided after entries are received and confirmed. Heifers and cows will be judged from the youngest class to the oldest class. Classes will be broken at the discretion of the show staff in concurrence with the Superintendent.

**RELEASE:** 2 p.m., Saturday, August 6.

#### Rules and Regulations for Approved Santa Gertrudis Open and Junior Shows

- 1. All exhibits of Santa Gertrudis breeding cattle must be registered meeting the requirements for registration as outlined in the Santa Gertrudis Rules and Regulations for Registration, and shall be governed by the last revised version of the **Rules and Regulations for Approved Santa Gertrudis Open & Junior Shows.**
- 2. Each owner must be a bona fide member of SGBI. This means the active or junior member has paid all current dues and fees with no outstanding balances on their account.
- 3. **All** animals accepted for exhibition in an SGBI sanctioned show are subject to inspection at each show between arrival on grounds and prior to entering the show ring. The inspection will be conducted by a committee comprised of two (2) members of the Shows and Exhibits Committee and one (1) from the Breed Standards Committee.
- 4. Heifers 24 months of age or older must have produced a calf or be safe in calf as verified by a graduate veterinarian. If animal is open due to being in an embryo transfer program, this fact must be verified by a written statement signed by a licensed embryo technician.
- 5. A cow shown with calf at side: Calf must be her natural calf meeting the Standard of Excellence. Calf must be registered if older than thirty (30) days. If calf is less than 30 days of age it is subject to registration.
- 6. All senior bull classes (late junior yearling bull and over) must have either a nose ring or a nose clip for show purposes.
- 7. All animals must be individually identified by tattoo and/or numerical fire or freeze brand.
- 8. To be eligible to compete in SGBI approved junior shows, animal(s) must be recorded in the name of the junior member. This recorded junior must feed, fit, care for, and show the animal entered. *Ownership deadline is April 7 for all animals born May 1 and thereafter and November 1 for all other animals.*
- 9. All animals must be exhibited with the hair brushed down on the entire body, legs, and tail with no foreign objects attached to the animal in a manner as to alter the animal's conformation or change its appearance. \*Exhibitors failing to abide by this rule will not be allowed to show. Specifically, all hair must be brushed down slick; head clipped smooth; underline clipped blending sides; udder and teats clipped with no long hair to emphasize udder; ears clipped as to environmental and local standards; neck and brisket clipped; body clip using common sense as to season; leg hair clipped (no steer or Brahman clips) and do not leave long from hock or knee to hoof; tailhead clipped; pull switch or brush out (no ball, etc.); trim tail (no shear except back side). Fitting handbook should be studied.
- 10. Each animal exhibited must be exhibited with the correct age and shown in the class corresponding with their correct age. SGBI reserves the right to tooth animals without prior notice to the breeders in order to verify age of cattle.
- 11. Entries in each class will be placed 1, 2, 3, etc. Animals are to be presented in descending order according to age.
- 12. Polled classes *will be entered at the same time as class entries are required by each show*. Animals will be lined up according to age for the judge.
- 13. To be eligible to show in Best of Polled, animals must be slick polled with no scurs, no scars, no dehorning and with no evidence or horny tissue.
- 14. There must be at least five (5) exhibitors and twenty-five (25) head of cattle, or minimum of fifty (50) head of cattle, to constitute a recognized Santa Gertrudis Show.
- 15. In all shows in which fifty (50) head or less are entered, all early and late classes may be combined at the discretion of the show officials.
- 16. Classes with over thirty (30) entries should be divided into sections and section winners return for final placing.
- 17. The judge **must** be an SGBI approved judge.
- 18. Dress for exhibitors participating in SGBI sanctioned Open and Junior shows shall be of neat and clean clothing of collared shirts with sleeves, belts, no midriffs showing and appropriate footwear—no tennis shoes. Exhibitors may wear hats or go bareheaded -- no caps.
- 19. Juniors showing in open shows is allowed and encouraged. Entry must be shown by the owner or immediate family member (sister, brother, mother, father, grandparents, legal guardian). No animal may be fitted or shown by any open exhibitor at any time during the junior's ownership period. An exception is transportation feed and care to a show may be allowed. *Refer to junior ownership rules*.
- 20. Each animal shall be presented in the show ring in its natural conformation and structure **without** alteration or modification. Alteration or modification shall be defined to include any surgical, chemical, electrical, pharmaceutical or other appearance change, save only branding, tattooing, foot trimming or dehorning. Additionally, no pumping or filling of an animal with a liquid, diuretic or any other substance is allowed. **ALL** animals and exhibitors found to be in violation of this rule will be banned for life from showing at SGBI approved shows.

- 21. If entries are not properly fitted and good herdsmanship followed, the owner may be asked to not display their cattle until adhering to the proper procedures as outlined in our herdsmanship paper.
- 22. Every exhibitor, in consideration of his/her entry being accepted, agrees to submit any animal so entered by him/her to inspection and agrees to have such animal submitted to any tests as may be designated and requested by the Shows and Exhibits Committee, or the authorized representatives of the relevant show or fair, and agrees that the conclusions reached by the committee/representative as to whether such animal is unethically fitted or over age, shall be final, without recourse, against SGBI and designated personnel. Any false representation, interference or unprofessional conduct on the part of any exhibitor will be dealt with by the Shows and Exhibits Committee according to the equities of the case.
- 23. Any person who furnished the birthday of an animal to SGBI either on the IPRA or some other document (whereby that birthday information is transferred to the registration certificate) and that animal is exhibited in an SGBI approved show with an incorrect age and the age determined by the SGBI designated veterinarian exceeds the age listed on the registration certificate by more than thirty (30) days, the person furnishing the birthday above and such person furnishing said information to SGBI for inclusion on the registration certificate shall be barred from showing in an SGBI approved show for a period of six (6) months for the first offense, one (1) year for the second offense and for life for the third offense. However, the animal, if transferred to another owner, may be placed in the correct class and be show again.
- 24. For and in consideration of the opportunity to participate in any SGBI approved show, each exhibitor hereby releases SGBI, its officers, directors and representatives from negligence, any and all claims, suits and judgments, either past, present or future, arising from or connected with the administration or use of such test or examination and the resulting decision there from.
- 25. Any exhibitor desiring to dispute or challenge the results of any test, exam, or show rule enforcement, as applied to his/her animals, shall do so in accordance with procedures established by the rules of the association.
- 26. APPEALS: Procedures available in show office upon request.
- 27. PROCEDURES TO FILE PROTEST: Procedures available in show office upon request.
- 28. Failure to adhere to each show's specific rules shall also be subject to these penalties. Proper protest procedures must be adhered to according to that particular show's rules. SGBI will follow each show's rules, and any action taken by a show will be upheld by SGBI in relation to its bearing on our point show system.
- 29. **DISQUALIFICATIONS:** An exhibitor who has been disqualified from competition in any livestock show or has had a premium withheld or withdrawn on the grounds of rule violation(s) will not be allowed to compete in other shows. This shall include, but is not limited to, disqualification for fraud, misrepresentation, unethical fitting or deception. Judging procedures will not be interrupted for protest investigation; and depending on the basis of the protest, a decision may be withheld until a thorough investigation is completed. No complaint or appeal that a judge over-looked an animal will be considered. If any exhibitor, in any way, whether in person or by their representative, interferes with the judge (s), or shows any disrespect to them or to show officials, the existing show officials may excuse him/her from the ring and exclude them from further competition; exhibitor premiums that may have been awarded may also be withheld. If an animal is disqualified after having won awards or premiums, the animals placing below him/her may be moved up (at the option of the Shows and Exhibits Committee) to fill the vacated position.
- 30. **RULES FOR HIGH POINT AWARDS:** For each point show, first place class winner will receive 2 points; second place class winner receives 1 point; Division Champion receives 3 points; Reserve Division Champion receives 2 points; Grand Champion receives 5 points and Reserve Grand Champion receives 4 points; Best of Polled receives 1 point but does not count toward overall points. Get of Sire and Produce of Dam points go toward Exhibitor/Breeder of the Year Awards. Points will stay with animal if sold. The Sire and Dam of the Year should have points from at least two (2) different offspring. All points earned at the National Open Show are to be doubled.
- 31. **CONDUCT IN THE SHOW RING:** If any exhibitor/owner/showman interferes in any way with the judge or shows disrespect to him, or to the show in the ring, the exhibitor/owner/showman may be dismissed by the judge or show management from the ring. The management may withhold from each exhibitor/owner/showman any premium monies that may have been awarded or take other steps deemed desirable.
- 32. **DNA TEST ON QUESTIONABLE ANIMALS:** Santa Gertrudis Breeders International and its representatives reserve the right to require any test deemed necessary to verify the accuracy of an entry, classification and/or the pedigree of exhibited Santa Gertrudis animals, including calves exhibited at the side of a Santa Gertrudis female.

- All cattle must be purebred to be eligible to show. All animals must be registered as the property of the exhibitor in the records of the American Shorthorn Association by the time of the show.
- Individual animals shown in all of the group classes listed below must have been entered and shown in one of the following classes for single animals. Multiple owned animals must be exhibited in the name of all owners.
- Family bred and raised animals entered by juniors in Junior Classes and subsequently entered in Open classes may be treated as family entries in group classes.
- All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are subject to a tattoo inspection. All Shorthorns and Polled Shorthorns are also subject to an age inspection if deemed necessary. The decision of the examining veterinarian is final. Use of artificial fins on show animals is not permitted.
- Senior/Junior Yearling Pregnancy Rule for Exhibitors at All Open Shows: Any senior/junior yearling female 28 months of age or older on or before the date of the show must have natural calf at side and must be shown with such. All females 20 months of age on or before the date of the show must have a 60-day pregnancy verification signed by an accredited, non-owner veterinarian at the time the female is processed for the show. If verification cannot be produced, the female may be allowed to participate if the exhibitor can produce a qualified veterinarian to examine the female at the show site and verify a 60-day pregnancy. Any infractions against this rule will lead to disqualification.
