## RULES AND REGULATIONS:

(See Additional Rules \& Regulations that apply to this area under the Main Section of the Home Division)

1. Entries MUST be labeled with entrant's name, address and phone number, and have a copy of the recipe attached.
2. Any entry made from a mix will be placed in CLASS 8.
3. All items must adhere to the required amounts or designated sizes and entered on non-returnable tray or plate. Items will not be returned to the exhibitor.
4. Premium money will be paid in cash and may be picked up at the times and location listed above. No premium money will be paid without having completed all information on the registration form and all requirements followed.
5. Each exhibit will be labeled with a claim check provided by the Home Division when entered. Please keep your copy of the claim check and present it when you claim your exhibit. If someone else is picking up your exhibits, they must present the claim check(s).
6. The Modified Danish System is used in judging.
7. Entries may receive a blue, red, white, or participant ribbon. From the Blue Ribbon winners, a First place winner in each Class will be awarded. If there are no Blue ribbon winners in any lot in a
particular class, there will not be a best of Class premium. A First place OVERALL winner will be selected from the Blue Rosettes winners. Premiums will be awarded according to the Judges' records only, and may be picked up when articles are claimed.
8. Pictures of winning items and ribbons will be on display during the fair.
9. For further details, see General Rules.
10. Exhibitors will be limited to five (5) items in each class, and one (1) in each lot.

## JUDGING STANDARDS

Eating Quality: Tender, Texture (light, velvety, feathery), Moist, Flavor, good blend of ingredients, Appearance

Volume (baked layers should be about same height), Crust - Uniform color (if iced, should be attractive), Crumb - Uniform

## Suggestions and some points of judging:

- Each jar of canned food must have been canned after March 2024.
- All containers must be standard, clear glass, pint or quart jars. Only jellies and seafood may be in half-pint standard jars. Each container must be sealed and clean, with top in good condition; (NO RUST OR PITTING). Screw bands must be removed by the entrant.
- Label all canned foods with name of product and date when canned. DO NOT LABEL WITH YOUR NAME.
- Exhibits not presented or labeled according to these rules will be excluded from judging.
- Canned foods will be judged on color, condition, clearness, uniformity, and pack. All food except jellies should have $1 / 2$ " headspace. Jellies should have $1 / 4$ " headspace.
- NO meat will be judged.


## AWARDS for BAKERY, CANDY \& CANNING

All entries will be judged on their own merit and may be awarded a Blue, Red, White or Participant Ribbon. The following premiums will also be awarded:

Blue Ribbon $=\$ 3.00$
Red Ribbon $=\$ 2.00$
White Ribbon $=\$ 1.00$
BEST OF CLASS will be chosen from any Blue Ribbon winners in each class. If there are no blue ribbon winners in any lot in a particular class, there will not be a Best of Class awarded for that class. Winner will be awarded:

Classes \# 1 - 6 Blue Rosette and $\$ 8.00$
Classes \#7-9 Blue Rosette and \$5.00
BEST OF SHOW will be chosen from the Best of Class winners and awarded:
Large Blue Rosette and \$20.00
