



By ARTHUR CHAPMAN, author of "Out Where the West Begins," etc.



FAIR RECIPE:

Noel Neal's Bloody Mary Deviled Eggs

Ingredients:

12 Large Eggs

1/4 c. Mayonnaise

1 tbsp. tomato paste

1 tbsp. horseradish

Juice of 1/2 lemon

2 tsp. hot sauce

1 tsp. celery salt

Kosher salt

Black pepper

2 tbsp. old bay seasoning

Small pickle slice, for garnish

Directions:

Place eggs in large pot and cover with an inch of water. Place pot on stove and bring to a boil. Turn off heat and cover with a lid. Let set for about 11-12 minutes. Remove eggs from pot and place in ice water bath.

When cool to the touch, peel the eggs and cut in half

Scoop yolks out and place in a medium bowl. In the bowl with the yolks, add mayonnaise, tomato paste, horseradish, lemon juice, hot sauce, and celery salt and mix until well combined. Season with salt and pepper to your liking. Transfer to a piping bag. Place old bay seasoning on a small plate and press edge of egg into seasoning. Place eggs on a plate and pipe the filling into each egg. Top with a pickle slice for a garnish.







Iva Caroline (Decker) Laman, age 92, was born in Oak Creek, CO July 24, 1929. She was the youngest of 5 children born to Ivan Christian and Bertha Gladys (Perry) Decker. She passed away on October 24, 2021, at Idalia, CO. Iva was raised in Toponas, CO. She attended school at the Toponas School and then went to Yampa Union High in Yampa where she graduated in 1947.

She grew up involved in church, 4-H, sewing, showing cattle...She showed cattle at the Routt County Fair as well as the National Western Stock Show. She loved to ski and made jumps to ski off around the house. She helped in the fields - plowing with horses, harvesting, working in the lettuce and spinach fields. She dearly loved a dog named Funny and continued to tell about how she got him.

She fell in love with Marvin Charles Laman, and they were married on November 8, 1947. To this union 6 children were born. They moved often

from cow camp, to close or into town and back to cow camp...23 times in the first 25 years! After Marvin started working for D&RG Railroad, they continued to ranch and not move as often.

Iva had hauled kids to school for several years, but in 1972 she took on the job of bus driver in a real bus. She really enjoyed her passengers and loved the trips to Denver, Mesa Verde and other places. Most of the students along with many other people called her Granny. She retired after 19 years of driving. She loved to garden, have flowers and chickens and enjoyed being an official weather keeper reporting to a TV station in Grand Junction. She loved to watch the Rockies, bull riding and rodeos on TV. In her last few years, she stayed busy doing embroidery or "sewing" as she called it.

Iva is survived by her children; JR(Vicki) of Craig, Jac of Sweetwater, Jeanne Jensen of Richfield, UT, Cindy of Silt, Katy (Zane) of Idalia, and Lynn (Shawn) of Hayden. 15 grandchildren, 32 great-grandchildren, and 14 great-great grandchildren as well as several step ones. She is also survived by her dear sister Verna Whaley of Phippsburg and many nieces and nephews.

She was preceded in death by her husband of 65 years, Marvin, daughter Judy Kresl, her parents, Ivan and Birdie, her mother and father-in –law, Emil and Pearl Laman, brothers Clint and Perry, sister Emma Muntzert, grandson, Bobby Kresl, great-grandson, Wyatt Merry and son-in-laws Bill Kresl and Dick Jensen.

Louise Beals Haslem

Louise Beals Haslem of Hayden, Colorado died peacefully of natural causes in her room just before sunrise on March 4, 2022 at age 90. Born on June 18, 1931 in Edgemont, South Dakota to Wilfred and Oleta Beals, she spent her childhood in rural South Dakota and rural southern Wyoming. Second oldest of four sisters, the Beals girls developed an exceptionally strong bond and sense of family as their father transferred between remote posts during his career with the US Forest Service.

Their family settled Colorado with homes in Norwood and Collbran. Louise attended high school in Norwood, Colorado, graduating in 1950. She pursued her nursing degree at St. Joseph's School of Nursing, graduating in 1953. Her career as a surgical nurse started in Grand Junction, CO at St. Mary's Hospital working for working for two surgeons: Dr Joe Merrill & Dr Scott Christensen. Louise met Sam Haslem on a blind date in Norwood, Colorado. They married June 16, 1967. Upon their marriage, she gained three step-children; Richard, Terri and Sherri, whom she loved dearly. The Haslem family moved to Fort Collins where they expanded their family and welcomed the birth of Joseph in 1969.

In 1971, the Haslems moved to Routt County on Deep Creek, and on to Hayden in 1975. Louise and Sam integrated into the community with involvement in numerous service organizations. Louise served as a school nurse for the Hayden School District for 10 years. Following nursing, she worked at the local bank until 1989. service organizations, the church and as the behind-the-scenes force behind Sam's charitable work. After Joseph went to college, Louise spent time tending to her gardens, immersing herself in hobbies like painting and continued volunteering in the community. She was a devoted grandmother and had a special place in her heart for the many border collie dogs the family owned.

Louise stood by Sam's side as he was heavily involved in the Routt County Fair. She helped improve the fairgrounds and assisted with many programs at the Routt County Fair.



Following the passing of Sam in 2015, Louise continued to be actively involved in the Hayden Congregational Church. In 2017 she moved into "her apartment" at The Haven Assisted Living Center where she continued to sing in the choir and play bridge. Her church community continued to hold her close, with Pastor Jane spending much time with her in her final days. Minutes before the sun rose Friday, March 4th, Louise waited until "the coast was clear" and Jane stepped out of the room to pass on.

Louise is survived by her son Joseph, step-daughters Terri Dunton, Sherri Johnston, daughter-in-law Verla Haslem, five grandchildren, five great-grandchildren and her sisters Lois Gilstrap and Denise Paquette. She is preceded in death by her parents, sister Delores, husband Sam and step-son Richard.

Nancy Stahoviak

March 14, 1947-January 25, 2022

Former Routt County Commissioner Nancy Stahoviak was known for her deep knowledge of county issues and her commitment to serving the residents she represented.

She was a valued member of our Routt County community and was the elected County Commissioner for District I for 20 years (1993-2013). During her tenure she garnered many awards and accolades including the Hazie Werner Award and the CCI Foundation Distinguished Service Award.

Prior to being elected, Nancy was the town clerk for the Town of

Oak Creek. She was also instrumental in starting Little Friends Childcare in Oak Creek which transitioned to South Routt Early Learning Center in Yampa. She was also influential in the creation of Regional Affordable Living Foundation, which later became Yampa Valley Housing Authority.

When remembering Nancy, Commissioner Tim Corrigan said "Nancy was always the best prepared commissioner. She was a real public servant, it's what she did. She devoted her life to public service."

Former County Attorney, John Merrill, echoed Commissioner Corrigan's sentiments, "She was the hardest working commissioner that I worked with, and all of the commissioners I worked with were hard working. She was always prepared for public hearings."

Merrill was particularly impressed with Nancy's knowledge of zoning regulations. "What really struck me was that she knew the county's subdivision and zoning regulations as well as any attorney. I remember, after one of her surgeries, she participated in a difficult zoning matter. She participated from the hospital over a conference call. There were more than 100 members from the public participating in that hearing, and she was listening on a telephone line. She did a remarkable job making a motion for all of the commissioners to approve. Very difficult."

Merrill continued and described Nancy as a champion for county employees. "The other side of Nancy was that she worried about people, specifically county employees. She was trying to get better pay and working conditions even as she dealt with her own health conditions. She knew the county employees as well as anyone and tried to make life as comfortable as possible for employees that were doing a good job. She had a remarkable mind and remarkable feelings for people. Nancy was an amazing, wonderful person to work with."

Current County Attorney, Erick Knaus, described Nancy's giving nature, "We also have a tree on the County lawn with a plaque in her name. The plaque is covered in snow right now but I do look at the tree from time to time and remember her giving nature to neighbors and community- just like The Giving Tree."

"She set the example of strong consistent leadership," commented Commissioner Tim Redmond. "I had the pleasure of working with Nancy on airport projects. We will miss her direct honest style."

Commissioner Beth Melton reflected on Nancy as a mentor. "Nancy was a mentor and an inspiration to me in my work. I spent many hours drinking tea around her kitchen table talking about the issues of the day. Her presence and legacy are still very much felt throughout the county – she was a champion for county employees, for childcare, and for housing. She was deeply dedicated to the work she did as a commissioner, and that work ethic and commitment to the job has become a tradition of the Routt County Commissioners. I will miss my conversations with Nancy, and I know that her legacy will continue to live on at Routt County."

Pete and Charnel Wille



Anny Brown - Attendant





General Rules, Regulations, & Information

ADMISSION: Admission to the grounds is FREE. There is an admission charge for the 4-H BBQ, camping, and the Demolition Derby.

BICYCLES: NO bicycles, skateboards, scooters, hover boards or similar items on fairgrounds during the Routt County Fair.

CAMPING: All visitors and participants wishing to "camp" with placement of a Recreational Vehicle (RV) or tent on the fairgrounds during the Routt County Fair must register and obtain a permit PRIOR to setting up RV/TENT. "Fair Camping" dates begin the day of the Open Horse Show and end on the last day of Fair. For 2022 the dates are August 12 to August 21. Reservations start August 11-21 and must be reserved for the full 11 days. No refunds. Accommodations are based on availability.

ALL reservations will be made online at routtcountyfair.org beginning JULY 15. Campers will pick their location during reservation. Phone, email and USPS mail reservations are not accepted. If someone needs help or does not have access to the internet, they can visit the Fair Office and get help with reservations.

- Water is NOT available to fill your RV at the fairgrounds. Please plan to fill your RV PRIOR to arriving at the fairgrounds.
- RV/TENT must display the proper permit at all times. Permits are available at the Fair office inside the Exhibit Hall.
- Only one RV/TENT and one vehicle are allowed per site (no exceptions). Each registered RV/TENT is given ONE vehicle permit which MUST be displayed or the vehicle will be towed at the owner's expense.
- The only vehicles/trailers allowed in the designated camping areas are the registered RV/TENT and the ONE registered vehicle. No horse trailers or other vehicles/tents/trailers are allowed to park in the designated camping areas.
- Quiet hours are 10:00pm to 7:00am.

- Camping area must be kept clean at all times for the enjoyment of all our guests.
- Any type of fencing or barrier is not permitted.
- Any guests, their children or visitors who become a nuisance will be asked to leave.
- Adult supervision is required for each RV/TENT.
- Any vehicle without the proper permit easily visible will be towed at the owner's expense.
- Camp fires are NOT allowed during the Routt County Fair.
- Electrical Sites: Due to limited electrical power RVs are expected to be conservative in their use of air conditioners or other appliances that take large amounts of electricity (microwaves, air conditioners).
- DAMAGE TO SITE: Guests shall leave the site in as good a condition at the end of use as it was at the beginning of such use. Guest shall also be responsible for the costs of any cleaning or repair to the site or the Fairgrounds resulting from their use or that of their guests. In the event that County is required to clean or repair damage which is the responsibility of the Guest, County shall be entitled to recover such costs from Guest.

ALCOHOL & MARIJUANA: Possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages, marijuana, and any illicit drug is forbidden on the fairgrounds (excluding the wine & beer contest and any approved Beer Garden). Drinking, brawling and other misconduct in general on the part of the exhibitors shall be grounds for the Fair Management to cause the exhibitor to forfeit all premium monies. 4-H/ FFA members: 4-H has no tolerance for the possession or use of alcohol or other illegal drugs and the 4H/FFA alcohol policy will be enforced.

ELIGIBILITY: Participation in the Routt County Fair Home Arts Division is limited to Routt County residents (this includes part-time residents).

ATV/UTV USE: Fair Advisory Board members, Routt County employees and Extension office employees, and anyone authorized by Fair Management are the only peo-

ple allowed to operate any ATVs/UTVs during the Routt County Fair on the Routt County Fairgrounds.

SAFETY: Fair management will exercise diligence, including the employment of special police to assure the safety of people, animals and exhibits. In no case will Routt County, the Routt County Fair Advisory Board, Fair Superintendents or Routt County Extension Office staff be responsible or liable for loss, damage or injury to any people or property on the fairgrounds. Exhibits will not be accepted subject to any conditions outlined by an exhibitor; completion of an entry by an exhibitor indemnifies Routt County and the Routt County Fair Advisory Board and its agents from any responsibility and/or legal proceedings resulting in claims of liability. Every animal or article entered in a display or competition shall be under the control of the Superinten- dent of the Department in which it is entered.

GROUNDS: Use of the fairgrounds and facilities during the Routt County Fair is supervised by the Routt County Fair Advisory Board. Exhibitors are responsible for cleaning stalls and show areas prior to the release of exhibits.

Buildings and fences must be kept in repair by users who are responsible for removing refuse from the premises or placing it in dumpsters. Unless prior arrangements have been made, barn space must be vacant three days prior to opening of the Fair. No butt fans allowed. No generators allowed. ALL ELECTRICAL CORDS MUST BE OF APPROPRIATE SIZE AND LENGTH WITH NO SPLICES.

JUDGING: Any exhibitor, parent or individual who attempts to interfere with a judge or protests a decision in an unseemly manner will be excluded from competition, awards and premiums and may be escorted from the grounds. Since the Routt County Fair is designed to encourage competition and awards for quality displays, exhibitors and purchasers, the public has the right to expect quality behavior. 4H/FFA members must abide by the 4-H Code of Conduct and 4-H Alcohol Policy.

PREMIUMS: All Home Arts open class premiums may be picked up at the Exhibit hall on Sunday, August 21 from 12-4pm. Premiums not collected on Sunday without prior arrangements are forfeited. In the Home Arts department ONLY, blue ribbons will receive premiums of \$1.

GRIEVANCE PROCEDURES: In order to assure fairness, complaints and grievances must first go to the appropriate Department Superintendent. Issues that cannot be resolved by the Department Superintendent must be addressed through the Routt County Fair Grievance Procedure outlined below. All 4-H/FFA Show grievances must be addressed through 4-H/FFA administration, which can be found in the 2022 Member Handbook.

- Contact the Fair Manager through the Fair office located in the Exhibit Hall.
- File a written grievance with the Fair office in the Exhibit hall. Verbal and unsigned complaints will not be considered.
- Fair manager will coordinate a meeting of the Competition Committee.
- Grievances will be evaluated by the Competition Committee made up of three fair advisory board members and two ex-officio members.
- Any person filing a written grievance has the option of making a personal presentation at a grievance hearing. Grievances will be evaluated in a timely manner however, because of time constraints during the annual fair, a decision may not be made until after fair.
- Decisions of the Competition Committee are final.


FIRE PRECAUTIONS: Smoking is NOT allowed in or within 25 feet of any of the buildings. Visitors should make an effort to be aware of all marked exits and water faucets; keep electrical cords away from water and walk-ways and unplugged when not in use. Report conditions which may result in danger. When called, emergency will come down Poplar Street, enter the race track by the Exhibit hall and proceed to the affected area in an

emergency. The extent of the fire personnel access to gates and safety of everyone must be considered if it becomes necessary to evacuate animals.

PARKING:


South side of outdoor arena is NO PUBLIC PARKING. This area is for people participating in the current event being held in the outdoor arena ONLY! Participants are allowed ONE vehicle only! Once the event is over, vehicles and trailers MUST be moved. All others are subject to tow at owner's expense.

- Outdoor Arena Event Participants: park on the south side of the arena.
- Livestock/Horse trailers: should park along the fence on the north side of the fairgrounds.
- Spectators: parking is available in the field on the east side of the multi-purpose building, west side of the exhibit hall or Dry Creek Park.
- The west gate is open only to foot traffic.
- Livestock exhibitors: are allowed to enter the livestock area to load and unload animals.

Points are figured on contestant/horse team. If entering more than one horse, each horse will receive its own number. Points given 1st= 6pts, 2nd =5pts, 3rd=4pts, 4th=3 pts, 5th= 2 pts, and 6th = 1 pt. respectively. Ties will be broken by contestant/horse team that earned points in the greatest number of events. Age is as of January 1 of current year. Halters can be used per breed of Horse for halter classes. Stallions prohibited in youth division. Halter classes DO NOT count toward High Point Awards. The gate will close for each class three minutes after the class is called into the arena. Under no circumstances may an exhibitor, parent, or spectator badger, insult or be argumentative with a judge, show secretary, ring steward or the show management. Any flagrant display may result in the exclusion of the exhibitor from competition and forfeiture of awards or expulsion from the show grounds for the person and or exhibitor. Only members of the show staff are allowed in the announcer's booth. At any time while in the arena or on the fairgrounds a rider may be disqualified and or excused from the arena for abusing their horse, unsportsmanlike conduct, lack of control or any unsafe situations for either themselves or for others.

Settling of Herds: There will be 11 cattle in the arena, 10 with numbers 0-9 and one trash. Fresh herds will be settled for approx. three. Cattle will be settled after each run in the middle or corner of the arena to Judge's satisfaction. Direction of cattle sorted will be determined by the Judge prior to the start of the first go and will be subject to arena conditions and layout. Each team will alternate direction of cattle sorted in its respective division. (i.e., if the first team sorts east-west then the second team sorts west-east.

Start: Starting number for each team will be drawn when the team, consisting of two riders, is in the arena. Judge will raise flag when cattle are ready. First rider will cross the foul line within 3-4 seconds as soon as the settlers are clear. The judge will drop the flag and the announcer will give the number to start and the team will continue sorting in numerical order (i.e., 7-8-9-0).

Cattle Sorted: Teams are judged on total number of cattle sorted, and on the time.

A cow is sorted when the **complete cow crosses the start/ foul line.**

If a cow is sorted out of order, it's a no-time or if any part of the non-numbered cow breaks the **start/foul line** the team receives a no-time.

If any part of the cow crosses back over after it has been sorted, then the team is disqualified and receives a no-time. Each cow will be timed as it is sorted and the clock will be stopped when the 10th cow completely crosses the line. **The 10th cow has to be all the way clean.** No trash cow (no number) or part of trash cow may be beside the 10th cow when crossing.

Cattle in sequence may cross side-to-side as long as the correct numbered cow is a nose ahead.

In case of a foul (i.e., cow escapes assuming the cause was not caused by roughing the cattle), the team can ask for a re-ride or accept the number of cattle sorted at the time foul occurred. In case of a mechanical error or foul (i.e., clock not reset), the team has the option of an immediate re-ride or continuing with the appropriate time added onto the clock.

Any cow that lays down and stays down interfering with teams ride will result in a re-ride. If a cow lays down and

stays down during a run, the team can stop the run place their hands in the air and request a re-ride. If the Judge agrees that the cow was hindering the run, a re-ride may be granted.

Any unnecessary roughness to cattle or horses or unsportsmanlike conduct may result in disqualification. Running cattle into fence, any excessive use of a whip, rope, crop, bat or reins anywhere on the horse will be cause for disqualification.

Contact with cattle by using hat, whip or rope will result is disqualification.

If a team has a dispute with the run protest must be lodged before the team exits the pen.

All decisions by Judge are final.

Commitment to Cattle: Once committed to cattle by the horse breaking the foul line, the team is responsible for the cattle. It is the responsibility of the team, before working the cattle, if, in their opinion, there is an injured animal in the herd. Once the cattle are worked, no excuses are accepted.

Payback: 40% - 50 or less teams & 50% -51 or more teams

** Excludes Youth Class: prizes regardless of the number of teams running.



Rabbit classes are divided into classes by breed, color, sex and age. The Rabbit Meat Pen must consist of three of the same breed, weighing between three to five pounds each and not more than 75 days old. The meat pen can be any heavy breed or cross breed and the Grand Champion may be sold at the Junior Livestock Sale.

When you purchase an animal at the Jr. Livestock Sale you receive a locally raised, high quality product and support Routt County's 4-H & FFA programs. It is estimated that over 80% of the money earned from the Jr. Livestock Sale is invested in higher education and/or building future livestock enterprises. Your purchase is an investment in the future of Routt County youth! In 2021, the outstanding supporters of this event spent \$609,573 on 133 head of livestock. Beef averaged \$7,008, lambs averaged \$2,400, goats averaged \$1,629 and swine averaged \$4,030. The animals produced for and sold through the auction are terminal and will meet or exceed the quality of meat purchased in the store. In in addition, you will get to meet the producer. You decidewhere and how the meat is processed – how many servings per package, thickness of the cuts, etc. - completelyhassle free. Livestock is transported to the locker plant of your choice in Craig (Mountain Meat Packing, Artisan Meats, or AGP Processing). The buyer will have to opportunity to fill out their processing details the night of the sale or they will need to callthe processor to specify cuts and preferences, pay for the processing as well as arrange pickup.

How do you purchase an animal at the Jr. Livestock Sale? Register as a Buyer before the auction on the Sale website:

http://rcjuniorlivestocksale.weebly.com/ . Registration will be available immediately prior to the event as well. Pick up your buyer number from the Clerk's table in the

Multipurpose Building when you arrive for the presale BBQ dinner. Once you successfully win the bid on an animal, then immediately make your way to the buyer photo area to meet the producer, have your picture taken, select your processor, complete the buyer paperwork and pay for your purchase.

Can't attend the Jr. Livestock Sale in person? No problem, contact the Routt County Extension Office (970-879-0825) prior to the sale so a proctor may be arranged for you. Call-in options are also available. Most commonly, people use their purchase for private consumption. 4-H & FFA beef, lamb, goat and pork make excellent gifts for friends, family or business associates. Local meat is also a much appreciated e mployee benefit. You may also donate meat to a worthy organization of your choice. In the past, buyers have donated to such organizations as Casey's Pond, The Haven, Horizons, A Better Tomorrow and LiftUp Routt County. Typically, the buyer pays the meat processing cost for the benefit of the nonprofit. (All donated animals must be processed USDA).

The Routt County Jr. Livestock Sale Committee is a non-profit organization. As a result, if the buyer purchases an animal for an amount above and beyond the market value (ie buyback price), then a portion of the purchase price may qualify as a charitable contribution. Be sure to check with your tax consultant for details.

One of the most incredible things about great music is that it has the ability to take the listener to a place they'd rather be. A compelling song can carry someone back in time to a treasured memory, or transport a person to a spectacular western prairie they've only visited in their dreams. Ned LeDoux's music has that kind of power. As a songwriter, he has a knack for bringing people, places and emotions vibrantly to life with his insightful lyrics, and warm, strong voice that makes him sound like a beloved friend you always want to hang out with. Those gifts are fully on display on LeDoux's new album Buckskin.

"I'm writing my own story and if people take a liking to it, that's wonderful," says LeDoux. "As long as I'm writing from the heart, and writing about what I know, I can definitely listen back to it and be proud."

On his third full-length album, LeDoux again delivers songs that transcend mere entertainment to celebrate a life that many aspire to, but few actually live. Like his father, LeDoux's music is as expansive as the western sky he was raised under and celebrates the ranch lifestyle that is such an integral part of his heritage. There's an authenticity to his songs that brings our nation's beloved western culture to life, even for listener's who've never ventured onto the Great Plains.

"I'm proud to carry on the tradition and a lot of songs that I write are going to relate with songs that my dad wrote and recorded because I lived the same life," the young singer/songwriter says. "I was born and raised on a ranch, which my family still owns outside of Kaycee, Wyoming. That was my life and it's reflected in the songs I write. I just think back to those days working on a ranch and hanging out with my granddad, who taught me how to drive a tractor, work cows and everything that is associated with ranching, but music has always been my dream."

LeDoux began pursuing that dream at an early age, and even though he grew up in the shadow of his legendary father, he's successfully carved his own path. "If I can be half the man he was I think I'll be okay," he says with an

easygoing grin, "but when it comes to songwriting I've got to write my own story. I've played drums for years and got my first band when I was in junior high. I went on to play drums with my dad from 1998 until he passed away in 2005, and then I started doing solo gigs." LeDoux made his recording debut with the 2016 EP Forever a Cowboy and followed up with his first full-length project, Sagebrush, in 2017 and Next In Line 2019. All three projects, as well as his new effort, Buckskin, were produced by singer/songwriter/guitarist Mac McAnally, who has won the CMA Musician of the Year Award an unprecedented 10 times. "He's my songwriting mentor and his guidance in the studio is wonderful," LeDoux says. "He's a great guy to be around. Nobody phrases things like he does. I don't know if there's something in that Muscle Shoals water or what, but he's a very inspiring character. He gave me great songwriting advice. He said, 'Just write about what you know. Write the truth because it comes out a lot easier and people are going to believe you."

LeDoux is well respected for his high-energy live shows that mix his western roots with the rock and roll influences he acquired in his youth. He routinely headlines his own shows as well as earning coveted opening slots for Toby Keith, Aaron Watson and Garth Brooks. "We opened for Garth at the 125th anniversary for Cheyenne frontier Days last July which was crazy," he says. "When people are coming out to our shows and spending their hard-earned money on a ticket, I don't want to leave them disappointed. We're going to give you a show and leave you wanting more. I'm always out of breath and soaking wet when we're done, but it's so much fun!" Ned LeDoux is carrying on the family tradition, but he's also charting his own course, and Buckskin is the latest step on that journey. "I hope I inspire people to never forget where you came from," he says. "That's one thing I'm very proud of. I'm carrying on a tradition, but I'm writing my own story. I'm very proud of my family and friends and there's one piece of advice my mom gave me when we were kids: 'Never forget where you came from and show respect to people no matter where you are.' So with this album I hope to inspire and show people, 'Hey this old cowboy isn't changing for nobody.' I want people to know they should never give up on a dream. There's always time. Just keep on going."

All items left after 4pm on Sunday without prior arrangements become property of the Routt County Fair and may be disposed of as the fairgrounds does not have storage space for such items.

Premiums: First-place receives a premium of \$1. Ribbons are awarded in each Division for first (blue), second (red), third place (white) and honorable mention, Champion and Reserve Champion, Grand Champion and Reserve Grand Champion. Some departments have special awards; please refer to specific departments for details.

After 4pm on Sunday all premiums are forfeited.

JUDGING – Thursday August 18th 9am Routt County has open judging which means you are welcome and encouraged to be present and watch the judges at work! Please do not impede judging or interact with the judges while judging is happening. Ribbons and placings will be displayed as soon as the judge is finished on Thursday.

CHECKOUT/PICKUP – Sunday August 21st 12p-4p NO EXHIBIT MAY BE REMOVED BEFORE 12PM ON SUNDAY -- EXHIBITS ARE ONLY RELEASED ON SUNDAY FROM 12-4pm.

GENERAL RULES – The following rules apply to ALL Home Arts Departments. Additional rules for individual departments are found at the beginning of the individual department heading.

1. Eligibility:

A. All home arts exhibits are open to Routt County residents only (Routt County second-home owners are considered residents and are eligible). No exceptions.

B. All items exhibited must be grown, prepared locally, or completed since the pervious fair.
C. Articles must be exhibited under the name of the maker who must currently live in Routt County and never have exhibited the same item in a previous Fair.

D. For the safety of our judges and other exhibitors, we do not allow exhibits of marijuana in any form. No exhibit may contain marijuana in any form. Failure to comply to this rule may result in future disqualification from Routt County Fair Exhibits.

2. Age Divisions

A. Age Group Divisions must be designated on the entry blank. The following age groups apply for all departments unless noted in the individual department.

- Adult/Child Collaboration (3-7)
- Junior (8-12)
- Teen (13-19)

- Adult (20-60)
- Adult Plus (61-75)
- Senior (76-84)
- Senior Plus (85 years and older)
- Professional (any exhibitor having sold over \$300 worth of work, or "professional by trade" unless otherwise specified in divisions)

- B. Age groups, classes and divisions may be changed at the discretion of the superintendent.
- 3. Number of Entries Allowed: Exhibitors may exhibit a maximum of 2 entries per class but may compete in as many classes as desired.
- **4. Special classes** may be created at the discretion of the superintendents and judges may combine championship categories. Judges decisions are final.
- 5. Specific departmental guidelines, rules, and display requirements must be adhered to or the entry will be automatically disqualified.

6. ENTRY and RELEASE DEADLINES:

A. Entry: Unless specified in a specific department, all entries must be in the Exhibit Hall no later than Wednesday, August 17th, at 8:00 p.m.

B. Release: ALL ENTRIES WILL BE RELEASED SUNDAY, AUGUST 21, FROM 12-4 PM ONLY. Entry receipts MUST be presented to superintendents during checkout time 12-4 ONLY). If someone besides the owner of the exhibit is picking up an item, please let the department superintendent know IN ADVANCE.

C. Forfeited: All items left after 4 pm on Sunday without prior arrangements, become property of the Routt County Fair and may be disposed of as the fairgrounds does not have stor age space for such items.

7. Awards & Premiums

A. All judges decisions are final.

B. Ribbons: The following ribbons and

- placings are available per age group, however ribbons and placings are at the discretion of the Judge. It is not a requirement of the Judge to a ward each ribbon or placing.
- Class Placings: 1st Place Blue Ribbon, 2nd Place Red Ribbon, 3rd Place White Ribbon, Participation Ribbon, Honorable Mention Ribbon
- Category Placings: Champion Purple Ribbon, Reserve Champion Lavender Ribbon, Honorable Mention Ribbon
- Division Placings: Grand Champion Purple Rosette, Reserve Champion Lavender Rosette, Honorable Mention Ribbon
 C. Special Home Arts Awards
- If there are Individual Department Awards, they are listed under each department.
- Judges Choice Award: ONE Judge's Choice award per department simply the judge's favorite entry.
- Superintendent's Award: An award given to the most outstanding exhibit in the Exhibit Hall as voted on by the Superintendents. It can be from any department and any age group.
- Helen Sherrod Outstanding Home Artist Awards: An award given to the ONE exhibitor, over the age of 18, who acquires the most blue ribbons in the Home Arts Exhibits. In the event of a tie, Champion and Reserve Champion Rib bons will also be counted.

Now you're ready for Fair Entry! ALL Entries must be done electrically, which REQURES an email address. You can do this in advance between August 1st and August 17th, OR you can do it when you come to check-in! We're here to help and WILL get your entry entered!!




CREATING ENTRIES

Each exhibitor can have multiple entries. One entry must be made for each item. For example, if an exhibitor is bringing 2 photographs, two entries into the photography class must be created. MAKE SURE YOU ARE SELECTING THE CORRECT AGE GROUP IN THE CLASS LIST!!!

Once all entries have been created for the first exhibitor, you have the choice of creating another exhibitor in this family (and entries) or proceeding to check-out. When you are COMPLETELY finished with all entries for every person in your family, YOU MUST CONTINUE TO PAYMENT AND SUBMIT BEFORE YOUR ENTRIES ARE COMPLETE!!! There are NO Fees,

but you MUST go through the payment section! You cannot reenter the "Create Entries" section once you have hit Submit, so please make sure you have EVERY-THING registered. Should you have more entries after hitting Submit, you will need to bring them to fair and have a fair manager enter those entries for you!



Click through the Department, Division and Class Lists for EACH entry. A short description is required for EV-ERY entry. This helps us if entry tags are separated from your entry at fair!

Each Exhibitor can enter a MAXIMUM of 2 entries per class. Therefore when an individual has reached the maximum number of entries for that class, the class will no longer be available for entry. If you have a 3rd item, it will need to be entered in the OPEN or MISC class and will not be judged against the other like items.

When each class entry is complete, you have 3 choices for what to do next:

- 1. If all class entries have been completed for one exhibitor, you can Register another Exhibitor in this family.

See Altitude Chart. (Example: Recipe calls for 5 minutes processing time. For 6001-8000 feet, add 15 minutes to processing time = 20 minutes total processing time). Recipe info can be included on the information label or attached as a separate label, but should be attached to the product because of food safety concerns.

- 2. Jellied products and Other Canned products must be displayed in U.S. standard jar (i.e., Ball, Kerr). Twopiece matching lids must be used.
- 3. Acceptable canning methods include pressure canned or hot water bath. It may be necessary to open home canned food entries to inspect for judging purposes. Judges will use their own discretion as to whether or not they will open and taste canned products. Directions for different methods are available from the Routt County Extension office and local libraries. Products with paraffin (wax) seals will not be accepted.

FLOWERS and PLANTS Superintendents: Suzie Copeland, Lois Caster

The Superintendent reserves the right to remove any exhibit deemed unsuitable for display. Entries identified as a noxious weed will be disqualified and destroyed.

Entries will be disqualified if they have insects or do not contain the number of blooms or stems designated in each class. Flowers should be exhibited with blooms of uniform size, shape and color, straight stems and any natural foliage.

Exhibitors must furnish their own containers.

Flowers exhibited should be at the peak of maturity, not wilting, and able to hold up well in the show. Hardening flowers after cutting is important. To prepare exhibit, gather in late afternoon the day before the show, cut stems under water and remove lower foliage with a sharp knife. Plunge immediately up to the neck into warm water for an hour before placing in a cool, dark place (refrigerator 40-50 degrees F) overnight. There should be no dead blooms present.

For the exhibits: Bloom: one individual flower with stem and foliage Stem: A lengthened flower cluster, such as a Gladiola Spray: A main stem with side branches and several blooms. Unless noted otherwise each entry should contain 3 stems.

TIP: Pour about 1/4 cup of soda pop into the water in a vase full of cut flowers. The sugar in the soda will make the blossoms last longer. If you have a clear vase and want the water to remain clear, use a clear soda, like Sprite or 7-Up.
