4-H is the youth development program of Washington State University Extension, and is managed jointly by the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Washington's land grant university (WSU), and Pierce County government. 4-H is everywhere - in cities, suburbs, small towns, and rural communities. 4-H is the largest youth development organization in the nation. The United States has more than five million members and 600,000 leaders. Around the world, 4-H type clubs exist in at least 82 countries. 4-H serves a broad clientele, with expanded program focus using a variety of delivery methods that incorporate its theme of learn by doing.

4-H exhibits are judged by the Danish System. Each entry is judged on its own merit taking into consideration the age of the exhibitor, the degree of difficulty of the project, and the number of years in the project. All entries receive a ribbon unless the exhibit was disqualified.

All animals must be entered in 4Honline prior to entering in Fair entry. Other entries can be made in 4-H in Action, Bowls, Educational Displays (Posters), and Judging.

- All applicable Fair rules are in effect for this department. Failure to fulfill any exhibitor expectations may cause the loss of all premiums, ribbons and awards.
- All animals will be checked by Fair veterinarian before placing in cages. Cats must have been owned or in the exhibitor's care prior to June
  1, 2021. Exhibitors must be enrolled in the cat project.
- Limit two (2) cats per member.
- Members must enter Fitting & Showmanship, Type, and Herds, , except for Cloverbuds.
- Cats must be in a harness at all times and on a leash when not caged.
- A basic cage (22"DX22"HX46"L) is provided. Exhibitors are required to provide a 22"X45" cage floor (pegboard is recommended), zip ties to secure top and 2 clips to secure doors (small carabiner style work well.) Cages must be covered on sides back and top and skirting for the cage. Cages may be decorated, but cats must be in full view at all times. No coverings allowed draped over cages hiding cats. Do not use material a cat may destroy. Please see "criteria for cage decorations" on page 27 of the Unit 1 Cat Project Book.
- It is the responsibility of each exhibitor to care for their project, checking in every 4 hours with the member on Herdsmanship.
- Cats are to be caged by 9:45 a.m. daily. Building open to the public from 10 a.m.-9 p.m. Thursday-Saturday and 10 a.m.-6 p.m. Sunday. Cats must be removed from building at closing.
- Exhibitors must dress tastefully at all times. No unhemmed shorts; spaghetti strap, low cut or crop tops or flip flops when on Herdsmanship. No "heelies" or other wheeled shoes are allowed at any time. NO EATING OR DRINKING IN THE BARN.
- All cats must be vaccinated against rables. The 4-H rables Certificate must be signed by a veterinarian and presented as proof of
  vaccination. All cats must be vaccinated against distemper, feline viral Rhinotracheitis and Calici virus. Proof of vaccination required. Cats
  must be free of external skin disease, parasites, and any obvious symptoms of infectious diseases.
- No visibly pregnant or lactating cats are allowed.
- No kittens under 16 weeks of age are allowed.
- Exhibitor is responsible for providing their own cat food and litter.
- Other entries can be made in 4-H in Action, Bowls, Educational Displays (Posters), and Judging.
- Cloverbuds may bring one cat and must enter fitting and showing, type and Herdsmanship.

### HERDSMANSHIP

Herdsmanship is required to all exhibitors who bring animals to the Fair. Failure to complete assigned Herdsmanship shifts, or make up missed shifts, will result in an incomplete show, and could result in forfeiture of awards. This is a contest to encourage better care and display of projects as well as teamwork within the county. Judging of Herdsmanship will be done one or more times daily during exhibit hours. Each exhibitor will serve one or more Herdsmanship shifts per day. The number & length of shifts depends on the number of exhibitors. A blue, Red, or White ribbon will be awarded according to the Danish system of judging on the last day of Fair.

### 4-H CAT ALUMNI OPEN CLASS SHOW DEPARTMENT

- 1. This division is designed to encourage the continued involvement of 4-H Alumni within the department as well as to allow 4-H Leadership the opportunity to be involved in judging situations similar to their 4-H members.
- 2. Class is open to all Pierce County Cat Project enrolled Cat Leaders, Parents of enrolled Pierce County 4-H Cat members, Alumni of the Pierce County 4-H Cat Project over 18 years of age.
- 3. Cats must go through Vet Check and are required to comply with all 4-H Cat Project Vaccination requirements.
- 4. Adults must sign and comply with the 4-H Barn Rules and 4-H dress code.
- 5. Entries will be limited to space available. Should entry exceed space limitations, all entries will be entered in a draw.
- 6. Entries are required to be benched the 4 days of Fair. Alumni Cats may be benched with their affiliated clubs, signage will clearly indicate that entry is an Alumni Cat.
- 7. Alumni entrants will participate in Herdsmanship and may do so while supervising 4-H members.
- 8. Alumni Cats must be entered in Fitting and Showmanship and one type class. Alumni classes will immediately follow the 4-H equivalent class.
- 9. Cats used by adults in the Alumni Class may only be used by the adult and cannot be entered in any 4-H Member class.
- 10. Alumni may not enter 4-H Cat Department Photography & Art, Cat Bowl or Judging Contest.
- 11. Alumni Open Class will follow same class, lot and premium points as the 4-H Youth classes.

#### All animals must be entered in 4Honline prior to entering in Fair entry. RULES FOR ENTERING CLASSES

- 1. Exhibitors must follow Pierce County Fair and Dog Project Rules.
- Exhibitors must meet all established criteria as determined by the Pierce County Dog Leaders Council prior to entry at the Pierce County Fair.
- 3. Only first year members with first year dogs may enter Sub-Novice A class.
- 4. Any first-year member may enter any of the classes for which the member and his/her dog are qualified. A new dog may be entered in any class in which it is qualified.
- 5. If a member receives a blue ribbon in obedience at State Fair with a given dog, they are required to enter another class on the same tier or move to the next higher class. If they have received 2 blue ribbons at State Fair on the same tier, they are required to move to the next higher class.
- 6. Any dog may be used as a second dog by any exhibitor for brace only. However, a dog may be entered in only one brace class. Extra brace dogs, not entered in other classes, will only be benched on the designated brace day. After entry date, the Superintendent may allow benching for all show days should space allow. Brace dogs may be entered at the obedience level of the lowest dog.
- 7. Each dog must be clean and well groomed.
- 8. If space allows 2nd year (+) 4--H members may bring two obedience dogs, which may be entered in the same class or different classes. Anyone can bring a second dog for brace. No extra dogs may be brought in for team. A 4-H member sharing a dog with another 4-H member is not eligible to bring a second dog.
- 9. Exhibitors must present approved Pierce County Dog Project Health Form as part of vet check. Form must provide annual certification that the dog is current on all vaccinations and be signed by an accredited veterinarian. Rabies vaccine must have been administered by an accredited veterinarian. Tags are not sufficient proof. Every dog must be vet checked by the Fair vet.
- 10. In compliance with General Fair Rules, the Superintendent will not hold up a class because an exhibitor is exhibiting in another department.
- 11. Individuals who wish to compete in a group must be pre-entered. Groups will be completed by 6 p.m. on the Friday of Fair. Members should enter at the highest level their dog qualifies for. Groups will be formed by the superintendent. All members of a group must be of the same age level. If possible, the group dogs will be at the same obedience level. If there is not enough members to form a group at the higher obedience level a member may be asked to complete a group at a lower obedience level. Braces and groups may be at the level of the lowest dog.
- 12. A Sub-Novice, Beginner Novice, or Pre- Novice dog may be entered in only one obedience class. Dogs entered in Novice classes and above may be entered in two obedience classes only. Brace and group entries are not counted toward the total.
- 13. Group (Team) and Brace is an activity that may occur at State Fair but a qualifying score in Group and/or Brace at County Fair does not qualify an individual for State Fair.
- 14. Only first year members with first year dogs may enter the Introduction Obedience class. An Introduction Obedience dog may only be entered in one obedience class.
- 15. Agility
  - Agility classes entered at county qualifying trials must be approved by the Pierce County Agility instructors.
  - All dogs entered in Agility must also be entered in an obedience class at the County Fair.
  - Agility dogs may enter two consecutive agility classes in elementary and above.
  - Agility dogs must enter the State Fair Agility Trial in the highest class qualified in at a county qualifying trial.
  - In order for pre-fair agility trial scores to count towards state qualification, the dog must also be entered in the same agility class at County Fair.
  - In order for agility dogs to qualify for the State Fair agility trial, members must have also qualified in showmanship.
  - Any member who has taken a blue ribbon in agility at State Fair with a given dog must move up to the next higher class.
  - For additional rules and descriptions, refer to the Pierce County Dog Leaders' Guidelines.
- 16. Herdsmanship is required of all exhibitors who bring animals to the fair.

- Each exhibitor is required to submit an educational poster on his/her animal which will be displayed on the wall next to or in back of Pet(s).
- ALL Pets will be required to be on display at fair from open until close everyday of fair. Exhibitors may take home their Pet(s) at
  night, if needed. Please let the Superintendent know. Electricity will be provided during the day but NOT overnight.
- Each exhibitor is responsible for cleaning, feeding and watering their animals each morning by 9 am. Additional watering during the day will be attended while on Herdsmanship. Exhibitors not caring for or making arrangements for this care will forfeit ALL premium points and be asked to remove the animals from the barn.
- Exhibitors are expected to have their cages and the barn clean and ready for the public by 9:30 am each day.
- All exhibitors must own their Pet prior to July 1st in order to show at fair.
- Exhibitors are required to provide a display case/carrier, waterer AND food for each Pet.
- Arts & crafts, record books, and projects related to your project must be submitted during check-in. These items must have been made during the current 4-H year
- Entries will be initially limited to 3 animals per exhibitor in Fair Entry.
- A parent or other responsible adult is to be on the fairgrounds each day in the event a problem arises. #### Herdsmanship:

- Per the Fair Guidelines, all those exhibiting animals must participate in that project's Herdsmanship requirements.
- Each exhibitor will be required to participate in Herdsmanship for a minimum of 1 hour per day. (Additional number of hours will be determined by the number of exhibitors.) Failure to participate will result in the loss of Premiums.
- Herdsmanship schedule will be available at the barn set-up. Those who participate in the barn set-up will have first opportunity to sign-up for Herdsmanship times, as soon as setup has been completed. Those who do not attend will be able to sign up for Herdsmanship Wednesday during vet check.
- A minimum of 2 exhibitors will be required to be on duty during Herdsmanship times. These times are 9:00 am to 10:00 pm each day except Sunday which is 9:00 am to 6:00 pm. If your Herdsmanship time falls during a time in which you are participating in another rabbit barn activity, you must make arrangements with the Superintendent and find a replacement. It is then your responsibility to make up the lost time.
- Club or Project leader will ensure that all members participate in Herdsmanship and that an adult (or teen leader) is in the barn during their members Herdsmanship times.
- At the beginning of each shift the exhibitor will check in with the superintendent/assistant. If you are unable to make your shift, you are responsible to find a replacement AND make up the time.
- Proper attire (pants and long sleeve shirt) is to be worn during Herdsmanship. Aprons or Pins must also be worn identifying you as the "Herdsman on Duty". Long sleeves are required to remove your rabbit from its cage. NO ONE is to remove anyone else's animal from its cage. Exception to this rule is with permission from the Superintendent.
- A Herdsmanship award may be awarded to the outstanding herdsman in each level (Junior, Intermediate & Senior). This will be based on participation, cooperation, enthusiasm and hard work. This is awarded solely on the discretion of the superintendent and/or appointed judge.

#### Fitting & Showmanship:

- The definition of showman in the Merriam-Webster dictionary is a person having a special skill for presenting something in a
  dramatic way. Showmanship is the skill or ability of a showman, so when we think about understanding the basics of showmanship
  when showing animals, we must think about the person doing the showing.
- Showmanship is about the person handling the animal; presenting and showing the animal to the best of a person's ability. It is
  about making sure the showman is looking at the judge at all times. Showmanship is really about how hard a person has worked,
  prepared and presents their animal to the judge.
- Judges may be looking at your animals to evaluation them, but in showmanship they are evaluating the showman and how he or she is working with their animal and handling themselves. Showmanship is about teamwork, an important life skill, where the youth and animal learn to work together and demonstrate their hard work for a judge.

Here are some important things to know about showmanship:

Parts of the animal. During showmanship, many judges will ask participants different body parts. A showman should know their animal and where the different body parts are. Younger youth should learn the basics, but older youth should know all of the parts. Before a show, practice identifying all the body parts.

Position of the animal. The judge wants to see the animal, so during showmanship the judge should see you and the animal at all times. Each species has different ways of being presented for the judge, so know how to position your species for the show. Most of the time, you want to keep the animal between you and the judge.

Keep an eye on the judge. One of the most important things in showmanship is knowing where the judge is and always keeping an eye on them. If the judge signals you to do something or tells you to stop, it is important to be paying attention.

List your entries on your form from top to bottom in order of preference, beginning with the fitting & showmanship animal. Stall assignments are final after Saturday barn cleaning and decorating.
- Horns allowed on Pack, Meat and Fleece Goats only. Horn tips or scurs exceeding 1 inch in length must be covered prior to vet check
  with balls or other form of cushioned bumper and must remain on for the duration of the fair. Cushioning must be approved by the
  superintendent. No other horned animals allowed.
- No slip, choke or show collars allowed to remain on unattended or tethered animals.
- When working with or around animals, exhibitors must wear close-toed shoes. Sandals are not allowed.
- No rowdy or rough behavior around barn area.
- Herdsmanship is required of all exhibitors, and Adult on Duty shifts of exhibitor parents/guardians. Each must sign up for their slots at the
  exhibitor meeting on Wednesday at 8:30 p.m. The barn must be covered from 10am to 9pm Thursday through Saturday, and 10am to
  6pm on Sunday. The number of slots each exhibitor and adult must fulfill is determined by the number of exhibitors.
- Herdsmanship will be judged on an individual basis, not by clubs. 4-H members are expected to perform times of Herdsmanship without leader or parent direction. No parents or non-member siblings in stalls.
- All animals must be milked, cared for and cleaned by the exhibitors only each day. Exhibitors may receive help from other 4-H members.
- Each exhibitor must pitch out his/her stalls by 9 a.m. daily.
- If a 4-H member does not plan to show after making an entry, please notify superintendent before animals are due to arrive on Wednesday.
- All exhibitors must complete a Fitting and Showmanship class in order to receive premiums and/or ribbons in each Goat Department entered.
- All animals used for Fitting and Showmanship must also be entered in the Type class competition in the 4-H show. Exhibitors may enter additional animals in Type class lots as space allows.
- Any schedule changes will be announced at the mandatory exhibitor meeting Wednesday evening.
- All exhibitors must attend the fair each day.

4. Alumni dairy animals must be properly entered in Showmanship and Type classes.

5. Alumni animal entries are dependent on space availability after member entries have been turned in; at the discretion of the superintendent. Each Alumni exhibitor will be limited to two animal entries. Should entry exceed space limitations, all entries will be entered in a draw.

6. Alumni dairy exhibits must go through vet check, Wednesday August 11, 2021 between 4 p.m. and 8 p.m.

7. All Dairy Department Alumni Exhibitors must sign and comply with all Pierce County Fair Rules, including sportsmanship. Those Alumni who wish to enter and bring their own animals are also required to adhere to Pierce County Fair rules regarding daily animal care and Herdsmanship. Alumni Exhibitors who will be 'borrowing' a Dairy animal will not participate in daily animal care, but must participate in regularly scheduled Herdsmanship on the day of the show.

8. Dairy animals entered by Alumni for their use in the Alumni Class, may only be used by the adult in the Alumni Classes, and CAN NOT be used in any 4-H or FFA Member class. Only Dairy animals owned by 4H and FFA members, entered as regular 4H and FFA exhibits, can be 'borrowed' by Alumni members who lack the availability of Dairy animals.

9. Alumni Open Class will follow the same class and lots as the 4-H Youth classes, and 4H show rules.

10. There will be no premiums given for this class this year, ribbons will be awarded.

- 1. Exhibitors must have met all horse department requirements in order to show a horse at the Pierce County Fair:
- a. Be enrolled by April 30th, 10pm, through 4HOnline.
- b. Have-your project horse(s) entered into the animal/livestock module of 4HOnline by April 30<sup>th</sup> 10pm.
- c. Have completed an Educational Poster and completed one approved educational activity.
- d. Have qualified in Fitting & Show and a divisional class at a qualifying show
- 2. All horse department entries must be done through FairEntry.com no later than the July Leader's Meeting; Wednesday, July 21, 2021.
- All Classes will be judged according to the Rules & Specifications of the PIERCE COUNTY 4-H HORSE DEPT HANDBOOK and HORSE CONTEST GUIDE - PNW 574 & HARNESS DRIVING: MANUAL AND RULES FOR WASHINGTON STATE: PUBLICATION EM 4881.
- 4. Upon arrival, follow the directions of horse department personnel. Go to vet check area immediately after unloading, but do not go to stalls until given a passing health check tag by department head or health officer. If an animal has a communicable disease, you will be asked to leave. This procedure must be complied with. All exhibits must be in place according to the listed schedules.
- 5. NO STALLIONS ARE PERMITTED.
- 6. The Pierce County Fair Management, 4-H Staff or the Horse Department Superintendent reserve the right to remove any animal deemed dangerous.
- 7. Please help us and others to have a positive Fair experience by following all general rules of the Fair.
- 8. Each exhibitor is responsible for fitting their own animal. A parent or junior leader should not do this for the exhibitor with the exception of holding the animal.
- 9. NOTE: Arena assignments and times are subject to change.
- A Grand and Reserve Grand Champion will be selected in Junior, Intermediate and Senior division in all Performance classes/Western Games classes/Driving classes if such standards are met. Medals will be awarded in medals classes if such standards are met. Age Classifications: The Pierce County Fair recognizes 4-H age classifications as defined in EM0758E.

#### FITTING & SHOWMANSHIP-HORSE AND PONY

All exhibitors must participate in Fitting & Showmanship and may participate in any other animal classes (medal classes included) for which they have qualified.

Points Allowed: Blue 50; Red 40; White 30

#### **DIVISION CLASSES**

The number of classes an exhibitor may show in may be limited because of time constraints. Everyone will be allowed a min. of 4 division classes.

### Horse Herdsmanship Contest

- 1. Herdsmanship is required of all exhibitors who bring exhibits to the Fair.
- 2. The purpose of the Herdsmanship contest is to encourage exhibitors to care for their animals, stalls and equipment properly and to keep the stalls and animals clean and attractive at all times.
- 3. All exhibitors will be automatically entered.
- 4. All work is to be performed by 4-H members.
- 5. Herdsmanship will be the responsibility of the exhibitor commencing at vet check.
- 6. The tack/ dressing room may be judged only from the public's point of view. The judge may not step into the room.
- 7. Herdsmanship will not be judged before 10 a.m. or after 9 p.m. It will be necessary to have at least one person on duty for barn safety and security during these times.
- 8. If Herdsmanship judging is not completed in the allotted amount of time, no points for that day shall be awarded to any of the clubs.
- Ribbons for Herdsmanship will be awarded at the conclusion of the Fair. Blue, Red, or white ribbons will be given to the members of each club based on the total number of points each club has accrued at Fair's end. An overall Grand and Reserve Grand Champion also will be awarded.
   Lack of an education poster will result in a daily deduction of 10 points.

Note: Vehicles entering the Pierce County Fairgrounds prior to 5:30 p.m. on Fair Sunday will be charged parking and occupants must have admission tickets/passes or they will be charged admission.
