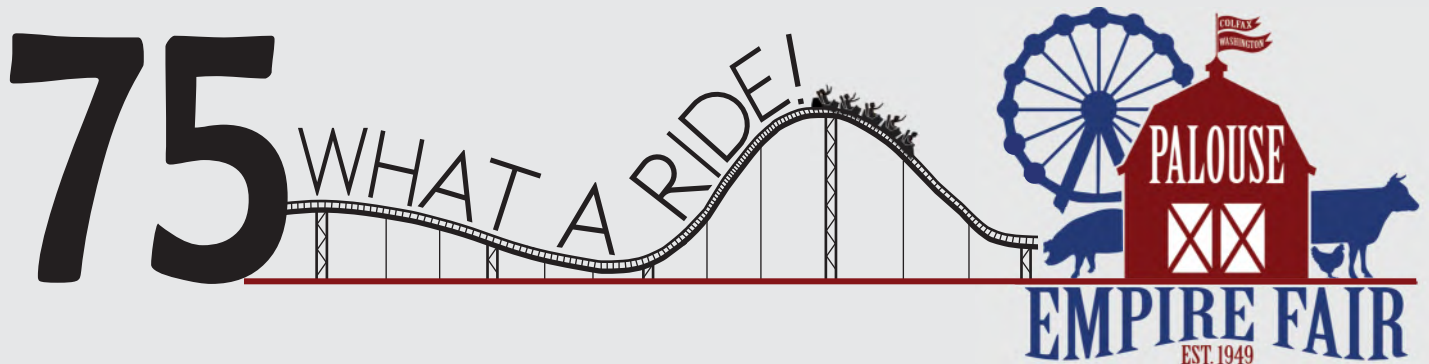

### General Rules and Regulations

1. The Palouse Empire Fair Association implements a non-discrimination policy in all programs and competitive activities, and has endeavored to make this Fair representative of the agricultural interests of Whitman County.
2. The Palouse Empire Fair does not charge a fee for entering exhibits or animals; however, anyone who resides on the grounds during the Fair (RV Lot, North Bridge Lot, Hugh Huntley Lot, and spaces adjacent to commercial exhibits) will pay a set camping fee.
3. The Palouse Empire Fair maintains a policy that exhibitors and fairgoers are required to purchase a daily admission ticket(s) or 4-day pass(es), except for youth not yet entering Kindergarten.
4. Absolutely no moving vehicles within the Fair gates between 8:00 am – 9:00 pm. Service vehicles will be allowed to move on the grounds before 8:00 am and after 9:00 pm.
5. Additional Rules and Regulations exist pertaining to specific exhibits, sales of animals, and barn participation. It is the Exhibitor's responsibility to comply with all rules.
6. Exhibits, special displays, and barn decorations cannot be dismantled until 4:01 pm Sunday of the Fair.
7. Animal entries are due on August 1<sup>st</sup> by 5:00 pm, using the online ShoWorks entry software.
8. The number of entries made by an exhibitor in any class is specified in the rules governing each division. Entries are not confined to Whitman County, but acceptance, especially animal entries because of limited space, will be determined by the respective Superintendent and Fair Board.
9. All persons who exhibit at the Fair must have an exhibitor number. Please call or email the Fair Office to get one. This number is used on all exhibits entered. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to notify the Fair Office of changes of their information.
10. Fair insurance does not cover items exhibited. Exhibitors should self-insure exhibits of value through their homeowner's or personal insurance policy.
11. An Exhibit Tag or Animal Entry Form must be completed for each exhibit entered in the Fair.
12. Exhibitors are to use the information in the Exhibitor Guide to complete entries and stall cards.
13. Exhibitors will give the necessary and personal attention to whatever they may enter, and at the close of the Fair take charge of the same. The officers of the Fair will use every precaution in their power, but will not be responsible for lost or damaged exhibits.
14. Exhibitors will be judged on their own merit, regardless of the number of entries in the class.
15. Placing in all classes will be credited with the number of points indicated in specific departments or divisions.
16. 4-H and FFA members entering livestock exhibits in the 4-H and FFA departments cannot enter them in the open departments. No individual may show the same class of livestock in both 4-H and FFA division.
17. Premium checks are mailed upon completion of data entry. It is the responsibility of the Exhibitor to update any address changes. Premium checks will be forfeited 90 days after date of issuance and the Fair is authorized to void at that time. Once exhibitor receives their Premium Check, the Fair assumes NO responsibility for lost/damaged checks.
18. Animals Restricted: ONLY registered animal exhibits and Service Animals are allowed within the main grounds and buildings during Fair. Crowd conditions and bio-security issues at hand are of paramount importance in the County's pursuit to provide a safe environment for the activities they offer in the Fair program. Livestock exhibits must stay in barns.
19. Bicycles, skateboards, motorized scooters, etc. will not be allowed on the main grounds during the Fair.
20. Conflict Resolution Policy: The Palouse Empire Fair Board has formally adopted a Conflict Resolution Policy. Copies of the policy are

available from the Fair Office. This process comes into play in the event any rule or regulation is enforced and an individual wishes to appeal any facet of that enforcement.

1. Enter online at [palouseempirefair.com](http://palouseempirefair.com) using the ShoWorks registration software.
2. Use the following pages and instructions in this book to determine the department, division, and class your item(s) best belongs in to be judged.
3. Exhibitor Number – call or email the Fair Office if you need an exhibitor number.
4. Entry Tag – will be printed off from your online entries. Tags will be placed on exhibitors upon arrival at Fair.

- How: Animals are unloaded at their respective barns. Watch for important updates from Superintendents. Scales will close promptly at the close of the specified drop-off time, please plan accordingly. All animals need to be bedded down by 8:00 pm.

    - Pee Wee Cowpoke calves must cross the scales to check in.
  - Goats: 1:00 – 7:00 pm.
    - Scale located in the Sheep Barn.
  - Horses: 1:00 – 7:00 pm.
  - Sheep: 1:00 – 7:00 pm.
  - Small Animals: 1:00 – 8:00 pm.
  - Swine: 8:00 am – 2:00 pm.

# 4-H and FFA Rules and Regulations



## 4-H: WSU 4-H Extension

FFA: Nathan Moore

**4-H** is the youth development program of Washington State University Extension and helps young people and adults put knowledge to work in all of Washington's counties, cities and communities. 4-H teaches life skills that lead young people to become self-directing, positive, contributing members of society. These life skills include positive self-esteem, effective communication, a sense of responsibility to oneself and one's community, sound decision making, and a strong sense of belonging. These skills give young people the tools necessary for successful adulthood. 4-H is an educational program for youth 5 years to less than 19 years of age. It is conducted through volunteer 4-H leaders who are supported by WSU Extension Educators who help lead 4-H projects and activities.

**FFA** is a national organization of youth enrolled in Agricultural Education classes. The local unit is the Chapter in each school offering agricultural education, under the supervision of the agriculture teacher who is always the local chapter advisor. The state unit includes all chapters in the state, under the Superintendent of Public Instruction. The program includes the improvement of agriculture leading ultimately to ownership of the farms and the development of good rural citizenship. Participation in fairs and livestock shows is recognized as having educational value as well as stimulation for better results and fine projects, under supervision of the qualified Chapter Advisor and with the cooperation of the Fair's management.

## Rules and Regulations

1. The Palouse Empire Fair follows policies set forth in the 4-H/FFA Memorandum of Understanding, dated: 10/2018.
2. General rules and regulations will apply to all entries in the 4-H and FFA sections.
3. The Washington State 4-H Youth Development Program Policy, EM 0758E, will apply to all entries in the 4-H section, as a minimum requirement.
4. 4-H age is recorded as the age as of October 1<sup>st</sup> of the current 4-H year. The 4-H year runs October 1<sup>st</sup> through September 30<sup>th</sup>.
5. The 4-H age groups are as follows:
  - Cloverbuds 5-7 years
  - Junior 8-10 years
  - Intermediate 11 – 13 years
  - Senior 14 - < 19 years
6. Youth must be 8 years on or before October 1<sup>st</sup> of the current 4-H year to participate in large animal projects, shooting sports, and food preservation projects.
7. Cloverbud 4-H members are encouraged to exhibit at the Fair in the appropriate departments, divisions, and classes; however, they are not to be judged on a competitive basis. Cloverbuds are not eligible to enroll in a large animal project. Participation ribbons and/or other awards will be given to Cloverbud members. For more Cloverbud participation guidelines refer to 4-H Policy & Procedure Handbook (contact WSU 4-H Extension).
8. 4-H exhibitors shall be enrolled in 4-H by April 1<sup>st</sup> of the current year.
9. Livestock that is shown in 4-H or FFA classes cannot be shown in open classes.
10. No exhibitor shall make more than (2) entries in any class. (*See Stock Sale Rules and Regulations section for Special Rules*)
11. All animals to be shown must be registered by August 1<sup>st</sup>.
12. Youth entering horses or livestock such as beef, goats, swine, or sheep shall be able to handle and control said animal to insure safety of exhibitors, volunteers, and the general public.
13. All animals entered shall meet the animal health requirements as outlined in this Exhibitor Guide.
14. 4-H members shall exhibit only those articles made or animals cared for during the current 4-H year.
15. The FFA calendar year for Supervised Agricultural Experiences (SAE) is August 1<sup>st</sup> – July 31<sup>st</sup>.
16. 4-H members shall exhibit or compete only in projects they are enrolled. Exhibits shall be different enterprises than FFA, FCCLA or school projects.
17. Animals from the same farm can and will be put together due to limited number of pens.
18. All 4-H/FFA exhibitors showing animal projects must enter a Fitting and Showing class with their animal in each division entered. Show scheduling conflicts shall be resolved with Superintendent's approval. Participation in other classes is optional.
19. The Palouse Empire Fair does not charge a stall fee and furnishes the bedding.
20. Exhibitors shall provide their own feed (including hay), feed boxes, and water containers.
21. Judges will award exhibitors premium points to which they are entitled, regardless of competition, using the Danish system.
22. All premium money will be prorated to all those who take part according to the number of points each contestant earns
23. Ribbon(s) will be given to each placing where the judge believes a ribbon is deserving. Only blue-

ribbon animals will compete for Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion ribbon(s).

24. Each livestock exhibitor is to give daily care to their animal(s) and to clean pens and stalls before 8 a.m. daily. Washing of sheep will be at the discretion of the Superintendent.
25. **RESPONSIBILITY OF OWNER:** Exhibitors shall show their own animal. Only legitimate reasons for absentee showing will be accepted. The exhibitor must request permission from the barn Superintendent if they cannot be present to show or sell their animal(s).
26. Exhibitor is responsible to see that their animal is not overlooked in any phase of the show. All animals shall be properly fitted and exhibited by the owner to be eligible for the sale & premium money.
27. The use of illegal drugs and/or the improper use of animal health products or foreign substances shall not be tolerated in the Washington State 4-H Youth Development Program or Washington FFA. Extension personnel, FFA Advisors, 4-H volunteers, families, youth, and fair/show officials have a legal and moral obligation not to misuse these products. We have the responsibility to tell others not to use these substances, and to report those who do use any illegal substance.
28. The administration of any drug or medication, which could affect an animal's performance resulting in an unfair advantage or the disposition of the animal, is unacceptable. Additionally, there are federal penalties for using illegal substances in animals that are going into the nation's food supply.

## General Rules for Fitting and Showing

1. Any 4-H or FFA member must enter this contest with their own animal.
2. Age divisions:
  - 4-H: Cloverbud, Junior, Intermediate, and Senior.
  - FFA: Beginner, Novice, and Advanced.



3. The exhibitor shall do all work in connection with Fitting and Showing.
4. 4-H and FFA Fitting and Showing exhibitors will be divided into separate 4-H and FFA classes if there are sufficient entries, at the discretion of the Superintendent.
5. Showing will be by the species.
6. 4-H and FFA members entering livestock exhibits in the 4-H and FFA departments cannot enter them in the open department. No individual may show the same class of livestock in both 4-H and FFA.
7. Awards will be on the basis of: presentation for showing, showing of the animal, appearance and ability of the exhibitor to show their animal.
8. An overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be determined from 4-H Junior, Intermediate, and Senior classes combined. An overall Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion will be determined from the FFA beginner, novice, and advanced classes combined. Grand Champion winners entered in market classes and selling a market animal are eligible to compete in the large animal Ernie Dippel Round Robin contest.
9. Palouse Empire Fair supports the IAFE (International Association of Fairs and Expos) Code of Show Ring ethics and by exhibition at this fair, all exhibitors agree to be bound by same rules and regulations.

# Livestock Judging & Round Robins

## Livestock Judging:

- 4-H Chairman: Janet Schmidt
- Committee: Whitman County 4-H Livestock Leaders
- FFA Chairman: Nathan Moore
- Committee: All Whitman County Co-Ag Instructors

### Rules and Regulations:

1. Livestock Judging Contest is open to all youth.
2. Each contestant will place in six classes of livestock (sheep, swine, beef, and goats).
3. Each contestant will yield grade at least 5 market steers, 4-H being the exception.
4. Oral reasons will be given on specified classes.
5. Registration and check in starts at 7:30 am on Saturday in the Youth Ag. Pavilion.
6. Contest starts at 8 am.

### Special Contests & Awards:

1. Top (3) FFA teams will receive FFA banners and (4) individuals on the teams will receive premium points.
  - 1<sup>st</sup> = 80 pts, 2<sup>nd</sup> = 70 pts, 3<sup>rd</sup> = 60 pts
2. Top (3) 4-H individuals in each age group will receive a prize and premium points.
  - Top (3) individuals in each division will receive premium points as follows:
    - Jr. 1<sup>st</sup> = 80 pts, 2<sup>nd</sup> = 70 pts, 3<sup>rd</sup> = 60 pts
    - Inter. 1<sup>st</sup> = 80 pts, 2<sup>nd</sup> = 70 pts, 3<sup>rd</sup> = 60 pts
    - Sr. 1<sup>st</sup> = 80 pts, 2<sup>nd</sup> = 70 pts, 3<sup>rd</sup> = 60 pts
3. Clint Luce Memorial Livestock Judging Contest Award
  - Certificate is given to the Whitman County 4-H member who has the highest individual score.

10 am starting with swine.

4. Check with your Superintendent for more information.

### How to Enter:

1. Contestants will be the Fitting and Showing champions who won while showing their market animal that qualifies and is selling in the Junior Market Stock Sale.
2. If the Fitting and Showing champion does not meet the qualifications, the reserve champion will take their place in the contest as long as they meet the contest qualifications.

### Large Animal – Special Contests & Awards:

  - 1<sup>st</sup> = \$200
  - 2<sup>nd</sup> = \$100
  - If there is a tie, each winner will receive the designated prize money.

### Small Animal – Rules and Regulations:

1. Contestants shall compete on all (5) small animal species (rabbit, cavy, poultry, dog, and cat) to be judged and awarded the Round Robin champion.
2. Pocket pets will also be included if there are enough exhibitors.
3. The Round Robin contest will be on Sunday at 10:30 am held in the Goat Show Arena.
4. Check with your Superintendent for more information.

### How to Enter:

1. (2) showmen, out of the 4-H, FFA, and open Fitting and Showing classes, in each species will be selected by each judge to compete in Round Robin.
2. Champion showmen do not get an automatic spot in the Round Robin competition, only if selected by the judge.

The Palouse Empire Junior Market Stock Sale is coordinated by the Palouse Empire Junior Market Stock Sale Association (PEJMSSA) in conjunction with the Palouse Empire Fair. A deduction will be made from the sale price on all animals sold through the sale ring to cover expenses incurred by the PEJMSSA.

## **Stock Sale:**

### **2024 Sale Order:**

Swine, Beef, Goats, and Sheep; 4-H followed by FFA.

### **General Rules and Regulations**

#### **Eligibility:**

This sale is only open to 4-H and FFA members in good standing who have: 1) completed the Whitman County Quality Assurance Program as certified by a registered Whitman County Quality Assurance instructor or the national Youth for the Quality Care of Animals Program (YQCA) program, 2) who submit a record of health at weigh-in time, and 3) who have met ALL ownership and registration deadlines for the Palouse Empire Fair.

#### **Sale Limitations:**

1. Only (1) animal per exhibitor will go through the sale. A second animal can either be turned or taken home by exhibitor. Second animal(s) (goat, lamb, swine, and beef) going home must be identified with a tag **at weigh-in**.
2. Goats, lambs, and swine will be tagged by color as follows:
  - Yellow Tags: sale animals
  - Red Tags: turn animals
  - Green Tags: take home animals
  - *Barn Superintendents may make adjustments to these colors based on tag availability & approved by the PEJMSSA Executive Committee. Any adjustments will be posted at weigh-in.*
3. The grand champion and reserve grand champion of each species shall be sold through the sale ring regardless of weigh-in tagged destination.
  - In the event of an exhibitor showing (2) animals regardless of species, and both placing either grand champion or reserve grand champion, by Thursday at 9pm the exhibitor will declare to the PEJMSSA Executive Committee which champion animal will be sold with the full proceeds going to the Exhibitor and the other champion animal will be sold with the proceeds above the turn price going to the livestock barn of their choice. Those dollars are to be held and dispersed by the Junior Market Stock Sale Executive Committee. The Exhibitor will receive the turn rate on the second (donated) champion animal.
4. FFA grand champions will sell first on odd numbered years; 4-H grand champions will sell first on even numbered years.
5. The reserve grand champions will be numbers 3 and 4 in the sale order. The sale order for classes of livestock will be decided upon by the Stock Sale Committee on a yearly basis.
6. Length of ownership prior to weigh-in day for the fair: Exhibitor shall have owned, have possession, and care for their designated 4H or FFA project animal(s) no less than:
  - Beef: 120 days.
  - Goat: 60 days.
  - Lamb: 60 days.
  - Swine: 60 days.
7. Weight limits:
  - Beef: 1000 lb. minimum with no maximum.
    - Any steer dropped after January 1<sup>st</sup> of previous year, will be eligible.
  - Goats: 60 lb. minimum and 120 lb. maximum.
    - Goats must be less than one year old.
  - Lamb: 100 lb. minimum and 160 lb. maximum.
    - Lambs shall not show yearling teeth.
  - Swine: 240 lb. minimum and 300 lb. maximum.
  - There will be no re-weighing of animals. Animals not making weight minimums, with the exception of swine which must meet minimum weight at weigh-in time, may be shown in Fitting and Showing if no other animal is available.
8. The use of antibiotics and other drugs in any meat animal must correlate with the labeled withdrawal period finishing before weigh-in. All antibiotics, medicated feed and other drugs must be documented on the REQUIRED

Producer Affidavit & Market Animal Health Record form that is turned in at the weigh-in scale. Tranquilizers of any kind – natural or otherwise – are prohibited in market animals before or during the fair. Samples may be collected from animals for testing purposes. Any animal or carcass that shows evidence of having medication, treatment or dosing following the weigh-in cut-off for withdrawal will be retained by orders of the State or Federal meat inspector. If any detectable amounts of antibiotics or other treatments/drugs are found, the entire carcass will be condemned and the exhibitor will not receive payment for the animal. This would also apply to carcasses condemned because of disease.

9. To participate in the Palouse Empire Junior Market Stock Sale, or turn an animal to the packer, Exhibitors must complete either a Whitman County Quality Assurance Program or the national YQCA Program prior to August 1<sup>st</sup>. If participating in a Whitman County QA training, the trainer will provide a list of participants with sign-in signatures and date of training to the PEF Fair Manager by August 1. These lists will be cross-checked with the instructors listed on Exhibitor registration. If participating in an online YQCA training, Exhibitors must provide a copy of the completion certificate to the PEF at the time of weigh-in. Any discrepancies with registration and YQCA certification could result in disqualification from the PEJMSSA Stock Sale as well as PEF.
10. To participate in the PEJMSSA or to turn an animal to the packer, all Exhibitors must give their completed Producer Affidavit & Market Animal Health Record to their barn Superintendent at weigh-in. Animals will not be weighed until the completed Health Record is produced. Health record forms are available in the WSU/Whitman County Extension Office or accessed from the web website <http://extension.wsu.edu/Whitman/youth/>. Failure to comply with providing an accurate and complete Affidavit/Health Record form will prohibit the youth exhibitor from participating in the Palouse Empire Fair Junior Market Stock Sale or turning an animal to the packer.
11. Animals must receive blue or red ribbons to go through the sale. No white ribbon animals will be allowed to sell and the animal will

remain the responsibility of the owner.

12. No animal that has been exhibited and sold through another junior market stock sale is eligible to show and sell at the Palouse Empire Fair Junior Market Stock Sale.
13. Floor price on turn steers will be exact amount paid by the packer based on quality yield grade of the individual animal. Any docks on carcass price by packer will be passed on to seller.

## **Livestock Health Regulations – for both PEJMSSA and PEF animal entries:**

### **Fair Veterinarian: Dr. Randy McGraw**

- The official Fair Veterinarian will give clinical inspections of all livestock and poultry at the time the Exhibits are presented for entry at the Fair. There will be no charge to the Exhibitor for this inspection.

## **WSDA Minimum Animal Health Requirements for County, District, and State Fairs**

1. Each fair must have an official Fair Veterinarian in attendance.
2. Individual health certificates on Washington animals are not required for entry. The Fair Veterinarian shall issue a blanket health certificate covering all in-state entries to the fair.
3. No animal from a quarantined area or premise will be permitted to enter the fair or show.
4. All out-of-state animal entries must comply with State of Washington regulations or receive an exemption from the State Veterinarian for exhibition at the fair only.
5. All out-of-state horses must have a negative Coggins test (EIA) within six (6) months except for horses from Oregon.
6. Fair veterinarians will inspect all classes of livestock, poultry, horses, pet animals, rabbits, fur-bearing animals, pigeons, ducks, geese, and turkeys before they are exhibited, to determine that the animals show no clinical indications of contagious, infectious disease and ectoparasite.
7. Fair veterinarians must reject any animal with infectious or contagious diseases or ectoparasite. Exhibitors should be aware that ringworm, warts, pinkeye, strangles, contagious ecthyma, scabies, lice, mites, ticks and fleas fall into these categories.
8. Those animals exhibiting disease symptoms

during the course of the fair shall also be rejected by the Fair Veterinarian and removed from the exhibit area.

9. It is strongly recommended, but not required, that cattle be vaccinated in the current show year against respiratory diseases.
10. The Fair Veterinarian's professional decision as to the health status of an animal is final and shall be upheld by the fair board.
11. All exhibitors residing out of the state of Washington must have a Health certificate for each animal, and must comply with Washington State and Interstate Health Regulations that are in effect at the time of the Palouse Empire Fair.
12. Intact male animals are not eligible to be shown in Market or Fitting and Showing classes. If one is entered, that animal will be rejected from the fair. Intact male animals in breeding classes must follow the rules for that department. See sheep department for exception to this policy.

## Buy an animal for your freezer:

- You may bid on an animal of your choice at the sale or have someone else bid on it for you. Volunteers are available – contact anyone on the Stock Sale Committee for details. Custom slaughtering services are available to take delivery of the animal at the sale for you. You will be responsible for the cost of processing the animal in addition to the auction bid.

## Buy an animal and turn it to the packer:

- Many people want to support youth livestock producers but may not need the meat. You

can still bid on an animal above the floor price (determined in advance) of the packer. If you are the successful bidder, you turn the animal to the packer and simply pay the difference between the floor price and your bid. If you are having someone bid for you, ask the sale floor price and the approximate weight of the animal you are interested in. Since the cost of production is often close to or about the floor price, this personal contribution is a wonderful way of rewarding the hundreds of hours of work and preparation these young livestock producers have invested in their projects.

## Changes:

- Any changes to the sale slips that are signed at time of sale must be made by **8:00 pm on sale day**. These changes must be made in the Stock Sale Office and approved by the Stock Sale Treasurer.

## How to give extra support:

- If you aren't prepared to purchase an animal, but would still like to support one or more of the youth livestock producers who go through the sale, add-on support will be accepted online as well as in the Stock Sale Office at the fairgrounds during the 4-days of the fair. Add-on support **after** the fair will remain open only via the online site through 5:00 pm on 9/20/2024. More information about the online add-on support will be available from the Palouse Empire Junior Market Stock Sale Association.

### **4-H & FFA Rules and Regulations:**

- Exhibitors are responsible for reading and complying with the following rules and regulations.
  - Palouse Empire Fair General Rules & Regulations.
  - 4-H & FFA Rules and Regulations.
  - Jr. Market Stock Sale Rules and Regulations.
  - IAFE Show Ring Code of Ethics.
  - Department Rules and Regulations.
  - Rules and Regulations posted in the Beef Barn.
- Department Rules and Regulations:
  - All steers must be weighed-in on the designated dates and time in the spring at the Palouse Empire Fairgrounds, by the Beef Superintendent and/or County Extension Agent. Contact the Extension Office (509- 397-6290) or the Fair Office (509-397-6263) for dates of official required weigh-in.
    - At weigh-in, steers must be halter broke and will be tagged with tamper proof tags & EID buttons. Steers must have the same tag in their ear when arriving at the Fair.
  - The animal entered in Fitting and Showing must also be entered and shown in one of the following classes: Market Steers, Breeding Stock, or Feeder Steers.
  - For Market and Fitting and Showing classes, steers must be polled or dehorned. Healed horns or re-growth must not extend more than 2" from the hairline. Horned Breeding animals must have the horn tips covered as a safety precaution and will be subjected to Superintendent's discretion.
  - Special emphasis will be made to have the desirable prime or choice steers placed in

the blue-ribbon class. Steers below select will receive white ribbons.

- Brand (haul) slips, "Producer Affidavit & Market Beef Health Record," and applicable Change of Ownership forms signed by the exhibitor shall be turned in to the Beef Superintendents BEFORE steers will be weighed in on Wednesday as they are unloaded at Fair, no exceptions.
- All branded steers will also require an official valid Washington State Brand Inspection certificate issued by a state inspector or a valid, signed Washington State Department of Agriculture Self-Inspection Certificate showing exhibitor as the legal owner. Any questions, please call Kayla Slaybaugh at (509) 780-1293. Animals consigned to the sale shall not be entered in any other class except the appropriate Fitting and Showing class.

### **Open Rules and Regulations:**

- The Palouse Empire Fair supports the IAFE National Code of Show Ring Ethics and by exhibition at this fair, all exhibitors agree to be bound by same rules and regulations.
- Cattle to be exhibited are to be entered by August 1<sup>st</sup>.
- All cattle must be on the grounds by 6:30 pm Wednesday. Cattle entries are not to leave the Fairgrounds until 4:01 p.m. Sunday.
- Open beef cattle judging will start at 8:30 am Friday.
- The Palouse Empire Fair does not charge a stall fee. The Fair Association will furnish bedding. Each exhibitor is encouraged not to waste bedding material. Exhibitor will furnish their own feed.
- All entries must be registered with their respective breed associations and registration papers and tattoos will be checked prior to showing.
- All females over 4 months must be Brucellosis vaccinated prior to the Fair and display proof thereof.
- All animals shown in-group classes must have been shown in their respective single age class.
- There will need to be more than 10 head per breed to award the division champion ribbons.
- Females competing in Class 11 must have a natural born calf at side or furnish a non-owner veterinarian's statement of her pregnancy.

- Objectives: To identify steers that produce desirable high yield and high-quality carcasses. To identify variations in the characteristics that affect differences in carcass value.
- Requirements:
  - Minimum of 550 lbs. warm carcass weight.
  - Minimum of select quality grade.
  - Base grid price will be calculated on a yield grade 3, low choice carcass, utilizing the market prices at the time of the market sale. Cattle valued at or above the base price will receive a blue ribbon. Carcasses qualifying for Carcass of Merit Awards will be indexed as follows:
    - Dressing percent (yield of semi-boneless retail cuts) will be determined from the live and hot carcass weights.
    - A USDA grader will determine yield and quality grades by measuring the ribeye area, fat thickness over the ribeye and the kidney, pelvic and heart fat. If both halves of the carcass are evaluated independently, the results from the best half will be used. A yield grade will be calculated to the nearest tenth of a grade. A yield grade of 3.0 is equivalent to a 60% yield of semi-boneless, closely trimmed retail cuts. If the yield grade of a steer changes by +/- 0.1 (from (3.0), then 0.3% is added or subtracted from the base of 60%.
  - Quality grades will be based in terms of thirds of USDA grades or marbling scores.
  - Index discounts will be imposed for carcasses with hot carcass weights over 1050 pounds.
  - Steers will be ranked based on the price per hundred weight of the index. In the event that steers have the same index price per hundred weight, the steer with the highest quality grade wins; if quality grade for both steers is the same, then the steer with the lowest yield grade breaks the tie and wins.

- Lamb Tail Docking: Scientific research indicates that the incidence of rectal prolapse is reduced when the tail is docked in a non-extreme manner. Complete tail removal (extreme docking) is not an accepted sheep production practice and will be discouraged at the Palouse Empire Fair. In order to determine extreme docking, the gray tail docking measuring device will be used. The device will be raised in vertical plane and should catch enough tail to lift: this is comparable to two fingers width. A violation has occurred if there is inadequate tail to lift.
- Lambs are not allowed out of the barn during the Fair with the exception of showing in the arena, prep work on the stands between Sheep and Swine Barns, and removal of lamb to exhibitor's home. Removal is only allowed with Superintendent's permission and knowledge.
- All exhibits are to be on the grounds by 7:00 p.m. Wednesday. The Fair Association will furnish bedding. Each exhibitor is encouraged not to waste bedding material. Exhibitors will furnish their own feed and feed boxes. A trim stand area is available for exhibitors.

If using tattoo or microchip, please staple a copy of the legal papers to your Animal Health Record turned in at weigh-in/check-in. Goats without proper identification will be refused entry into the Palouse Empire Fair.
  - Pens will be assigned by the Barn Superintendent. Changes must be made/approved by the Superintendent.
  - Each exhibitor is responsible for the safety, care, feeding, and watering of their own animals for the duration of the Fair.
  - Exhibitors will provide their own buckets/pans and feed (1) bale per animal, for the duration of the Fair. Grain must be stored in containers with lids. For safety reasons, no hay nets and no hay storage allowed in the barn.
- Only clean well-groomed animals will be accepted for exhibit. Hooves must be trimmed and hair to breed standards.
- Exhibitor shall keep their animal, pen, and surrounding areas clean throughout the Fair.
- Goats do not have to be registered with a breed association.
- Goats that do not show any breed standard will be entered in the Crossbreed Class. Superintendent shall determine entry class. In cases of limited numbers, classes may be combined to create competition.
- Breeds which require horns, in their standards (i.e. Pygmy) will not be disqualified for dehorned or polled animals and vice versa. If horned, horns must be wrapped.
- Kids less than 2 months of age may NOT be shown. These kids may be used as an educational display.
- Competition order to be determined by Superintendent. 4-H scoring is based on the Danish System.
- Rules for Market Goats:
  - All market goats must be weighed and tagged upon arrival. Minimum weight is 60 lbs. and maximum weight is 120 lbs.

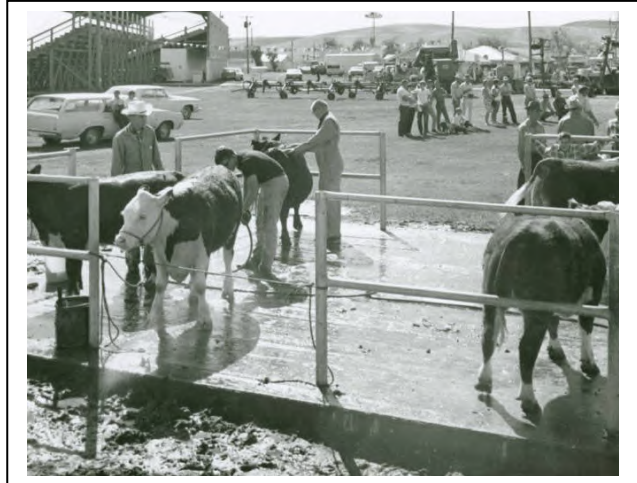

- Only grain harvested in current year is eligible for entry.
- Each exhibitor may enter one exhibit of each variety they produced.
- Preparation of grain sheaves:
  - Grain Sheaves should be prepared in advance of show.
  - After grain is ripe, in hard dough stage, select heads in the field, true to type, good color, long stiff straws and well filled heads free from disease.
  - Cut these off at ground level, three to five times the necessary amount to complete one sheaf.
  - Be careful not to break straw in handling.
  - Spread sample to dry in sun for a day or two or hang in dry shed, heads down in small bundles.
  - Do not allow grain sheaf to get wet.
  - When green color is entirely gone and straw dries, bind in bundles, tying with a soft cloth, which will not cut the straw.
  - Make bundles three inches in diameter at the center band.
  - Tie snugly and tape in three places and hang in a dry place with heads down.

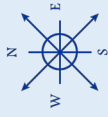

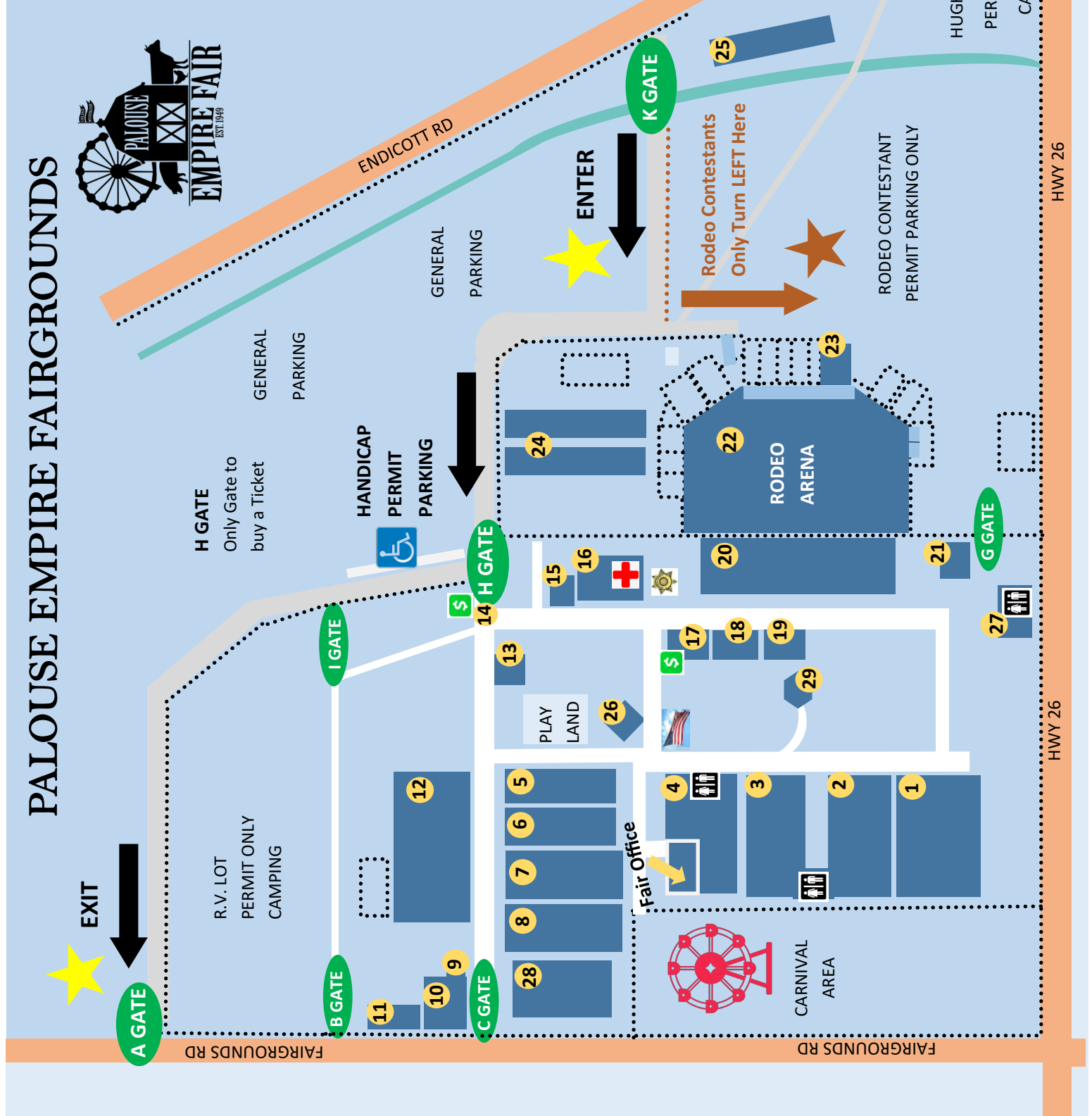

leaf at the top.

- Beans (snap stage) should have beans in pods not formed enough to be very noticeable.
- Potatoes should have no sunburn, cuts or worm holes.

- Flowers must carry own attached foliage. All stems should be in proportion to flower.
- Whenever schedule calls for a certain number of blooms, try to have them all alike and disbudded. A spray is one branch and does not need to be disbudded. A bloom is an individual flower on one stem, and a spike is flower stem less on a common lengthened stalk.

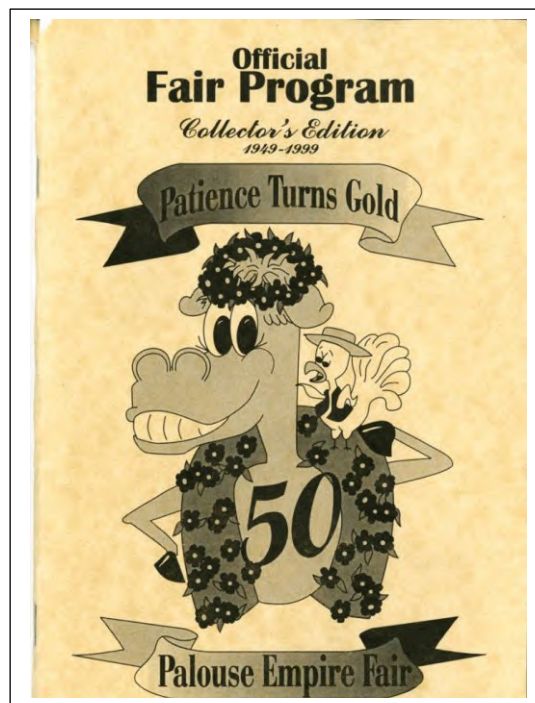

  - All items used in the exhibit should remain in the assigned display area.
  - All naturally grown or processed agricultural products used in the booth must be displayed in its natural state or color. Perishable products and canned fruit may be used as a part if the display in Division B, but may not be entered in other Departments.
  - Division A Exhibitors are required to supply a list of all items/seeds used in the display. The Fair provides forms. This listing will be placed in the Community Booth Judges book as a reference for the judges.
  - Judging guidelines emphasize how well the chosen theme is portrayed.
  - When judged, those booths receiving 65 or more points will receive a guaranteed cash premium of \$50.00. 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> place rosette will be awarded to the top entries per class. Cash prizes for 1<sup>st</sup>-4<sup>th</sup> places will be awarded based on rosette placing.
  - Each booth will be scored and rated according to the division rules and score sheets provided by the Fair. Judges' comments will be mailed to each booth upon completion of the Fair.
- All booth names will be displayed at the base of each booth on signs provided by the Fair. The signs should be incorporated into the overall display and are covered during judging.
- All protests regarding the judging shall be made in writing and follow the Fair's established Grievance Policy. Copies of the Grievance Policy are available upon request at the Fair Office. Persons must state plainly the cause of the complaint or appeal and file it with the Fair Management within 24 hours after the cause of the protest.
- Youth rules:
  - Entry Reservations due by August 15<sup>th</sup>.
  - FFA Chapters, 4-H Clubs, Boy and Girl Scouts troops, Campfire, etc. may be given space for educational displays of their work. Youth exhibits of this nature will be displayed in one general area with space allocated on a first come-first serve basis.
  - All booths are to be in place by 10:00 p.m. Wednesday of Fair week. Displays can be set up prior to this time with Superintendent approval.
  - Exhibits are to remain in place until 4:01 p.m. Sunday or left until Monday no later than 6:00 p.m.
  - Space allotted for each booth will be approximately 6' x 6'. All exhibit material shall be sized to fit this area.
  - Youth group members with adult supervision will set up booths only.

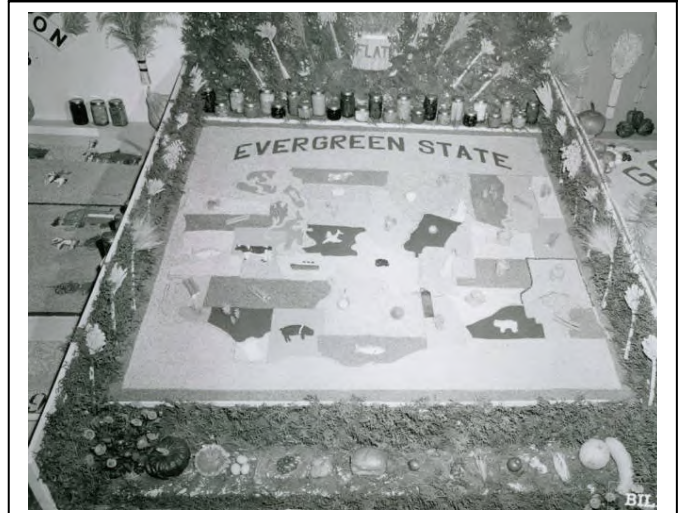
