Fairs are now gearing up for another year for baking competitions at their local events.

#### Msgr. John W. Mignot PSACF Scholarship

It is time for fairs to communicate with agricultural organizations and school counselors about the Mignot Scholarship which is for those who are seeking higher education and have a relationship with the local fair. Suggestions to help the applicant submit a better application:

- 1. Keep in mind, fairs are supervised by the Pennsylvania Department of Agriculture. Therefore, the mission is to promote Agriculture.
- 2. Essays should be written with correct grammar, no spelling errors, and a fluency which captivates the reader.
- 3. Categorize activities as related to school, community, and the local fair.
- 4. Letters of reference need to express who the candidate is in relation to the outlined activities and, in particular, in relation to helping the local fair.

<u>Suggestions</u> for fairs to be more proactive in reaching out to potential candidates and in helping to sustain the <u>scholarship</u>:

- 1. Local fairs should establish a committee assigned to encourage those pursuing higher education to apply.
- 2. Letters of reference and support should give the PSACF scholarship committee enough information to become acquainted with the candidate.
- 3. A maximum of six strong applicants from each zone can be submitted to the PSACF scholarship committee. The committee should have a maximum of 24 candidates to evaluate.
- 4. Use technology, if at all possible, when submitting applications to the next level.
- 5. PSACF has committed to six one-thousand dollar scholarships. In order to help maintain the fund, each fair should consider a line item in its budget or sponsor a fundraiser.

#### <u>Deadlines for all levels to follow to adhere to the application process:</u>

- 1. June 30-applications due to the local fair
- 2. July 31- applications due to the Zone chairperson
- 3. August 31-maximum of six applications from each zone due to the chairperson of the PSACF scholarship committee
- 4. September 30-application rankings by each PSACF committee member due to the state chairperson
- 5. October 1-state committee chairperson identifies the top six candidates to the state secretary, local fairs of selected recipients, and each individual recipient

Beginning with the 2018-2019 Capital Improvement Grant Program, PDA will revise its grant agreement forms to require that fairs applying for grants prohibit the sale of confederate flag merchandise at their annual fair to be eligible to receive a grant. For this reason, if your fair intends to apply for a capital improvement grant for a 2018-2019 project, it should plan on prohibiting the sale of confederate flag merchandise at its 2019 annual fair.

## Pennsylvania State Fair Queen Program

**Hershey, PA** – Lebanon Area Fair has gained its first-ever PA Fair Queen! Elizabeth Voight of Fredericksburg, Lebanon County, was crowned the 2018 Pennsylvania Fair Queen on Saturday, January 20, at the annual PSACF/PSSA convention.

Elizabeth is the daughter of Del and Lori Voight. A senior honors student at Northern Lebanon High School, Liz has helped to lead her basketball team to the PIAA state tournament. Liz is a pianist and vocalist, both in school and in her church. Before she was old enough to participate in 4-H, Liz cared for a flock of chickens and sold brown eggs to her neighbors. She raises and exhibits Angus beef cattle at the Lebanon Area Fair and beyond.

She was selected from 58 contestants representing county and community agricultural PA fairs during the three-day competition. Contestants had to prepare a brief speech on why people should come to their county or community fair, an essay about the fair's importance in their local community, a stage introduction during the PSACF Annual Banquet and were interviewed by the panel of three judges.

Contestants are evaluated on their communication skills, knowledge of the fair and agriculture industries, and their poise and personal presentation styles. Five finalists were chosen and gave impromptu answers on their greatest strength, and how that would help them in their reign as Pennsylvania fair queen.

"I am personable – I love to talk to people of all kinds!" responded Voight. "I just love promoting our fairs and the agriculture industry to the public."

York Fair Queen Haley Sweitzer, 18, of Wellsville, York County, was selected as Alternate 2018 Pennsylvania Fair Queen. A senior at Dover Area High School, Haley is president of her FFA chapter, captain of the varsity cross country and track teams and a member of the National Honors Society. She also participates in the county's 4-H beef, shooting sports, and senior exchange clubs. A third generation on the family's Angus beef farm, Haley plans to attend Penn State pursuing a degree in animal science.

Other top five finalists were Miss Perry County Fair Brooke Rumberger of Millerstown, Perry County; Manheim Community Farm Show Queen Emily Witmer of Manheim, Lancaster County; and Washington County Fair Queen Ashlin Hawkinberry of Hickory, Washington County. Unionville Community Fair Queen Varshika Mandalapu of West Chester, Chester County, was named Miss Congeniality by her fellow contestants.

Elizabeth, the 32nd PA Fair Queen, will receive a \$2,500 scholarship from PSACF at the end of her reign in January 2019. She was crowned by outgoing Pennsylvania Fair Queen Madeline McEachin of West Sunbury, Butler County.

Judges were Mary Amoss with the Miss Maryland Agriculture program, Fallston, Maryland; Jen Puente, Director of Marketing & Partnerships for the Wisconsin State Fair, Milwaukee, Wisconsin; and Tiffany Painter Newland, director of the Shenandoah County (Virginia) Fair scholarship pageant, Edinburg, Virginia.

Special Queen activities during convention included a seminar on "Young Women's Leadership" presented by former PA Fair Queen Denise Sustrik Leigh (1990) and sponsored by **Washington County Ag Fair**. Contestant wore their commemorative t-shirts sponsored by **SwikaS Amusements** at their Pizza Party sponsored by the **Pennsylvania State Showmen's Association**. Each contestant received a commemorative photo with 2017 PA Fair Queen Madeline McEachin sponsored by **Tons of Fun Shows**. Contestants mingled with judges, state directors and other special guests on Friday night during the Judges' Reception sponsored by **Huntingdon County Fair**. **Beverly Stanton** from Bedford County Fair sponsored Kate Friedline, a state licensed cosmetologist and salon owner who presented a "*Best Face Forward*" seminar that gave technique tips for interview and pageant makeup.

Special fundraising efforts included a Raffle Table with themed baskets, wooden items, the popular nightly 50/50 money drawings and a live auction at the Coronation Banquet. Popular auction items included two "Dine Out" boards with chain restaurant gift cards donated by the contestants, an guitar autographed by country music artist Florida-Georgia Line and sponsored by **Variety Attractions**, and a homemade quilt by 2017 PA Fair Queen's great-grandmother. Again its that time of the year to get ready for fair season. Hard to believe that the convention was just two months ago. Time sure does move fast and before we know it our fairs will be on top of us.


