Animals without papers may not be shown.

Mandatory Ethics Certification – All exhibitors must have ethics certification to show at the Pasco County Fair. Certification trainings are listed at the Flo.rida State Fair website, https://floridastatefairag.com/ethics/workshop/. Any workshop listed on the site will work for certification. Pre-registration is required. The LAST workshop available for exhibitors showing at the Pasco County Fair is <u>January 20th</u>, <u>2025</u>

We will have a livestock inspector on site during check in from 6:30 am - 8:30 am

SHOW ORDER:

Youth Showmanship:

Junior Pee Wee Class - Youth 5 and under Pee Wee Class - Youth 5 years old to 7 years old Junior Class - Youth 8 years old to 10 years old Intermediate Class - Youth 11 years old to 13 years old Senior Class - Youth 14 years old to 19 years old

Judging will be based on the ADGA Showmanship Scorecard. All youth exhibitors will be required to be clean and neat and dressed in white or dark jeans or slacks with a solid white shirt with a white collar. Youth are encouraged to wear FFA or 4-H attire. No caps or hats. Closed-toed shoes or boots are required *no crocks*. Exhibitors not conforming to the dress code will not be allowed to enter the Show Ring. Exhibitors must show a dairy goat officially entered in the youth show.

Age for Showmanship is as of 9/1/24.





SHOWMANSHIP JUDGING:

- 1. Judging will be based on the ADGA Showmanship Scorecard
- 2. Ability to show a Dairy Goat
- 3. Grooming and cleanliness of a goat
- 4. Ability to answer any questions asked by the judge
- 5. Knowledge of parts of the goat
- 6. Neatness and appropriate attire in the show ring
- 7. Exhibitors must adhere to the attire guidelines

AWARDS FOR YOUTH SHOWMANSHIP – 1st Place will receive a belt buckle.

All entries in Junior Pee Wee Showmanship will receive a prize.

Entry Rules and Regulations

- 1. <u>Entry Forms:</u> ENTRIES WITH FEES MUST BE SUBMITTED VIA SHOWORKS <u>www.pascocountyfair.com</u> BY MIDNIGHT OF FEBRUARY 2, 2025. NO ENTRIES WILL BE ACCEPTED AFTER FEBRUARY 2, 2025. ENTRIES MUST BE SUBMITTED ON SHOWORKS AND WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED AS HAND DELIVERY OR DROP OFFS AT THE FAIR OFFICE.
- 2. Entry Fees: There will be a \$10.00 (non-refundable) exhibitor fee PER EXHIBITOR and a \$8.00 (non-refundable) registration fee PER ANIMAL to be submitted with entries. Skilathon is \$0 entry fee. Make all checks out to the Pasco County Fair Youth Dairy Goat Show if you cannot pay online and bring to check in. ONE EXHIBITOR PASS WILL BE PROVIDED PER EXHIBITOR. We encourage all families of Dairy Goat exhibitors to purchase a family pass for the Pasco County Fair. This pass will allow all "immediate" members of the family to enter the fair on a daily basis throughout the length of the fair. No passes will be sold in the month of February.
- **3.** Eligibility: To be eligible to show in the 2025 Pasco County Fair, youth must be in grades K-12 and either enrolled in Pasco County Public or Private Schools, homeschooled in Pasco County and a member of Pasco County 4-H or FFA (see specie rules for specific age requirements). Exhibitor must have a grade point average of 2.0 or better. If the exhibitor has been suspended from school, the exhibitor will be suspended from showing at the fair. 5 and under youth must reside in Pasco County.
- 4. Record Books: Record books will be required of the exhibitors and are available digitally on the Pasco County Fair website. Record books will be turned in on February 2, 2025. Graded record books will be returned to exhibitors. Record books for the Pasco County Fair Dairy Goat Show are MANDATORY! If you have failed to turn in a COMPLETED record book on due date, it will result in dismissal from the show.
- **5. Skilathon:** All youth entered in the show can participate in the Skilathon. \$0 entry fee. To be done during check in: 7:30 8:30 am day of show. When you check in your goat(s), you will be told where to go for the Skilathon.
- **6.** <u>Fitting and Grooming:</u> All animals must be fitted and groomed prior to their arrival of the show.
- 7. <u>Substitutions:</u> All entries must have been owned or leased and cared for by the youth by the entry date. Substitutions can be made on the day of show by exhibitors entered by 2/2/25.

- **8.** <u>Animals without papers will not be shown</u>. The official registration certificate is required for all animals over 6 months of age or older. A Stamped Duplicate from ADGA is permissible for animals under 6 months of age.
- **9.** Animals must be naturally polled, dehorned, or dis-budded.
- **10.**Each exhibitor must furnish his/her own pen, care, feed and supplies for your animal. You must clean up your area after release from the show.
- 11. Exhibitors must maintain proper conduct while exhibiting and showing their animals and while on Fair Grounds Property. Observed infractions will be dealt with by the committee.
- **12.** Tampering with animals is prohibited.
- 13. Each exhibitor must assume responsibility and liability in the event of loss, death or injury to his/her animal. The Youth Dairy Goat Show Committee and The Pasco County Fair Association are not responsible for the health and safety of any animal entered or exhibited.

HEALTH RULES:

- Health papers are required. All goats consigned for public exhibition in Florida must be accompanied by official certificates of veterinary inspection dated not more than 90 days prior, certifying animals to be free from symptoms of contagious or infectious diseases.
- Goats imported into Florida must have an OCVI dated not more than 30 days prior. Dairy goats originating from Florida (not imported) are exempt from TB/Brucellosis testing requirements.
- All imported dairy goats 6 months of age or older must originate from a certified/ accredited herd (with appropriate documentation), or have verifiable, documented negative testing results recorded on the OCVI.
- All animals must be free from clinical symptoms of caseous lymphadenitis. Animals showing clinical symptoms of this disease will not be allowed to enter the area of activity or to become associated with animals entered by other exhibitors. With reference to CL, clinical symptoms is the term used to define enlargements of the lymph nodes, whether draining or not. Evidence of incised lymph nodes will be interpreted as prima facia evidence of CL in the animal under scrutiny.
- All animals must be free of all contagious diseases.
- No animals are to leave the trailer until they are checked by the Ag Health Inspector.



Pasco County Fair Association Herdsman Respect Policy

The Dairy Goat Committee will treat exhibitors, parents, fellow volunteers and members of the public with respect and will expect the same in return.

The Dairy Goat Committee will not conduct business with those who use obscenities or otherwise speak in a demanding, loud, insulting or threatening manner.
