General Rules and Regulations

- Official Scrapie Tag/Tattoo
- Requirements By order of the Washington State
 Department of Agriculture, effective May 16,
 1999, all female sheep and intact breeding
 males must be identified with an official WSDA
 Scrapie Flock Identification Tag or tattoo prior to
 being admitted for exhibition or sale at the
 Palouse Empire Fair. This requirement is
 following Washington Administrative Code
 (WAC) Chapter 16-89 "Sheep and Goat Scrapie
 Disease Control". Listed sheep without proper
 identification will be refused entry into the
 Palouse Empire Fair.
- No washing of sheep at the Fair without permission of the Sheep Superintendent.
- Lamb Tail Docking: Scientific research indicates that the incidence of rectal prolapse is reduced when the tail is docked in a non-extreme manner. Complete tail removal (extreme docking) is not an accepted sheep production practice and will be discouraged at the Palouse Empire Fair. In order to determine extreme docking, the gray tail docking measuring device will be used. The device will be raised in a vertical plane and should catch enough tail to lift: this is comparable to two fingers width. A violation has occurred if there is inadequate tail to lift. The exhibitor will be informed with a correction expected for future Palouse Empire Fair participation.
- Sheep entries are to be made to the Fair office no later than August 1st.
- All exhibits are to be on the grounds by 8:00 p.m., Wednesday. The Fair Association will furnish bedding. Each exhibitor is encouraged not to waste bedding material. Exhibitors will furnish their own feed and feed boxes. A trim stand area is available for exhibitors.

<u>Daddy's Little Shepherd</u> <u>Division A = Youth</u>

Points Awarded: Blue 75, Red 55, White 35 Rules:

- Junior show persons who have completed the second grade and younger shall be eligible.
- Lamb must be ewe or wether under one year of age. Animals will be weighed in on arrival.
- Class will be judged 60% on conformation, 40% on fitting and showing.
- Entrants will be judged in this section and not in competition with other sections in the sheep division.
- Lambs will be sold according to the owner's wishes (packer or take home.) The packers will need also be considered. If the animal is intended to be turned to the packer, then the youth and parent must participate in a quality assurance program in correspondence with the 4-H club or FFA Chapter prior to July 31, of current fair year.
- If exhibitor prefers to share a pen with a particular 4-H/FFA group or individual, please specify the Club or Chapter number on entry form.
