* **Format of meetings may be altered due to federal, state & county policies & regulations.**
* **In the event that an exhibitor has a reasonable excuse for missing a meeting; a required make-up assignment will be given along with a deadline to submit. Exhibitors must attend 2/3 of meetings to be eligible to sell bushes.**

FAIR ARRIVAL: Tuesday, **March 19, 2024**, from 2:00-6:00pm

JUDGING: Thursday, **March 21, 2024**, Bushes will be judged as a set.

SALE: Friday, **March 29, 2024** 5-8pm, Silent Auction
* Best of Show winner will have the option to Live Auction their bushes

REMOVAL: Monday, **April 1, 2024**, 3-6 PM for project books and bushes not sold.

ENTRY FEE: \$30 (includes cost of FOUR blueberry bushes, 2 of each variety)

PROJECT SUMMARY: Due at time of Check-in (**Mar 19**, 2-6:00pm). Project Summary will be disbursed with blueberry bushes at first mandatory meeting **Oct 9, 2023**.

DISPLAY AND POT DECORATING CONTEST: Bushes will be displayed during the fair in an area between the fair entrance and the Tilton Arena. This is an outdoors area so keep this in consideration when you decorate your pots for display. Exhibitors are encouraged to decorate their pots as it helps draw attention to the bushes. Decorated pots will be judged with a winner being selected in each age division: Junior, Intermediate, and Senior. The winners will be awarded a prize. ****Cloverbuds are encouraged to decorate their pots but will not be judged. ****

RULES & REGULATIONS

1. All entries and fees must be turned in by 5:00pm to the Putnam County Agricultural Center on **Sept. 19, 2023**. **A minimum of 6 youth will be necessary to justify the time and resources to hold this contest.** **Contest is open to a maximum of 30 participants.**
2. **Eligibility:** Open to all Putnam County youth ages 8-18. Additionally, any club, chapter or class may enter group owned blueberry bushes. All entry forms must be signed & approved by parent/guardian, teacher, or 4-H leader/ FFA advisor. **If space is available after September 8, 2023 project will open to youth ages 5-7 as well.**
3. Project Summaries are required for all age divisions and must be turned in with blueberry bush entries at fair check-in. If project summaries are not complete and submitted on time, participants will not receive any awards or premium money & forfeit the option to sell bushes. Project summaries must be in the student's own handwriting. Project Summaries will be judged and awards will be given to the Best one in each age division: Junior, Intermediate, and Senior. Cloverbuds do not compete but will receive a ribbon for completion of book.

4. All exhibitors are expected to conduct themselves at all times in a manner that will contribute to the best interest of the fairs Shows & Sale. This includes your conduct at school. Exhibitors are expected to dress in a manner that aligns with a school dress code as they will be representing the fair and themselves during this project. The Fair Authority reserves the right to disqualify any exhibitor who has 3 or more referrals in the current school year, is conducting themselves in a disrespectful or unacceptable manner, or any exhibitor who has been arrested.
5. **White ribbon plants** will not be allowed to be silent auctioned. An exhibitor may choose to not auction blueberry bushes but that must be made clear at check-in. Details will be covered at the first mandatory meeting.
6. All exhibitors are required to attend mandatory meetings. Meetings will address care, maintenance of plants, repotting, and all necessary knowledge and skills to be successful in this project. Meetings are estimated to last 1-1.5 hours depending on activities at the meeting. Plants will be dispersed following the first mandatory meeting. Orders not picked up on the day of meeting shall be forfeited. Any conflicts with dates need to be addressed as soon as possible with project coordinators/educational advisors. Exhibitors must attend 2/3 mandatory meetings to be eligible to sell bushes. If an exhibitor is unable to make a meeting, they will be required to complete a make-up assignments provided there is a reasonable excuse for missing the meeting. *Format of meetings may be altered due to federal, state & county policies and regulations.
7. Exhibitors will be issued four bushes, two of each variety. They will choose the best of each variety they are issued to be exhibited.
8. Participants will be expected to purchase a 3-5 gallon pot per plant and growing medium unless donations can be found.
9. **We are not responsible for failure of plant(s).**

Sale: The price placed on the bidding sheet is for both bushes exhibited. Any add-ons should be paid directly to the exhibitor and not placed on the silent auction bidding sheets. The Fair Office will mail out checks for the bushes after the close of the fair.

School, Club, or Chapter Projects: Any projects being shown as a school, class, club, or chapter entry must have the teacher, leader, or advisor's written permission to sell the bushes. There will be a page to add to the project summary for this. This is only for those projects that are sponsored by a school, class, club, or chapter and does not apply to those with individual projects.

Missed Meeting: Exhibitors are expected to make every effort to attend all mandatory meetings. Any exhibitor that misses a mandatory meeting will be given a required make-up assignment along with a deadline to have it completed by. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to contact the Ag Office through the Berry Project Remind App if they miss a meeting with a reasonable excuse. Make-up assignments could range from taking pictures and writing a summary to demonstrate completion of task covered at meeting, creating poster, or creating a commercial to sell bushes but will be at the discretion of the Ag Office to assign. As a reminder exhibitors should make every effort to attend all Mandatory Meetings and the field trip. Exhibitors must attend a minimum of 2/3 meetings to be eligible to sell their bushes.

AWARDS

Quality Award –Each set of bushes owned by Junior, Intermediate, or Senior will be judged as a set on their own merit with a single quality award being given to each set.

*Blue Award: blue ribbon and \$3.00 premium

*Red Award: red ribbon and \$2.00 premium

*White Award: white ribbon and \$1.00 premium

****Cloverbud entries (ages 5-7) are for exhibit only.** They will not be considered for competition. However, special recognition will be given to cloverbud exhibitors, and they may participate in the Silent Auction Sale.

Best of Division- One Best of Division will be selected for each age division Junior, Intermediate, and Senior from the blue ribbon recipients. **(Age is determined as of September 1, 2023.**

***Best Junior** (Exhibitor ages 8-10): \$10.00 premium

***Best Intermediate** (Exhibitor ages 11-13): \$10.00 premium

***Best Senior** (Exhibitor ages 14-18): \$10.00 premium

Best of Show- One Best of Show winner will be chosen from the Best of Division winners.

*\$25 premium and special award

*option to sell bushes in the live auction

Awards Pick up- Any bushes not sold in the Silent Auction, all project summaries, ribbons, and premium money should be picked up **Monday, April 1st 3-6PM.** Money from bushes sold will be mailed by the Fair Office after the close of the fair.
