CLEAN INDOOR AIR ACT (CIAA) Act 27

Pennsylvania's CIAA became effective on September 11, 2008 and named the Department of Health as the lead agency for implementation of the legislation.

Albert Einstein is quoted, "The world we have created is a product of our thinking; it cannot be changed without changing our thinking." Webster has defined synonym as a word having a meaning similar to that of another word in the same language. A word or expression accepted as a figurative or symbolic substitute for another word or expression. After much reflection, it is difficult for me to agree that the King's English ever had in mind that indoor could be interpreted as outdoor.

The Department of Health needs to be lauded for having a mission and at all costs, attempting to reach its goals. The PSACF has a mission as well. It appears to me, if the DOH would approach the fair industry to support them in their mission, it could be better accomplished by having their personnel use of our forums which are provided for in our mission statements.

1. To promote the growth and improvement of Agriculture Fairs, Associations and Societies within the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

2. To educate and to provide for the exchange of information among members.

3. To educate and to provide for the exchange of information between the membership, general public, and all agencies for the betterment of the Fairs and/or Fair Industry.

As president of the 114 active fairs, it is my position to not sign any policy with the Department of Health. It is my understanding the creators of Act 27 never had in mind that the interpretation would include fenced in areas under the open sky. It is my contention that in the best semantics, a relationship could not be found for inside meaning outside under the original law.

Having said that, I would encourage our 114 fairs to move toward eliminating smoking in their grandstands, and urge all fair industry personnel who are serving the public to withdraw from their habit during the time they are on duty. In addition, it is appropriate if you wish to comply to "designated smoking" areas those signs can be obtained from the Department of Health.

If the Department of Health insists on carrying through with the threat to penalize fairs which are fenced in by issuing monetary citations, PSACF needs to join those fairs in the courts of justice to determine what is meant by the language spelled out in Act 27.

Remember Ralph Waldo Emerson said, "The best lightning rod for your protection is your own spine."


ADA is establishing new regulations beginning in March of 2011. The following are federal regulations, and the individual states can expand on them. The keyword is individually trained. In the near future new regulations will require a ratio of handicap seating in respect to all other seating. This new law will also affect parking lots, where you establish a percentage of handicap parking in a ratio to the total number.

We encourage all to come to Hershey. It is the "sweetest place on earth", but more so an opportunity to rub elbows with the hardest working volunteers who give and give and give some more, people with ethics, values, and love.

<u>990 Tax Form</u>

At the recent IAFE convention in Las Vegas, Rob Lyons, Certified Public Accountant from New York conducted a workshop related to the 990 Tax Form. Both Linda Rooker, Fayette County Fair, and I attended the session. Mr. Lyons has written many articles about the sweeping changes in the present form which requires "not-for-profits" to submit full disclosures about relationships among the members of their governing bodies. He stressed revisiting the mission statement which indicates the goals for your organization. If the statement addresses only the time your fair is in session and does not include the next 51 weeks during which you have income from other sources, it is highly possible in an audit could jeopardize your not-for-profit status. In addition, these penalties can rise to 200 percent. The mission statement has to be one of independence. It assures your organization provides a public benefit and does not drift away from a charitable purpose. It must address this charitable purpose for any income during the fiscal year. The primary foundational principle is that the board should clearly understand and publicly express its mission. Mr. Lyons indicated prior to doing business with a board member, the project should be put out for bid.


A member of your board is considered independent as a voting member only if all three of the following circumstances applied at all times during the organization's tax year.

1. The member was not compensated as an officer or other employee of the organization or of a related organization except as provided in the religious exception.

2. The member did not receive total compensation or other payments exceeding \$10,000 during the organization's tax year from the organization and related organizations other than reasonable compensation for services provided in the capacity as a member of the governing body. 3. Neither the member, nor any family member of the member, was involved in a transaction with the organization, whether directly or indirectly through affiliation with another organization, that is required to be reported on Schedule L.

A sample Conflict of Interest Policy which fairs can use as a model for establishing one of their own is available. A number of the 114 fairs have already traveled this route of safe governance. Please contact me to request a copy of this sample.

Included in that same packet was a letter concerning the 2011 convention's Annual Meeting and a Voting Delegate. Proposed changes to the bylaws were available by December 15, 2010.

Associates were mailed a 2011 convention packet, trade show packet and dues notice. Follow-up phone calls will be made as necessary.

Distribution of Material at Convention

Hershey Lodge and PSACF personnel will enforce the NO distribution of material (printed matter, CDs, tapes, etc.) on public tables in the Great Lobby, Chocolate Lobby and Chocolate Ballroom (except performing acts).

Reimbursement Applications

As I reviewed the reimbursement applications for the PA Department of Agriculture, the following notes were compiled:

Some fairs reversed the counts of exhibits, exhibitors by department.

Required - minimum of 12 departments containing a minimum of 5 exhibitors in each department to qualify for reimbursement. As fairs are making adjustments to their competitive exhibits program, be aware of this requirement plus the possible impact to your class of fair. In addition, this 12 departments/5 exhibitors must be considered when completing Addendum II to include complete names and addresses (phone numbers where available).

Many fairs listed items on Addendum IV that are not eligible, such as entertainment, carnival expenses, etc.

The electronic file needed to assist in the statewide

statistics is the spreadsheet file (.xls extension). Some are being received as documents (.html, .wps, etc.). It is preferable to be sent via email; however, by mail is also acceptable. If you are



sending a CD, disk, etc., make sure there is a readable file on it. Some came empty or were not readable. Try reading/opening it yourself before sending.

Proposed By-Law Changes

In the "Annual Meeting" section of the website can be found the proposed by-law changes to be considered at the 2011 Annual Meeting. Those proposed changes:

- 1 Clearly identify and define the types of members.
- 2 Define Dues with generic language. The generic language notes that whatever is proposed/adopted by the Executive Committee must be presented/approved at the annual meeting.

The proposal from the Executive Committee for 2011 is as follows:

<u>Fair Member</u> - based on class of fair: A-\$400, B-\$300, C-\$200, D-\$150, E-\$100.

Fair Affiliate Member - \$25.

Associate Member - \$65.

With the drop of fair funding over the last few years, and reimbursement, Fair Member dues would not be adequate for the association to function properly. Based on this proposal, Fair Member dues would be at 70% of the level several years ago.

- 3 Define the Secretary as Executive Secretary, and Secretary/Treasurer as Executive Secretary/Treasurer. If the positions are not combined, the Executive Secretary does not need to be a member of the Executive Committee when no member is available. The Treasurer must be a member of the Executive Committee. If the positions are combined. the Executive Secretary/Treasurer must be a member of the Executive Committee. It is apparent that a majority of the work is with the Executive Secretary and may be more difficult to fill within the Executive Committee.
- If there any questions or comments, contact Ron Miller or the association office.






Agriculture Committee in the last administration. Hon. Joe Markosik is Minority Chairman of the Appropriation's Committee.






Zone Three – Debbie Stephenson
