DEPARTMENT RULES AND INFORMATION:

- 1. Young Pen: 1 cockerel, 2 pullets, under 1yr; Breeding Trio: 1 cock, 2 hens, over 1yr; Pullet: under 1yr; Cockerel: under 1yr; Hen: over 1yr; and Cock: over 1yr
- 2. Market exhibits will include individuals and pens. Market exhibits include those birds judged according to meat, egg-production, or other marketing value (such as feathers for fly-tying)
- 3. Except where otherwise noted, poultry pens of three should be same breed and sex birds, and as near to same size & color as possible.
- 4. The ND State Board of Animal Health is requiring all poultry being shown at an Exhibition be tested free of Pullorum. There are several Testing Agents in the State. The test must be done within 90 days of the exhibition. Birds that have been tested must be banded with a leg band and the exhibitor must have a copy of the testing certificate. Testing will follow NPIP program rules and regulations. Birds originating from NPIP flocks and bearing a certificate of originating from said flock will not have to be tested if the originating flock was tested within 12 months of the exhibition. Poultry 3 months of age and under are exempt from testing. Testing will be done in the Poultry Barn Thursday, July 8, 2021 from 2pm-4pm. This is at an additional charge.
- 5. Poultry: All poultry must bear a leg or wing band and meet one of the following criteria: 1) Originate directly from an NPIP Certified Flock 2) Test negative to S. Pullorum within 90 days prior to exhibition or 3) Have been purchased from an NPIP source and be accompanied by a Poultry Exhibition Statement of Origin form (SFN 60329). Form is available on the North Dakota Department of Agriculture's website: http://www.nd.gov/ndda/program/national-poultry-improvement-plan.
- 6. All animals are expected to stay the full ten days of Fair.
- 7. All poultry are provided food and water throughout the ten days by Poultry Superintendent.
- 8. Entries are to be made on forms furnished by the Red River Valley Fair and are to be paid in full at the time entry is made to the Fair office.
- 9. Refunds: Once registered, there are no refunds without a letter from veterinarian.
- 10. All entries must be made in the name of the exhibitor and must be the bona fide property of the exhibitor.
- 11. Youth exhibitors (YS) may only show two animals per class. Those showing in the youth division must pre-register to ensure availability of cages and pens.
- 12. Those youth wishing to show in the adult/open show instead of youth must follow the same rules as the other open/adult class exhibitors.
- 13. **Upon arrival**, all entries are subject to inspection by the Red River Valley Fair. Cage cards may be picked up from the Superintendent at time of inspection. Any animal deemed ill or unacceptable for display will be removed.
- 14. Late arrivals of exhibits must have prior approval of the show Superintendent in order to be eligible for premium money or awards, entry fees will be double.
- 15. There is an entry limit of 50 birds per family in the poultry section.
- 16. **NO ON SITE SALE OF ANIMALS ALLOWED,** you will forfeit any premium dollars and may be asked not to return to future Fair if caught.
- 17. No parking will be allowed inside the fairground gates. All parking in designated parking lots outside the Fairgrounds.

- 18. The Fair will furnish cages and wood chips for rabbit and poultry exhibits. Straw is not allowed in buildings. In case of more entries than available cages, early entries will be given first chance at cages.
- 19. The Fair volunteers will feed, water, and care for poultry and pigeons, using non-medicated ration. If a special diet is desired, exhibitors must provide feed and written instructions to Poultry Superintendent. Water containers will be provided for chickens; however, waterfowl containers should be provided by exhibitor.
- 20. All animals must be kept in Livestock Barn #2 and cannot be carried around the Fairgrounds.
- 21. Animals can be transported between a vehicle and the building in the most direct route possible. Any exhibitor failing to follow this rule may forfeit their premium money.
- 22. Anyone carrying an objectionable animal on the grounds other than Livestock Barn #2 will be asked to remove the animal from the premises and will forfeit any premiums.
- 23. All classes listed as "any other" will be judged together. If four or more of the same breeds and/or color are shown, a separate class may be made for them.
- 24. In absence of competition in any department or class, judges shall award prizes only where warranted.
- 25. Animals shown in pens or pairs may not be shown as individuals and individuals may not be shown in pair or pens.
- 26. Poultry shown in breed classes may not be shown in market classes and vice versa.
- 27. Inferior birds not true to breed will be disqualified from judging.
- 28. Stickers may be used in place of Ribbons.
- 29. Animals that leave before release time without prior approval by the show Superintendent will forfeit premiums
- 30. Premium checks will be mailed within 45 days from the close of the Fair.
- 31. Because entries will be computerized, any changes made in department, division, class or variety after July 1, 2023 will be considered a late entry and <u>double fees will apply</u>. All fees must be paid to the Fair office before animals will be judged.
