(Max. fee for any **youth** exhibitor=\$25 **if** you mail or walk-in a **PAPER** Registration Form.)

Total number of entries for mail or walk-in entries shall be limited to a total of 75.

(If you register online, EVERY entry will be charged \$1.00 with no upper limit.)

Contests held during the Fair: see Special Events Department

Check-in procedure will be sent with exhibitor tags in July. Exhibitor tags must be securely attached to exhibits before arriving at the Fairgrounds.

CHECK-OUT:

Exhibits in this department will be checked out after the Fair on **Sunday, August 6, 2023**, between 11 a.m. and 5 p.m. **No exhibit will be released prior to this time.**

A claim check (bottom of exhibitor tag) is required to check out each exhibit.

Any exhibit not claimed by August 11 will be considered abandoned and will become the property of the Ozark Empire Fair to be disposed of as necessary.

REGULATIONS:

1. All entries are governed by the Life & Arts Exhibits Rules and Regulations and the rules for this department.
2. **Exhibitor is limited to one (1) exhibit in a class.**
3. Division 101 is limited to exhibits made jointly by a family or other youth group. All other divisions are for exhibits made by individuals.
4. Classes without specified age groups will be open to all youth exhibitors ages 18 and under.
5. Open classes with a significant number of entries from both 10 and Under and 11-18 exhibitors may be sub-divided at the superintendent's AND director's discretion.

6. Articles that exhibited at any previous Ozark Empire Fair are not eligible for entry.
 7. Exhibits must have been completed within the last two (2) years.
 8. **Size of exhibits:** Unless otherwise specified in class descriptions, size of exhibits will be limited as follows.
 - a. For exhibits that hang, maximum size will be 24"x24" (or exhibit that can be folded to 24"x24").
 - b. Exhibits that do not hang (including collections and ceramics), maximum size is 12" front to back, 24" side to side.
 - c. Exceptions such as furniture depend on individual articles (contact Exhibits Office). Special arrangements for heavy items must be made in advance with Exhibits Office.
 9. **Display requirements:**
 - a. When more than one item is necessary to complete an exhibit, each item must be labeled with division, class, and exhibitor's number as shown on official exhibitor tag received from Exhibits Office.
 - b. Models must be firmly attached to a base and WITHOUT other decoration. Dioramas (scale models with decorations such as trees) must be firmly attached to a base. Locking Block constructions must be firmly attached to a base. *Maximum size of base for models, dioramas and locking blocks is 12" front to back, 24" side to side.*
 - c. Any framed or hanging exhibit MUST be equipped with a suitable hanging device.
 - d. Any plants used in craft exhibits must be artificial.
 10. Exhibit building will not be open to the public during judging for exhibits in this department.
 11. Exhibitor and the public are prohibited from handling exhibits in any manner or from helping remove exhibits on check-out day.
 12. Prize money will be paid to the number of places indicated for each class, if quality merits. Judges may occasionally award additional placings, but no prize money will be paid for these additional ribbons.
 13. Champion ribbons will only be awarded to divisions of **three** or more classes in which the average entry per class is **three** exhibitors with at least **one** entry per class. Open divisions will only award one champion ribbon. Split age divisions will award a champion ribbon for 10 and Under and a champion ribbon for 11-18.
 14. In order to have this exhibit of as high quality as possible, the right is reserved to reject all unsuitable exhibits, to determine that all rules and regulations have been followed, and that no identification of the exhibitor in any form is displayed during judging.

Prize money: \$5 - \$4 - \$3

Additional Information:

- a. Any craft or needlework project planned and constructed as a joint project of adult(s) and child or children.
- b. Names of all participants **MUST** be on registration form. Ages of each youth participant **MUST** be on registration form and exhibitor tag.
- c. Age of oldest participant in Youth Group will determine choice of class 2 or 3.

Class

- 1 Family Project: joint project of an adult family member (parent, adult sister or brother, grandparent, aunt, uncle) and youth family member (grandchildren, nieces, nephews, etc.)
- 2 Youth Group 10 and Under: joint project by member of an organized youth group (church, neighborhood, etc.) with an adult leader. (NOT Girl Scouts or Boy Scouts)

There will be **2 Champion Ribbons** Awarded in this division.

(One for youth ages 10 and under. One for youth ages 11-18)

Prize money: \$5 - \$4 - \$3

Additional information:

- Maximum size of paintings and drawings is 16"x20". Larger work may be shown only as space allows and only with permission of Exhibits Office.
- Framed work **MUST** have hook eyes and wire attached for hanging. **ANY FRAMED WORK SUBMITTED WITHOUT HOOK EYES AND WIRE WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.**
- Unframed work should be mounted on mat board or medium weight poster board. Mat may be stapled or tacked for display.
- TAGS:** Placed on the lower left corner of any artwork that hangs. Placed on the bottom of the artwork which is freestanding so that the exhibitor name can be seen when displayed.

DIVISION 104 - CERAMICS, POTTERY

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

Additional Information:

- a. Ceramics are from greenware. Pottery is made by hand (wheelthrown, coil, etc.) - no pre-molded pieces.
- b. **Felt or any other covering on the base of a piece will automatically disqualify the exhibit from judging.** Judge MUST be able to see base.
- c. Size of exhibit: see regulation 6 at the beginning of the department.
- d. DEFINITIONS: Stains - Non-fired color applied to ceramic bisque. Glazes - Color applied to ceramic bisque and fired. Underglazes - Translucent or opaque color applied to ceramic greenware or bisque and fired. Overglazes - Fired lusters or metals applied over a fired glaze and refired.

Class

- 1 Ceramics, **age 10 and under**, any item (stains, glazes, underglazes, overglazes, etc.)
- 2 Ceramics, **age 11-18**, any item (stains, glazes, underglazes, overglazes, etc.)
- 3 Pottery, **age 10 and under** (wheelthrown, coil, slab, etc.)
- 4 Pottery, **age 11-18** (wheelthrown, coil, slab, etc.)

DIVISION 105 - DECORATED CLOTHING AND ACCESSORIES

There will be **2 Champion Ribbons** Awarded in this division.

(One for youth ages 10 and under. One for youth ages 11-18)

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

Additional information:

- a. Clothing and accessories for holidays, see Holiday divisions.
- b. Jewelry made from nature items such as seashells, see Nature division.

Class

- 1 Clothing, **age 10 and under**, hand-painted or decorated with “jewels”, beads, lace, other decorations including iron-on transfers, etc.
- 2 Fashion accessory, **age 10 and under**, (NOT jewelry)
- 3 Jewelry, **age 10 and under**, made with purchased items such as beads, OR made with handmade items (such as paper beads, handmade clay shapes, etc.), OR made with “found” or collected items (such as antique buttons, etc.)

DIVISION 106 - GARDEN ART

There will be **2 Champion Ribbons** Awarded in this division.
(One for youth ages 10 and under. One for youth ages 11-18)

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

Any plants used in exhibit must be artificial.

Class

- 1 Decorated flower pot, **age 10 and under**. Must be useable for potted plant.
- 2 Stepping stone, handmade, **age 10 and under**.
- 3 Any wind craft, **age 10 and under** – (wind chimes (handmade), windsock, windmill, etc.)
- 4 Decorated flower pot, **age 11-18**. Must be useable for potted plant.
- 5 Stepping stone, handmade, **age 11-18**.
- 6 Any wind craft, **age 11-18** – (wind chimes (handmade), windsock, windmill, etc.)

DIVISION 107 - HOLIDAY CRAFTS

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

Additional information:

- a. Please briefly outline actual work done by exhibitor on back of tag. Examples: "hand carved and painted" or "painted purchased figurine"; "original design" or "pattern"; etc.
- b. Greeting cards: see Greeting Cards division or Computer division.

Class

- 1 Christmas tree ornament, painted or other, **age 10 and under**.
- 2 Christmas tree ornament, painted or other, **age 11-18**.
- 3 Any other Christmas decoration other than tree ornament, to hang on wall, door or window (wreaths, framed pictures, etc.)
- 4 Decoration for any holiday which occurs during the months of January through April
- 5 Decoration for any holiday which occurs during the months of May through August
- 6 Decoration for any holiday which occurs during the months of September through December, excludes Christmas (see class 1 and 2).

DIVISION 108 – FIBER ARTISTRY

There will be **2 Champion Ribbons** Awarded in this division.
(One for youth ages 10 and under. One for youth ages 11-18)

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

Highland Fiber Artists Guild will award \$25 to Sponsor's Choice.

Additional Information:

- a. Items may be machine or hand sewn.
- b. Clothing may be machine or handmade.
- c. Exhibitor must provide a suitable hanger for all garments.
- d. Mark exhibitor tag whether article is an original design or a pattern, painted canvas or kit.

Class

- 1 Sewn item – garment, **age 10 and under**
- 2 Sewn item – garment, **age 11 – 18**
- 3 Sewn item – stuffed animal or toy, **age 10 and under**

- 4 Sewn item – stuffed animal or toy, **age 11 – 18**
- 5 Sewn item – fashion accessory, household use item, etc., **age 10 and under**
- 6 Sewn item – fashion accessory, household use item, etc., **age 11 -18**

DIVISION 109 - MODELS

There will be **2 Champion Ribbons** Awarded in this division.

(One for youth ages 10 and under. One for youth ages 11-18)

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

Additional information:

- a. Exhibit is ONE model only per class. Model must be made by exhibitor.
- b. Models must be firmly attached to a base and WITHOUT other decorations. Dioramas (scale models with decorations such as trees) must be firmly attached to a base.
- c. Maximum size of base will be 12" front to back, 24" side to side.
- d. If model is from a kit, write KIT on exhibitor tag. If model is customized from a kit, list modifications on exhibitor tag.

Class

- 1 Model diorama (with appropriate scenery) - **NOT** locking block models, **age 10 & under**.
- 2 Model any other - **NOT** locking blocks, **age 10 & under**.
- 3 Model diorama (with appropriate scenery)-locking blocks **ONLY** (Legos, etc.) **age 10 & under**.
- 4 Model any other - locking blocks **ONLY** (Legos, etc.) **age 10 & under**.

DIVISION 110 - NATURE ARTS AND CRAFTS

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

Additional information:

- a. Nature items may be collected or purchased, but must be decorated or arranged by exhibitor.
- b. Wood is an item from nature. Painting on driftwood or bark, for example, goes in this division. Painting on board or plywood shapes, however, goes in Painting division.
- c. Nature items decorated for holidays are exhibited in Holiday divisions.

Class

- 1 Egg (real egg), painted or other decoration
- 2 Gourd, painted or other decoration
- 3 Rock, any decoration or craft
- 4 Jewelry made from nature items (seashells, rocks, etc.)
- 5 Painting on any nature item not listed (leaf, bark, etc.)
- 6 Seed or crop art or craft - artwork or craft featuring dry seeds, beans, etc.
- 7 Other nature craft not listed

DIVISION 111 - GREETING CARDS

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

Additional information:

- a. Entry is ONE card, no envelope.
- b. All cards must be ORIGINAL.
- c. Cards must be handmade without computer assist. They may be hand drawn and lettered, stamped, embossed, stickers, pasted cutouts, etc.
- d. Computer generated greeting cards: See Computer Division

Class

- 1 Holiday card, handmade
- 2 Birthday card, handmade
- 3 Any other card, handmade (Thank You, Thinking of You, other holiday, Get Well, etc.)
- 4 Hand drawn card – ONLY using markers, crayons, water paints, color pencil

DIVISION 112 - SCRAPBOOKS

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

Additional Information:

- a. **An exhibit is one page only** - no complete albums.
- b. Page should be displayed in a clear page protector sleeve or clear zipper storage bag. NO frames, please. Sleeve may be stapled to hang page for display.

DIVISION 113 - WOOD ARTISTRY

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

Additional information:

- a. Paintings on wood should be exhibited only in Painting division.
- b. Constructions made of toothpicks, popsicle sticks, etc. should be exhibited only in Other Crafts division.

- 1 Household use item (storage box, tray, etc.)
- 2 Woodburning
- 3 Woodcarving, in the round or relief, any subject
- 4 Woodturning
- 5 Other wood craft not listed (scroll saw, inlay, etc.)

DIVISION 114 - PHOTOGRAPHY

There will be **2 Champion Ribbons** Awarded in this division.

(One for youth ages 10 and under. One for youth ages 11-18)

PAT AYRES MEMORIAL will award \$5 to Sponsor's Choice in ages 10 & under and 11-18.

ESLICK ENTERPRISES will award \$5 to Sponsor's Choice photograph in color and monochrome in both ages 10 & under and 11-18.

Prize money: \$4 - \$3 - \$2

Additional Information:

- a. Photographs, including digital photos, **MUST be 8"x10" prints matted to 11"x14"**.
- b. **An exhibitor is limited to a total of 10 photographs** (color, monochrome, and digital combined) with a limit of one photograph per class. **If more than 10 photographs are listed on Registration, only the first 10 will be accepted. NO refunds given for extras.**
- c. MAT:
 1. Use regular photo mat (single or double matted). Other types of mat board tend to fall from display rack. **DO NOT USE FOAM BOARD.**
 2. Double matted photos (one bottom mat and one top mat) may have a slight overlap of top mat but minimum size of **visible** photograph will be 7½"x9½". Photos will be measured before judging.
 3. Any color mat will be accepted.
 4. No decoration allowed on mat.
 5. Entries which do not meet the above criteria will NOT be accepted.
- d. **Creative Photography:** Classes 25-28 are intended for photos digitally manipulated in some way with computer programs such as Photoshop, Picture This, Microsoft Photo Editor, etc. **Any image created with the use of computer imaging software should be entered in Creative Photography.** (Photos taken with a digital camera and printed without altering it - or with minor alterations such as fixing red eye - enter in classes 1-24.)
- e. Exhibitor tags should be securely attached (with string fastened to back of mat) so tag hangs over UPPER left corner of mat.
- f. **Please note on exhibitor tag the location of scenic and nature photos for the benefit of fairgoers.**

CREATIVE PHOTOGRAPHY: All images in classes 31-35 must begin as a photo capture. Then photos have been altered with:

1. Computer programs such as Photoshop, Picture This, Microsoft Photo Editor, etc.
2. Camera settings
3. Darkroom techniques

Major alterations such as changing background color or removing a tree **MUST** be entered in classes 29-32.

- 31 Color alterations: any subject (change the sky to green, take color out of everything in the picture except the main object/person in the photo, etc.)
- 32 Content alterations: any subject - move a tree, delete or add a person or object, stitch two photos together (attach a small copy of the original to the exhibitor tag OR write a brief note on back of exhibitor tag listing alterations.)

DIVISION 115 - RECYCLING AND CONSERVATION

Champion: Ribbon

Prize money: \$3 - \$2 - \$1

Additional information:

- a. Any useful and/or decorative article made by recycling disposable items.
- b. Classes 2-3: Attach a 3"x5" card to exhibitor tag listing: Exhibitor number, class number, use or title of exhibit, item(s) recycled to make exhibit, method of construction (briefly).
- c. Judging will be based on use of recycling principles, workmanship, creativity, suitability of project to items recycled.

- 1 Pop can art - any item, decorative or functional, made out of used soda pop can(s)
- 2 Item for household use or decor made from recycled materials
- 3 Other item for personal use made from recycled materials (accessories, toys, etc.)

DIVISION 116 - WRITING
