General Information & Rules for Livestock

- All entries will be online only, please do not mail in entries.
- Entry Deadline is June 17, 2024 for ALL livestock
- Barn space is limited and when the barns are full all other entries will be returned
- Refunds: Once registered, there will be no refunds. Refunds can be requested with a veterinarian note.
- Exhibitors are responsible for entering their animals in the appropriate shows.
- There are no double entries. If you have a breeding animal, it cannot be entered as a market animal.
- **Upon arrival**, all entries are subject to inspection by the Red River Valley Fair. Any animal deemed ill or unacceptable for display will be removed
- **Protest:** All protests must be made in writing and accompanied by a deposit of \$100. Deposit will be forfeited if the protest is not sustained. Such protest must state plainly the cause of complaint or appeal and must be filed with the fair manager within 24 hours of show completion. All expenses incurred because of protest will be the responsibility of protester regardless of results. No complaint or appeal based upon the statement that the judge or judges are incompetent will be considered. Where a protest is made against competition of an animal, notice should be filed with the Superintendent of the department before the class is passed upon, so that the judges may be instructed to place a reserve award, that premiums be properly distributed in the event the protest is sustained.
- **Bedding:** Straw and chips may be purchased on the grounds. Purchases can be made in respective barns with times posted in respective barns. **Straw is not allowed in barns.** Shavings are \$8.00/bags and straw bales (for tie-outs only) are \$6.00/bale.
- The space and stalls in the barns are for exhibit purposes and must not be filled with feed.
- The management will use diligence to ensure safety of exhibits after their arrival and placement, but in no case will they be responsible for any loss or damage occasioned by or arising from any animal or article on exhibition, and the exhibitors shall indemnify the Fair management against all legal or other proceedings in regard thereto.
- **Release of Exhibits:** All exhibits must remain in place until the release time given under its section in this book except livestock moving to home county fairs that are held on conflicting dates with prior approval from Superintendent.
- **Premiums:** Will not be paid if exhibits are removed before stated time of release, unless authorized by the Superintendent. No premiums will be paid to any exhibitor unless the full and complete requirements as to pedigree numbers, registration, etc., are complied with. All sheep, swine, goat, and beef stalls must be cleaned prior to leaving or premiums will be not be paid.
- Judges must not award prizes to an unworthy animal/exhibit. It is the intention of the Fair Board that no premium or distinction of any kind shall be given an animal that is not deserving. This rule must be strictly adhered to whether there is competition or not.
- Where there are fewer entries in a class than the number of premiums offered, judges may, at their discretion, award a prize or prizes of such grade as the animals deserve.
- Judges shall report to the Superintendent any exhibitor who in any way, whether in person, by agents, or assistants, interferes during the adjudication, or shows any disrespect to them. The Superintendent shall, at his/her discretion, demand a proper apology from such exhibitor, or he/she may be excluded from such competition and the Board may withhold any premiums that have been awarded him/her, and expel him/her from further competition at the Fair.
- **All Alleys Must Be Clean and Accessible to the Public Between 9:00 am and 9:00 pm. Failure to do so could result in premiums withheld by the Fair and/or suspension from future shows**
- Satisfactory evidence to the Superintendent in charge will be required that the animals exhibited as breeders are not barren. No awards will be made where there is unsoundness in breeding animals, or where there is any question as to its transmissibility.
- Fast Driving or Riding of any description will not be permitted within the grounds. Any violation of this rule will be severely dealt with by the Management and the guilty person removed from the grounds. Automobiles are prohibited in any section of the grounds whenever safety demands.
- **Brand Inspection:** North Dakota Century Code Chapter 36-09-23: "No person shall remove cattle, horses, or mules from this state or to within a mile of any boundary of the state for the purpose of removal unless such livestock have been inspected for marks and brands by an official brand inspector of the North Dakota Stockman's Association and a certificate of inspection shall accompany such livestock to destination."
- **No smoking in the barns or area around the barns**
- Health certificates from licensed veterinarians are required on all out of state animals.
- North Dakota Origin Cattle - Health Certificates not required.
- Registration papers are required on all animals.
- State health standards must be met. Refer to Livestock Section Rules for regulations & health rules. Contact your local veterinarian for regulations on bringing cattle into North Dakota
- A **First Aid Station** will be maintained in the Cass County Sheriff's Building located at the south end of the grounds in front of the Grandstand.
- **Advertising:** Under NO circumstances will any person or firm be allowed to place advertising matter anywhere on the grounds, nor is anyone permitted to distribute advertising without prior approval.

- **NO ON SITE SALE OF ANIMALS ALLOWED**, you will forfeit any premium dollars and may be asked not to return to future Fair if caught.
- All animals must be kept in the proper building(s) and cannot be carried or walked around the Fairgrounds
- Premium checks will be mailed within 45 days from the close of the Fair.
- Tagging guidelines will follow ND Junior Point Show rules. All Market animals must be tagged (all sheep, swine and goats must be tagged. Scrapie tags are required for sheep and goats).
- All registered animals must have their registration papers or the animal must show in the Commercial Division

ENTRY INFORMATION

- All general rules apply.
- **YS** - Youth 18 years of age & under as of the date of show. Exhibitors needs to be present. **AS** - Adults - Exhibitors 19 years of age & over as of the date of the show. **Option:** Youth may choose to compete with the adult; however, entries **MUST** be different animals from their youth entries. Please use separate entry forms if choosing this option.
- Youth exhibitors (YS) may only show two animals per class. Those showing in the youth division must pre-register to ensure availability of cages and pens Please Note: If showing cavies, you will need to supply your own cage. Youth exhibitors may show rabbits in either division; however, no rabbit may be shown in more than one division. Rabbits and Cavies exhibited by Cass County 4H members may be judged additionally for Cass County Achievement Days – separate entry forms will be available to Cass County 4-H members. Separate deadlines apply for Achievement Days. **Please see Cass County Extension for these deadlines.**
- The Fair will furnish cages and wood chips for rabbit exhibits. Straw is not allowed in buildings. In case of more entries than available cages, early entries will be given first chance at cages.
- Animals shown in pens or pairs may not be shown as individuals and individuals may not be shown in pair or pens.

ANIMAL CARE INFORMATION:

- Exhibitors are responsible for the care and feeding of their rabbits and cavies unless other arrangements are made ahead of time with Superintendent. The Fair volunteers will assist in feeding and water of rabbits and cavies, please contact the Superintendent if assistance is desired for feeding and watering. If you would like us to feed your animals, please bring your feed and make arrangements with the Superintendent. The Fair will provide feeders for rabbits. **Please bring your own waterers.**
- No parking will be allowed inside the fairground gates during the fair. All parking in designated parking lots outside the Fairgrounds.

JUDGING INFORMATION:

- All classes listed as “any other” will be judged together. If four or more of the same breeds and/or color are shown, a separate class may be made for them.
- In absence of competition in any department or class, judges shall award prizes only where warranted.
- Inferior animals not true to breed will be disqualified from judging.
- Stickers may be used in place of Ribbons.

DEPARTMENT RULES AND INFORMATION:

- All general livestock rules apply.
- **The ND State Board of Animal Health is requiring all poultry being shown at an Exhibition be tested free of Pullorum. There are several Testing Agents in the State. The test must be done within 90 days of the exhibition. Birds that have been tested must be banded with a leg band and the exhibitor must have a copy of the testing certificate. Testing will follow NPIP program rules and regulations. Birds originating from NPIP flocks and bearing a certificate of originating from said flock will not have to be tested if the originating flock was tested within 12 months of the exhibition. Poultry 3 months of age and under are exempt from testing. Testing may be an additional charge.**
- **Poultry:** All poultry must bear a leg or wing band and meet one of the following criteria: 1) Originate directly from an NPIP Certified Flock 2) Test negative to S. Pullorum within 90 days prior to exhibition or 3) Have been purchased from an NPIP source and be accompanied by a Poultry Exhibition Statement of Origin form (SFN 60329). Form is available on the North Dakota Department of Agriculture’s website: <http://www.nd.gov/ndda/program/national-poultry-improvement-plan>.
- Market exhibits will include individuals and pens. Market exhibits include those birds judged according to meat, egg-production, or other marketing value (such as feathers for fly-tying)
- Young Pen: 1 cockerel, 2 pullets, under 1yr; Breeding Trio: 1 cock, 2 hens, over 1yr; Pullet: under 1yr; Cockerel: under 1yr; Hen: over 1yr; and Cock: over 1yr
- Except where otherwise noted, poultry pens of three should be same breed and sex birds, and as near to same size & color as possible.
- Youth exhibitors (YS) may only show two animals per class. Those showing in the youth division must pre-register to ensure availability of cages and pens.
- Those youth wishing to show in the adult/open show instead of youth must follow the same rules as the other open/adult class exhibitors.
- **All poultry are provided food and water throughout the show weekend by Poultry Superintendent.**
- The Fair will furnish cages and wood chips for poultry exhibits. Straw is not allowed in buildings. In case of more entries than available cages, early entries will be given first chance at cages.
- The Fair volunteers will feed, water, and care for poultry and pigeons, using non-medicated ration. If a special diet is desired, exhibitors must provide feed and written instructions to Poultry Superintendent. Water containers will be provided for chickens; however, waterfowl containers should be provided by exhibitor.
- Animals can be transported between a vehicle and the building in the most direct route possible. Any exhibitor failing to follow this rule may forfeit their premium money.

JUDGING

- All classes listed as “any other” will be judged together. If four or more of the same breeds and/or color are shown, a separate class may be made for them
- In absence of competition in any department or class, judges shall award prizes only where warranted.
- Animals shown in pens or pairs may not be shown as individuals and individuals may not be shown in pair or pens.
- Poultry shown in breed classes may not be shown in market classes and vice versa.
- Inferior birds not true to breed will be disqualified from judging.
- Stickers may be used in place of Ribbons.

Exhibitor is the individual who is named as the registered owner on the registration paper. A showman is the person who takes the animal into the show ring.
