GENERAL RULES AND REGULATIONS

- 1. The Board of Directors reserves the right to postpone or extend the date of this Exposition; to make any changes in the premium list they may deem necessary for the best interest of the Exposition; to interpret all rules and regulations; and to add to these rules, and settle all questions and differences in regard thereto.
- 2. The Panhandle South Plains Fair Association reserves the right to pay printed premiums in ratio to net earnings. The Association hopes to pay all premiums in full this year; however, as premiums and all other expenses must be paid from gate and other receipts made from the operation of the Fair itself, this condition is made to put exhibitors on due and legal notice.
- 3. Any person violating the general or special rules as published in this premium list will forfeit all privileges and premiums won.
- 4. The Panhandle South Plains Fair Association, its officers, and its employees shall not in any way be held responsible for loss, damage, or injury to articles, livestock or person, while same is on the Fairgrounds. The Fair Association will take all reasonable precautions to protect the property and exhibits of the concessionaires and exhibitors but will not be liable for, or make payment for any article, animal or property lost, damaged, or injured while on the Fairgrounds.
- 5. No claim or suit for injury to any person or property shall be asserted against the Panhandle South Plains Fair Association, its officers or agents, by any person, firm or corporation, or their agent, representatives, servants, or employees having permits to exhibit or occupy space on the Fairgrounds.
- 6. Any exhibit, falsely entered shall, at the option of the Manager, be removed from the Fairgrounds without any reason being assigned therefore and the refunding of any money paid will be left to the discretion of the manager.
- 7. All entries shall be subject to the special rules of the department under which they are entered. In case of conflict between general and special rules, the latter shall govern.
- 8. All protests shall be passed on by the Board of Directors and must be made is writing to the Manager, accompanied by an affidavit setting forth grounds for protesting, together with a deposit fee of fifty dollars (\$50) which will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Parties interested will be notified of the time and place for considering the protest and will be given an opportunity to submit evidence.
- 9. No person will be permitted to distribute advertising matter on the Fairgrounds, except from his or her contracted exhibit space. The tacking of any advertisements, bills, or posters other than within the space occupied by the exhibitor is strictly forbidden. Civic, religious and fraternal organizations are invited to rent booth space under the same rules that apply to all exhibitors. Begging, soliciting, singing, or public speaking is prohibited except from the exhibitor's space rented expressly for that purpose.
- 10. Dogs will not be permitted on fairgrounds during the fair, except those providing assistance to Americans with disabilities.
- 11. Rules and Regulations of the Texas Animal Health Commission will apply to all animals and fowl entered for exhibition at the Fair.
- 12. All livestock trailers, trucks, and other vehicles are required to park in designated parking lots. No parking will be allowed inside the Fair. Towing will be enforced.
- 13. Exhibitors are asked to exercise extreme caution in the handling, transporting, loading, and unloading of their exhibits while on the fairgrounds. Exhibitors are responsible for the actions of their animals and can be held liable for the damages and injuries caused by them.
- 14. Exhibitors must have owned all animals shown by them for at least 30 days prior to the date of exhibition. Firms or partnerships who own animals entered must have been in existence at least 30 days prior to the Fair opening and gave written proof.
- 15. Exhibitors may bring their own feed, however, in order for the exhibits to be presented in a more attractive manner, only a limited amount should be brought in at any one time and this must be kept in the service alley. **Grooming Cutes are not allowed on the Fairgrounds during the Junior Shows.**
- 16. The Fair Association reserves the right to limit entries and no entry will be accepted for exhibition for which provision is not made in this premium list. In the Junior Shows, all pen and stall assignments will be made in the same manner in which they were entered by CEA or AST, no county groups or club groups allowed.
- 17. All applications for entry of livestock must be made in writing on printed forms, retrieved from the Fair's website or obtained from the Fair Office. Verbal notice of entry will not be accepted.

General Information Cont'd

- 18. An animal not up to the requirements of the premium list, as to pedigree and registration, will be barred from competition.
- 19. Entry fees are non-returnable and refunds will not be made.
- 20. Judges will not award prizes to an unworthy exhibit. In cases where there is only one exhibitor, and no other competition, premium shall be awarded in accordance with the merits of the item exhibited; which may be first, second, third, fourth, etc.
- 21. Where it is possible, awards will be made by the single judging system and, as far as practical, judges of livestock will be chosen from among those recommended by the various breed association.
- 22. The decision of the judges shall be final and no appeal will be considered except in the case of a protest.
- 23. Premium ribbons will be awarded in accordance with the following: first-blue, second-red, third-white, fourth-pink, fifth-yellow, etc.
- 24. Only first prize winning animals are eligible to compete for championship honors. Only champion prize winning animals are eligible to compete for grand champion honors. (In Championship Classes, "Senior" designates cattle two years old and over; "Junior" under two years.)
- 25. Livestock may not be removed from the grounds early without a written release from the Superintendent of the Department in which entered.
- 26. HERDSMAN AWARD: \$25.00 plus a banner will be awarded to the exhibitor who maintains the most attractive exhibit and reflects the best all-around cooperative attitude in the Open Dairy, Southwest Regional Open Southdown, Open Rambouillet Sheep, and the Open Boer Goat Shows.
- 27. JUNIOR SHOWMANSHIP AWARD: \$25.00 plus a plaque will be awarded to a Junior Exhibitor in the Junior Dairy, Junior Steer, and Junior Beef Heifer on the basis of general appearance, skill, courtesy, and sportsmanship in the arena.

Summary of Texas Requirements

For Intrastate, Interstate and International Livestock (Domestic and Exotic), Poultry and Ratites

Note: The following summary is a condensed version of the Texas Animal Health Commission regulations. The regulations will supersede this summary if there is a dispute between the two.

Cattle Requirements (including Bison)

I. Intrastate (Cattle moved within the state of Texas)

- A. All cattle or bison originating in Texas and participating in:
 - 1. Intrastate shows, fairs, and exhibitions (those functions that require Texas livestock, poultry and ratites of the same species to be housed and exhibited separate and apart from livestock, poultryand ratites from out of state) are exempt from the certificate of veterinary inspection and testing requirements.
 - 2. Interstate shows, fairs, and exhibitions (those functions that permit livestock and poultry from other states to enter for show or exhibition and held in common facilities with Texas origin livestock and poultry of the same species) are exempt from an entry permit, but must meet the same other requirements as for those species entering from out-of-state and be accompanied by a certificate ofveterinary inspection.
 - a. Texas origin dairy cattle are not required to be tested for tuberculosis to participate in a show, fair or exhibition within the state but must be officially individually identified.
- B. Requirements for Change of Ownership within Texas
 - 1. All dairy cattle must to be individually identified prior to change of ownership.
 - 2. All sexually intact cattle, 18 months of age and older, changing ownership within Texas, shall beofficially identified within seven days of the change of ownership.
 - 3. Trichomoniasis Requirements
 - a. All Texas origin bulls sold, leased, gifted, exchanged or otherwise change possession forbreeding purposes in the State of Texas shall meet the following testing or certification requirements prior to sale or change of ownership in the state.
 - 1) Registered bulls under 18 months of age can be certified as virgin, by the breeder, and accompanied by a breeder's certificate of virgin status; or
 - 2) If from a herd of unknown status (a herd that has not had a whole herd test), be tested negative on three consecutive culture tests conducted not less than seven (7) days apart orone RT-PCR test conducted within 60 days of sale or movement, be held separate from all female cattle since the test sample was collected, and be accompanied by a Trich test record showing the negative test results.
 - 3) Untested Bulls: Bulls presented for sale without a breeder's certification of virgin status or aTrich test record showing negative test results may:
 - a) Be sold for movement only directly to slaughter; or
 - b) Sold for movement to a feedlot and then to slaughter; or
 - c) Be sold and moved under a Hold Order to such place as specified by the Commissionfor testing to change status from a slaughter bull to a breeding bull.
 - Such bulls require official permanent individual identification prior to movement; move to the designated location on a VS 1-27 permit, and be held in isolation from female cattle at the designated location for not less than 21 days where the bull shallundergo three culture tests or for not less than 7 days where the bull shall undergo one RT-PCR test.
 - If the results of any test are positive, the bull shall be classified as infected and be permitted for movement only directly to slaughter or to a market for sale directly to slaughter.
 - 4. Brucellosis and Tuberculosis Requirements

- A. Any livestock, poultry or ratites that are infected, exposed or quarantined in any manner for an infectious, contagious or communicable disease may not enter the state. Contact TAHC at 1-800-550-8242.
- B. An owner-shipper statement may be used in lieu of a certificate of veterinary inspection in someinstances (see below).
- C. Entry permits are required as noted in the following section and may be obtained by calling 512/719-0777(24 hours) or 1-800-550-8242, ext. 777 or by writing the Texas Animal Health Commission, 2105 Kramer Lane, P. O. Box 12966, Austin, Texas 78711-2966.
- D. **** VS Update:** No equine, bovine, porcine, caprine, ovine, or cervidae may enter Texas from a premise or area under quarantine for vesicular stomatitis. All equine, bovine, porcine, caprine, ovine, or cervidae from a vesicular stomatitis affected state must have a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within 14days of the date of entry into Texas.
- E. Entry Requirements for Cattle:
 - 1. Certificate on Veterinary Inspection within 30 days prior to entry, except for the following:
 - a. Female cattle, 18 months of age and over, delivered directly from the farm of origin to slaughter
 - b. Beef breed female cattle, 18 months of age and over, entering from other than a farm of origin may be moved to slaughter, or to an approved feedyard when accompanied by a Form VS 1-27on which each animal is individually identified. Brucellosis test data, when required, shall be written on the VS 1-27 Form which must include the test date and results.
 - c. Beef breed female cattle, 18 months of age and over, delivered directly to a USDA specificallyapproved livestock market by the owner or consigned there with an owner-shipper statement.
 - d. Beef breed steers, spayed heifers, beef breed female cattle, under 18 months of age, delivered to slaughter and accompanied by an owner-shipper statement or to a livestock market by the owner or consigned there with an owner-shipper statement; or
 - e. Beef breed steers, spayed heifers and beef breed female cattle, under 18 months of age, delivered to a feedlot for feeding for slaughter by the owner or consigned there with an owner-shipper statement.
 - 2. Official individual identification is required:
 - a. On all beef cattle over 18 months of age
 - b. On all dairy cattle
 - c. On all breeding bulls more than 12 months of age
 - d. On all cattle and bison used for shows, exhibitions, rodeo or recreational events
 - e. Types of official identification
 - 1) Official Alpha-numeric USDA metal eartags (bangs tags)
 - 2) Official Alpha-numeric USDA metal vaccination tags
 - 3) Official 840 or 900 RFID tags (900 series tags are no longer official if applied to theanimal after March 11, 2016)
 - 4) Official 840 flap or bangle tags
 - 5) Official individual animal breed registry tattoos or brands
 - 6) National Dairy Fair Tag or Dairy Herd Improvement Association Tag
 - 3. A permit is not required unless bulls are entering for exhibition and return to the state of origin perthe Trichomoniasis requirements section #6 below.
 - 4. Brucellosis testing / vaccination requirements
 - a. A negative brucellosis test is required within 30 days prior to entry or be from a class free state, area or certified free herd.
 - b. Brucellosis vaccination is required for female cattle between 4 to 12 months of age or be from aclass free state, area or certified free herd.
 - c. Brucellosis Designated Surveillance Area (DSA) (applies to all states)
 - 1) Cattle entering Texas directly from the DSA:
 - a) Breeding bulls and sexually intact females shall be tested for brucellosis 60 to 120 dayspost entry, except:
 - Cattle for immediate slaughter
 - Cattle for feeding for slaughter in a feedlot; and
 - b) Sexually intact females that have not calved must be held until tested negative 30 to 90days after calving.
 - c) Nonvaccinated sexually intact females between 4 and 12 months of age shall beofficially brucellosis vaccinated prior to entry, except:
 - Cattle for immediate slaughter

- Cattle for feeding for slaughter in a feedlot; and
- d) All cattle must also meet all applicable entry requirements.
- e) All breeding bulls and sexually intact females require an entry permit.
- 2) Cattle entering Texas from Idaho, Montana or Wyoming that do not currently reside in theDSA:
 - a) All breeding bulls and post parturient females shall enter Texas with one of the following statements on the Certificate of Veterinary Inspection:
 - The cattle represented on this certificate never resided in the DSA; or
 - The cattle represented on this certificate tested negative for brucellosis at least 60 days after leaving the DSA.
 - b) Sexually intact females that have not calved must enter with an entry permit and be held until tested negative 30 to 90 days after calving or with a statement on the certificate that the cattle never resided in the DSA.
 - c) All cattle must also meet all applicable entry requirements.
- 3) Cattle entering Texas from states other than Idaho, Montana and Wyoming that previously resided in the DSA:
 - a) Sexually intact females that have not calved must enter with an entry permit and be held until tested negative 30 to 90 days after calving or with a statement on the certificate that the cattle never resided in the DSA.
 - b) All cattle must also meet all applicable entry requirements.
- 5. Tuberculosis testing requirements
 - a. All sexually intact dairy cattle that are two months of age or older must be tested for tuberculosisper the rules c through e in this section, below.
 - b. All sexually intact dairy cattle that are less than two months of age require an entry permit to a designated facility and held until tested negative at two months of age. Dairy cattle delivered to an approved feedlot and accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection with an entry permit are exempt from testing unless from a restricted herd. Calves from a Modified AccreditedFree State must also originate from an accredited free herd or be from a herd that has been tested within 1 year prior to entry.
 - c. Cattle from Accredited Free States or Zones require the following:
 - 1) Beef cattle (including bison), no test is required
 - 2) All dairy cattle require a test within 60 days prior to entry except on sexually neutered cattleor cattle from an accredited free herd.
 - d. Cattle from Modified Accredited Advanced Free States or Zones require:
 - 1) A tuberculosis test within 60 days prior to entry or;
 - 2) Be from an accredited herd that has been tested within 1 year of date of movement or;
 - 3) The cattle or bison are moved directly to an approved slaughtering establishment or;
 - 4) The cattle or bison are sexually intact heifers moved to an approved feedlot (dairy cattle are required to be accompanied by a permit), or are steers or spayed heifers; are either officially identified or identified by premises of origin identification.
 - e. Cattle from Modified Accredited States or Zones require:
 - 1) A whole herd test conducted within 1 year prior from to date of movement and that the individual animals be identified and be individually tested within 60 days prior to entry or;
 - 2) Be from an accredited free herd that has been tested within 1 year date of movement or;
 - 3) The cattle or bison are moved directly to an approved slaughtering establishment or;
 - 4) The cattle or bison are sexually intact heifers moved to an approved feedlot (dairy cattle are required to be accompanied by a permit), or are steers or spayed heifers; are either officially identified or identified by premises of origin identification; and are tested negative within 60 days prior to entry.
 - f. All "M" branded steers, which are recognized as potential rodeo and/or roping stock and used foreither feeding or recreation purposes require:
 - 1) A permit prior to entry and;
 - 2) Be tested negative for tuberculosis within twelve months prior to entry.
- 6. Trichomoniasis Requirements:
 - a. A negative Trichomoniasis test is required within 60 days prior to entry on all breeding bulls twelve (12) months of age or older with an official Real Time Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) test.
 - b. Trichomoniasis samples pooled at the laboratory may qualify as the official test if no more thanfive total samples are pooled.

- 1) Exceptions for testing for bulls 12 months of age or older:
 - a) Bulls entering Texas for the purpose of participating in a fair, show, exhibition or rodeo may enter without a Trichomoniasis test as long as a permit is issued prior to entry. Thebulls must be isolated from female cattle and stay in the state for less than 60 days.
 - b) Bulls entering Texas directly to a feedyard that has executed a Trichomoniasis Certified Facility Agreement may enter without a Trichomoniasis test. Bulls must be accompaniedby a permit prior to entry.
 - c) Bulls entering Texas directly to a facility that tests the gain and feed conversions of cattle (bull test station) may enter without a Trichomoniasis test if moved directly to the facility and are isolated from females and accompanied by a permit issued prior to entry.
 - d) A Texas bull that is enrolled in an out-of-state facility for the purpose of testing gain andfeed conversions of cattle (bull test station) may enter without a Trichomoniasis test as long as the bull is moved directly to the Texas premises of origin. The certificate of veterinary inspection must state the bull was enrolled in a bull test station and was isolated from female cattle.
 - e) Bulls enrolled at an out-of-state Certified Semen Services certified artificial inseminationfacility (CSS facility) that isolates the bull from female cattle at all times may enter without a Trichomoniasis test as long as the bull is moved directly from the CSS facility into the state. The certificate of veterinary inspection shall state the bull was enrolled in a CSS facility.
 - f) Bulls originating from a herd that is enrolled in a Certified Trichomoniasis Free Herd Program or other certification program that is substantially similar may enter without aTrichomoniasis test.
 - g) The bull can move to a federally approved livestock market as long as accompanied by an ownershipper statement if coming straight from farm of origin.
 - If the bulls are moved from any other location other than farm of origin going toan approved livestock market, they may enter with a CVI and an entry permit.
- 2) The official identification number and age of bull shall be written on the certificate of veterinary inspection.
- 3) Any bull, that has had contact with a female subsequent to the initial test, must be retested within 60 days prior to entry.
- 4) Female cattle from a known Trichomoniasis herd or are exposed to a known Trichomoniasispositive bull are prohibited from entering Texas unless permitted to an approved slaughtering establishment.
- 5) All bison are exempt from meeting the above Trichomoniasis testing requirements.
 - III. International (Cattle moved into the state from foreign countries)
- A. Any livestock, poultry or ratites that are infected, exposed or quarantined in any manner for an infectious, contagious or communicable disease may not enter the state. Contact TAHC at 1-800-550-8242.
- B. Entry permits are required as noted in the following section and may be obtained by calling 512/719-0777(24 hours) or 1-800-550-8242, ext. 777 or by writing the Texas Animal Health Commission, 2105 Kramer Lane, P. O. Box 12966, Austin, Texas 78711-2966.
- C. Entry Requirements from Foreign Countries
 - 1. USDA Importation Certificate (VS 17-30) within 30 days prior to entry.
 - 2. Branding Requirements
 - a. Sexually intact cattle destined for an approved feedyard/pen must be "S" branded prior to orupon arrival at the approved feedyard/pen.
 - b. Spayed heifers shall be identified by branding prior to entry.
 - c. All cattle moved into Texas from Mexico shall be identified with an "M" brand prior to moving toa destination in Texas.
 - 3. Permit Requirement
 - a. Sexually intact cattle must obtain an entry permit if for other than direct to slaughter or approved feedyard/pens.
 - b. The permit number must be entered on the Importation Certificate (VS Form 17-30).
 - 4. Brucellosis Requirements
 - a. All sexually intact cattle from any foreign country or part thereof with no recognized comparable brucellosis status:
 - 1) Vaccination Requirement
 - a) Non-vaccinated sexually intact female cattle between 4 and 12 months of age enteringfor purposes other than immediate slaughter or feeding for slaughter in an approved

feedyard/pen shall be placed under quarantine on arrival and officially brucellosisvaccinated.

- b) The quarantine may be released after a negative test is conducted 30 days after theyhave had their first calf.
- 2) Testing Requirements for Bulls
 - a) Bulls entering for purposes other than immediate slaughter or feeding in an approved feedyard/pen shall be tested at the port of entry into Texas under the supervision of the port veterinarian, and placed under quarantine and retested 120 to 180 days after arrival.
 - b) The quarantine will be released following a negative brucellosis test.
- 3) Testing Requirements for Females
 - a) All sexually intact female cattle entering for purposes other than immediate slaughter or feeding for slaughter in an approved feedyard/pen shall be tested at the port of entry intoTexas under the supervision of the port veterinarian, and placed under quarantine on arrival and retested for brucellosis in no less than 120 days nor more than 180 days afterarrival for release of the quarantine however, if the sexually intact female cattle have nothad their first calf prior to the 120 to 180 day post entry test, the quarantine will not be released until a second negative test for brucellosis is conducted no sooner than 30 daysafter the animal has had its first calf and the second negative test has been confirmed.
- 4) Testing Requirements for Sexually Intact Cattle moving directly to an approved feedyard/pen.
 - a) All sexually intact cattle destined for feeding for slaughter in an approved feedyard/pen must be tested at the port of entry into Texas under the supervision of the port veterinarian. These cattle must be "S" branded prior to or upon arrival at the approved feedyard/pen, and may move to the approved feedyard/pen only in sealed trucks with aVS 1-27 permit issued by a representative of TAHC or USDA personnel.
- b. All other cattle from foreign countries, foreign states or zones within foreign countries with comparable brucellosis status, would enter by meeting the requirements for a state with similarstatus.
- 5. Tuberculosis Requirements
 - a. All sexually intact cattle, from any foreign country or part thereof with no recognized comparable tuberculosis status:
 - To be held for purposes other than for immediate slaughter or feeding for slaughter in an approved feedyard/pen, must be tested at the port of entry into Texas under the supervision of the port veterinarian, and shall be under quarantine on the first premise of destination in Texas pending a negative tuberculosis test no earlier than 120 days and no later than 180 days after arrival. The test will be performed by a veterinarian employed by the TAHC or APHIS/VS.
 - 2) When destined for feeding for slaughter in an approved feedyard/pen, cattle must be testedat the port of entry into Texas under the supervision of the port veterinarian; moved directlyto the approved feedyard/pen only in sealed trucks; accompanied with a VS 1-27 permit issued by TAHC or USDA personnel; and "S" branded prior to or upon arrival at the feedyard.
 - b. All other cattle from foreign countries, foreign states or zones within foreign countries with comparable tuberculosis status, would enter by meeting the requirements for a state with similarstatus.
 - c. Cattle originating from Mexico
 - 1) Regardless of reproductive status, test history, or Mexican state of origin, Holstein andHolstein cross cattle are prohibited from entering Texas.
 - 2) All sexually intact cattle shall meet the requirements provided for in this section above.
 - 3) Steers and spayed heifers from Mexico shall meet the federal importation requirements as provided in Title 9 of the Code of Federal Regulations, Part 93, Section 93.427, regarding importation of cattle from Mexico. In addition to the federal requirements, steers and spayedheifers must be moved under permit to an approved pasture or to an approved feedyard/pen.
 - 4) Cattle utilized as rodeo and/or roping stock shall meet the requirements set out in thissection and the applicable requirement below:
 - *a)* All sexually intact cattle shall be retested annually for tuberculosis at the owner's expense and the test records shall be maintained with the animal and available forreview, *or*

- b) All sexually neutered horned cattle imported from Mexico are recognized as potentialrodeo and/or roping stock and must:
 - Be tested for tuberculosis at the port of entry under the supervision of the USDA portveterinarian, and
 - Be moved by permit to a premise of destination and remain under Hold Order until permanently identified, and retested for tuberculosis between 60 and 120 days afterentry at owner's expense. The cattle may be allowed movement to and from events/activities in which commingling with other cattle will not occur and with specific permission by the TAHC until confirmation of the negative post entry retest for tuberculosis can be conducted, and
 - Be retested for tuberculosis annually at owner's expense and the test records shallbe maintained with the animal and available for review.
- 5) A copy of the certificate issued by an authorized inspector of the USDA, APHIS, for themovement of Mexico cattle into Texas, must accompany such animals to their final destination in Texas, or so long as they are moving through Texas.
- 6. Trichomoniasis Requirements

All breeding bulls entering from foreign country, shall enter on and be moved by an entry permit, to apremises of destination in Texas and shall be placed under Hold Order and officially tested for Trichomoniasis with not less than three official culture tests conducted not less than seven days apart, or an official Real Time Polymerase Chain Reaction (RT-PCR) test, within 30 days after entry into the state.

All bulls shall be isolated from female cattle at all times until tested negative for Trichomoniasis. The Hold Order shall not be released until all other post entry disease testing requirements have been completed.

All bulls tested for Trichomoniasis shall be officially identified at the time the initial test sample is collected. The Identification shall be recorded on the test documents.7. International (Cattle moved into the state from foreign countries)

Sheep Requirements

- I. <u>Intrastate (Sheep moved within the state</u> <u>of Texas)</u>All sheep originating in Texas and participating in :

Intrastate shows, fairs, and exhibitions (those functions that require Texas livestock, poultry and ratites of the same species to be housed and exhibited separate and apart from livestock, poultry and ratites fromout of state) are exempt from the certificate of veterinary inspection and testing requirements.
 - 1. All exhibition breeding sheep must have a scrapie identification eartag.
 - B. Interstate shows, fairs, and exhibitions (those functions that permit livestock and poultry from other statesto enter for show or exhibition and held in common facilities with Texas origin livestock and poultry of thesame species) must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary inspection.
 - 1. All out of state exhibition sheep must have a scrapie identification eartag.
 - 2. All exhibition breeding sheep must have a scrapie identification eartag.
 - 3. Breeding rams originating in Texas are exempt from the brucella ovis test.
- II. Interstate (Sheep moved into the state from other states)
 - A. Any livestock, poultry or ratites that are infected, exposed or quarantined in any manner for an infectious, contagious or communicable disease may not enter the state. Contact TAHC at 1-800-550-8242.

- B. Entry permits are required as noted in the following section and may be obtained by calling 512/719-0777(24 hours) or 1-800-550-8242, ext. 777 or by writing the Texas Animal Health Commission, 2105 KramerLane, P. O. Box 12966, Austin, Texas 78711-2966.
- C. <u>** VS Update:</u> No equine, bovine, porcine, caprine, ovine, or cervidae may enter Texas from a premise or area under quarantine for vesicular stomatitis. All equine, bovine, porcine, caprine, ovine, or cervidae from vesicular stomatitis affected state must have a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within 14 days of the date of entry into Texas.

- E. Entry Requirements for Domestic Sheep
 - 1. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection required within 30 days prior to entry.
 - 2. Scrapie Eradication Program eartag required prior to entry on all sheep.

 - 7. Animals originating from Inconsistent States (without an active scrapie surveillance and controlprogram) may enter the State of Texas only if:
 - b. Obtain an entry permit, and
 - c. Consigned directly to a terminal feedlot, or consigned directly to slaughter.
 - 8. Animals entering slaughter channels must be identified but the identification does not need to be ecorded on the accompanied certificate of veterinary inspection.

Goats Requirements

- I. Intrastate (Goats moved within the state of Texas)
 - A. All goats originating in Texas and participating in:
 - 1. Intrastate shows, fairs, and exhibitions (those functions that require Texas livestock, poultry and ratites of the same species to be housed and exhibited separate and apart from livestock, poultry andratites from out of state) are exempt from the certificate of veterinary inspection.
 - a. All exhibition breeding goats must have a scrapie identification eartag except registered goats with registration tattoo and accompanied by registration papers listing the scrapie premise ID number.
 - Interstate shows, fairs, and exhibitions (those functions that permit livestock and poultry from otherstates to enter for show or exhibition and held in common facilities with Texas origin livestock andpoultry of the same species) must be accompanied by a certificate of veterinary.
 - a. All exhibition goats entering the State must have a scrapie identification eartag except registered goats with a registration tattoo and accompanied by registration papers listing the scrapie premiseID number.
 - b. All exhibition breeding goats must have a scrapie identification eartag except registered goats with registration tattoo and accompanied by registration papers listing the scrapie premise ID number.
- II. Interstate (Goats moved into the state from other states)

 - a. Registered goats with a registration tattoo, accompanied by registration papers and a ScrapieEradication Program premise identification number do not require individual identification.
 - 3. An entry permit is not required for domestic goats, except if from an Inconsistent State.
 - 4. Animals originating from scrapie-affected flocks, scrapie-positive, suspect, exposed, and/or high risk animals, or sheep originating from Inconsistent States, may be granted entry into Texas on a case-by-case basis only after permission of the Executive Director of TAHC or the Designated Scrapie Epidemiologist.
 - 5. Animals originating from Inconsistent States (without an active scrapie surveillance and controlprogram) may enter the State of Texas only if:
 - a. Obtain an entry permit, and
 - b. Consigned directly to a terminal feedlot or consigned directly to slaughter.
 - 6. Animals entering slaughter channels must be identified but the identification does not need to be ecorded on the accompanied certificate of veterinary inspection.

Swine Requirements

- Intrastate (Swine moved within the state of Texas)
- A. All swine originating in Texas and participating in:
 - 1. Intrastate shows, fairs, and exhibitions (those functions that require Texas livestock, poultry and ratites of the same species to be housed and exhibited separate and apart from livestock, poultry andratites from out of state) are exempt from the certificate of veterinary inspection and testing requirements.

Ι.

- 2. Interstate shows, fairs, and exhibitions (those functions that permit livestock and poultry from other states to enter for show or exhibition and held in common facilities with Texas origin livestock and poultry of the same species) must meet the same requirements as for those swine entering from out-of-state.
 - a. Swine entered in terminal shows are exempt from brucellosis, leptospirosis and pseudorabiesrequirements.
- B. Requirements for Change of Ownership within Texas
 - 1. Brucellosis and Pseudorabies test required for all breeding swine 6 months of age and older within 30days prior to change of ownership
 - a. Swine from certified free herds are exempt from testing.
 - 2. Swine must be permanently identified with one of the following:
 - a. Official identification eartag approved by the commission or USDA;

- b. Ear notching, if the ear notching has been recorded in the book of record of a purebred registryassociation;
- c. Tattoos on the ear or inner flank, if the tattoos have been recorded in the book of record of aswine registry association; or
- d. Any other official identification device or method that is approved by the commission.
- **C.** Feral Swine Movement Requirements Within Texas:
 - 1. These requirements apply to anyone who traps feral swine and moves them from the premises orlocation where they were trapped or otherwise captured and moved alive.
 - 2. Acceptable Methods of Movement
 - a. The feral swine are moved directly from the premises where they were trapped to a recognized slaughter facility;
 - b. The feral swine are moved directly from the premises where they were trapped to an approvedholding facility;
 - c. The feral swine are moved directly from the premises where they were trapped to an authorizedhunting preserve;
 - d. The feral swine are moved from an approved holding facility to a recognized slaughter facility;
 - e. The feral swine are moved from an approved holding facility to an authorized hunting preserve;
 - f. The feral swine are moved from an approved holding facility to another approved holding facility;

or

- g. The swine that have been trapped and are being held for transportation to an authorized location, as provided by this subsection, may be held in an escape-proof cage on the vehicle or trailer that transported them from their original premise, or held within the transport trailer itself for up to seven (7) days.
- D. Exotic swine includes Russian Wild Boars, African Wild Pigs and Warthogs (among others)– see ExoticLivestock

Interstate (Swine moved into the state from other states)

- A. Any livestock, poultry or ratites that are infected, exposed or quarantined in any manner for an infectious, contagious or communicable disease may not enter the state. Contact TAHC at 1-800-550-8242.
- B. Entry permits are required as noted in the following section and may be obtained by calling 512/719-0777(24 hours) or 1-800-550-8242, ext. 777 or by writing the Texas Animal Health Commission, 2105 KramerLane, P. O. Box 12966, Austin, Texas 78711-2966.
- C. <u>** VS Update:</u> No equine, bovine, porcine, caprine, ovine, or cervidae may enter Texas from a premise or area under quarantine for vesicular stomatitis. All equine, bovine, porcine, caprine, ovine, or cervidae from vesicular stomatitis affected state must have a certificate of veterinary inspection issued within 14 days of the date of entry into Texas.
- D. Entry Requirements for Domestic Swine
 - e. Certificate of Veterinary Inspection required within 30 days prior to entry.
 - a. Required statements on CVI:
 - 1) Have not been fed garbage
 - 2) Have not been exposed to pseudorabies
 - 3) Have not been vaccinated for pseudorabies
 - 4) Have not originated from a premises known to be affected by Novel Swine Enteric Coronavirus Disease(s) (SECD), and have not been exposed to SECD within the last 30 days.
 - b. Exceptions to CVI and entry permit:
 - 1) Swine consigned directly to slaughter and transported by owner
 - 2) Swine consigned directly to slaughter by other than the owner and accompanied by an owner-shipper statement. Swine consigned to a specifically approved market for sale to slaughter and accompanied by an owner-shipper statement in lieu of a certificate of

veterinary inspection

- 3) Swine from a premise of origin having a validated and qualified herd and consigned to aspecifically approved market
- f. Swine must be permanently identified with one of the following:
- g. Official identification eartag approved by the commission or USDA;
- h. Ear notching, if the ear notching has been recorded in the book of record of a purebred registryassociation;
- i. Tattoos on the ear or inner flank, if the tattoos have been recorded in the book of record of aswine registry association; or
- j. Any other official identification device or method that is approved by the commission.
- k. An entry permit is not required for domestic swine.
- I. Breeding swine are all sexually intact swine, 6 months of age or older.
- m. A negative brucellosis test is required within 30 days prior to entry on breeding swine if not from abrucellosis validated herd or Validated Brucellosis Free state.
- n. A negative pseudorabies test is required within 30 days prior to entry on breeding swine if not from a pseudorabies qualified herd or Stage V State.
- O. Leptospirosis vaccination is required on breeding swine within 30 days prior to entry with vaccinecontaining the following strains: Canicola, Hardjo, Icterohaemorrhagiae, Grippotyphosa, Pomona.

Poultry Requirements

- I. Intrastate (Poultry moved within the state of Texas)
 - A. All poultry originating in Texas and participating in:
 - 1. Intrastate shows, fairs, and exhibitions (those functions that require Texas livestock, poultry and ratites of the same species to be housed and exhibited separate and apart from livestock, poultry andratites from out of state) are exempt from the certificate of veterinary inspection but the poultry must originate from flocks or hatcheries free of pullorum disease and fowl typhoid or have a negative pullorum-typhoid test within 30 days before exhibition.
 - 2. Interstate shows, fairs, and exhibitions (those functions that permit livestock and poultry from otherstates to enter for show or exhibition and held in common facilities with Texas origin livestock and poultry of the same species) are exempt from an entry permit, but must meet the same other requirements as for those species entering from out-of-state and be accompanied by a CVI.
- II. Interstate (Poultry moved into the state from other states)
 - A. Any livestock, poultry or ratites that are infected, exposed or quarantined in any manner for an infectious, contagious or communicable disease may not enter the state. Contact TAHC at 1-800-550-8242.
 - B. <u>Entry Requirements for Live Domestic Poultry from Highly Pathogenic Avian Influenza Affected</u> <u>States</u>
 - 1. Avian Influenza negative test results with 72 hours of entry by either of the following methods:
 - a. A minimum of 30 birds per flock are serologically negative to an ELISA or AGID test for Avian Influenza (individual tests are required if shipment is less than 30 birds.), or
 - b. A minimum of 10 birds (e.g., two pools of 5 birds per house) are tested negative on tracheal swabs to a RRT-PCR test (Individual test are required if shipment is less than 10 birds.).
 - 2. A certificate of Veterinary Inspection (CVI) listing the general description of the birds, test date,test results and name of testing laboratory. The CVI should include a statement that reads, "These birds have not originated from an area or a flock

where High Pathogenic Avian Influenza Avian Influenza is known to exist."

- 3. Specific permission must be granted by the Commission prior to entry. Request can be made by calling 1-800-550-8242, Ext. 77 or fax a request to the TAHC Permits Department with the A.I. test documents and CVI to 512-719-0729.
- 4. Exceptions to these requirements are baby poultry which have not been fed or watered if forma National Poultry Improvement Plan (NPIP) Avian Influenza clean or equivalent hatchery, and accompanied by NPIP Form 9-3 or Animal and Health Inspection Service (APHIS) Form 17-6, or have an approved "Commuter Poultry Flock Agreement" on file with the state of origin and theCommission.
- C. An owner-shipper statement may be used in lieu of a certificate of veterinary inspection in some instances.
 - 1. Poultry delivered to slaughter by the owner or consigned there and accompanied by an ownershipperstatement.
- D. Entry permits are required as noted in the following section and may be obtained by calling 512/719-0777(24 hours) or 1-800-550-8242, ext. 777 or by writing the Texas Animal Health Commission, 2105 KramerLane, P. O. Box 12966, Austin, Texas 78711-2966.
- E. Entry Requirements for Poultry
 - Certificate of Veterinary Inspection required within 30 days prior to entry.
 - a. The certificate should state that the poultry have been vaccinated only with USDA and TAHCapproved vaccines. (Contact TAHC for a list of approved vaccines.)
 - 1) No modified live virus chick embryo origin Laryngotracheitis (LT) vaccine and no modified livevirus mycoplasma gallisepticum (MG) attenuated vaccine may be used on poultry entering theState.
 - b. The certificate should state that the poultry have not originated from an area that has had activeLaryngotracheitis within the last 30 days.
 - 2. An entry permit is required within 15 days prior to entry. Exceptions to the permit:
 - a. Poultry delivered to a slaughter establishment (which maintains federal postmortem inspection) by the owner; or
 - b. Poultry delivered to a slaughter establishment and consigned there and accompanied by anowner-shipper statement indicating the plant of destination
 - 3. Live domestic poultry, except those entering for slaughter and processing at a slaughter facility ownedor operated by the owner of the poultry entering, may enter Texas only under the following circumstances:
 - a. Originate from a flock that is certified as Avian Influenza clean in accordance with the NationalPoultry Improvement Plan; or
 - b. Originate from an Avian Influenza negative flock that participates in an approved statesponsoredAvian Influenza monitoring program; or
 - c. Originate from a flock in which a minimum of 30 birds, 4 weeks of age or older, or the complete flock, if fewer than 30, are serologically negative to an Enzyme Linked Immunosorbent Assay (ELISA) or Agar Gel Immunodiffusion (AGID) test for Avian Influenza within 30 days of entry *or* a minimum of 10 birds (e.g. two pools of 5 birds per house) are tested negative on trachea swabs toa real-time reverse-transcriptase polymerase chain reaction (RRT-PCR) test within 30 days of entry *or* negative to other tests approved by the Commission.
 - d. Live domestic poultry from states affected with Avian Influenza may enter Texas for slaughter and processing only under the following circumstances: A minimum of 30 birds per flock are serologically negative to an ELISA or AGID test for Avian Influenza within 72 hours of entry, *or* a minimum of 10 birds (e.g., two pools of 5 birds per house) are tested negative on tracheal swabs to a RRT-PCR test within 72 hours of entry or negative to other tests approved by the TAHC, and specific written permission has been granted.
 - e. Live domestic poultry broilers from states affected with Infectious Laryngotracheitis and vaccinated with chick embryo vaccine may enter Texas for immediate slaughter and processingonly under the following conditions:
 - 1) The request for authorization must be in writing and shall include a proposed route toslaughter that would not pose a disease risk to Texas poultry.

- 2) The initial request must be approved by the Executive Director prior to entry.
- 3) All shipments qualifying for entry shall have an entry permit and documentation of the origin of the shipment.
- 4. A negative pullorum-typhoid test is required within 30 days prior to entry or poultry must originate from flocks that meet either the Texas Pullorum-Typhoid Program and/or the National Poultry ImprovementPlan (NPIP).
- 5. Baby poultry are exempt from these requirements if from a NPIP or equivalent hatchery and accompanied by a NPIP VS Form 9-3 or an APHIS Form 17-6; *or*, are covered by an approved "Commuter Poultry Flock Agreement" on file with the state of origin and the Texas Animal HealthCommission.
- F. Interstate Poultry Exhibition Requirements

- Each animal must be permanently ear marked in the left ear. Marks must be listed on entry blanks. ARBA Show Rules, Section 26 (B) Rabbits not legibly earmarked may be disqualified from the class. Legibility of the ear mark is at the discretion of the judge.
- 8. Exhibits will be fed, watered, and cared for by fair volunteers, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur. You must check with show official if you have your own feed.
- 9. Substitutes will be permitted when they are the same breed, sex, class, and variety. All substitutions must be made with secretary by 10:00PM on Wednesday, September 27. NO EXCEPTIONS.
- **10.** No person will be permitted to handle exhibits during judging without permission of show officials. Any person interfering with the judging will have his exhibits disqualified.
- **11.** No cash will be paid except on the standard breeds of the A.R.B.A. Ribbons will be awarded through 5th place.
- **12.** Animals showing symptoms of disease of any kind will not be allowed admittance to the show room.
