
Performance Deck Float Feat. Woodburn High School Mariachi Band



The Crown of Rosaria Feat. Oregon Teacher of the Year Mandy Vance






This elegant float presents a larger-than-life version of the 102year-old Crown of Rosaria in all its glory with a regal bouquet of yellow roses. Riding on the float this year is Oregon Teacher of the Year, Mandy Vance. Mandy served as the Rose Festival Princess from Franklin High School in 2004. The Crown of Rosaria was gifted to the Portland Rose Festival in 1922 by the Professional Women's Club of Portland, who paid for it by selling miniature paper roses for 25 cents each. Made of gold and adorned with multiple precious stones, the Crown of Rosaria is worth thousands of dollars, but its role in the Rose Festival history makes it priceless.



Royal Rosarian Foundation Float Feat. the 1974 Court





With a nod of an iconic straw hat, this float pays homage to Portland's official greeters and ambassadors of good will, the Royal Rosarians. The Rosarian motto—For You a Rose in Portland grows—is known around the world. Proudly presented on the float are members of the 1974 Rose Festival Court celebrating their 50–year reunion. An all–volunteer organization, Royal Rosarians welcome visiting dignitaries from around the world, host hundreds of out–of–town visitors, march in parades throughout the region, and perform ceremonial rose plantings. The Royal Rosarian Foundation is a nonprofit civic organization. The float was built by Rose City Float Designs of Portland.

The Clown Prince sits atop his famous throne in community parades, wielding his gigantic rose-shaped scepter. Top hats are filled with circus roses, purple daisy mums, assorted Gerber daisies, yellow cushion mums, purple larkspur with leather leaf and sword ferns in a celebration fit for a Prince. Angel Ocasio, the Rose Festival's artistic director, leads the famous Rose Festival Clowns. This volunteer group of specially-trained Clowns add smiles and laughter to Rose Festival events every year.









This beautiful mini-float depicts a tranquil garden with red coconut walking bridge. A graceful Chinese gate is completed in red, yellow and blue coconut and topped with yellow roses. The amazing Phoenix birds are covered in flame-shaded coconut with oncidium, dendrobium orchid, red ginger and anthurium tails. Red rose arrangements adorn the float, and red carnations line the bottom. The Portland-Kaohsiung Sister City Association is committed to the friendship between Portland and Kaohsiung, Taiwan; this nonprofit organization produces the popular Rose Festival Dragon Boat Race.

Portland-Sapporo Sister City Association








Celebrating 65 years of Friendship between Portland and Sapporo, Japan, the Portland-Sapporo Sister City Association is Portland's oldest sister city relationship. Thanks to the generous support of Columbia Sportswear, this float features a traditional Japanese gate, a taiko drummer and stunning white floral arrangements and peacocks with floral tails. Walkers in happy coats accompany the float.

SATURDAY, JUNE 8, 2024







An international service organization founded on the campus of Howard University in 1908, AKA is the oldest Greek-letter organization established by African American college-educated women. The Zeta Sigma Omega chapter was founded in 1955, with members from across the Portland metro area and Salem. Current chapter president Leslie Goodlow rides atop this pink 'skirt' mini-float which is covered in pink coconut with cascading bouquets of two-toned pink roses, white cushion mums and pink baby's breath. Leslie served as the president of the Rose Festival during its Centennial in 2007.







Parade favorite Lucy the Ladybug was one of the Rose Festival's very first mini-floats, bringing smiles to the faces of parade-goers every year as she makes her way down the streets of Portland. Her coat is made of red dyed rice with black onion seed spots. Her happy floral arrangement includes red roses and baby's breath with a base of yellow Viking daisy mums. Look for Lucy's friend Sammy the Snail, who snags another parade-day ride on Lucy's back.







Yakima native Sherry Scott rides on this beautiful float wearing a dress her mother made more than 100 years ago when she was a Pendleton princess. The float features native baskets and flowers you might find in a field, such as sunflowers, larkspur, carnations and solidago. Members of the Bow & Arrow Club march alongside the mini-float, along with hand drummers and dancers in native regalia. The Bow & Arrow Club produces the annual Delta Park PowWow and Encampment, a traditional celebration of native culture more than 50 years old.

Sponsored by Travel Oregon City.com, this mini-float celebrates the people who dreamed of and established Oregon City, before and after it became the first incorporated city west of the Rock Mountains.
