Performance Assurance Checklist

The purpose for the Performance Assurance Program is to provide a foundation for the safety of all youth enrolled in equine projects with the intent to perform at the Palouse Empire Fair. Each Exhibitor will complete the checklist with confidence and the signature of the leader/advisor and guardian on the fair entry form will attest to that fact. Check all areas appropriate to performance ability:

In Hand

- Demonstrate how to lead a horse.
- Demonstrate how to safely tie a horse.
- Demonstrate the ability to lead a horse on grass 40 feet, stop safely and walk back.
- Demonstrate how to safely pick up and clean hooves.

Under Saddle

- Demonstrate tacking and untacking.
- Demonstrate how to check your tack.
- Demonstrate mounting and dismounting from both sides of the horse.
- Explain what to do in an emergency, if you fall and get a foot hung up in the stirrup.
- Demonstrate that you and your horse can do an emergency stop from a trot or a canter if you will be riding at those gaits.

In Harness

- Demonstrate harnessing and unharnessing.
- Demonstrate how to check your tack.
- Demonstrate hitching and unhitching
- Remember the rule: When meeting another vehicle head on, keep to the right.

General

- Describe what to wear when handling horses.
- Demonstrate how to approach a horse.
- Identify the horse's blind spots and why you need to know where they are.
- Demonstrate your ability to distinguish horse moods based on pictures of horses.
- Explain what a red ribbon in a horsetail means.
- Describe show ring procedures, safety and etiquette.

In an arena setting with numerous other horses and handlers, I feel comfortable at these gaits.
