### Entry Rules

1. All contestant registrations must be completed online at [www.sarodeo.com/bbq](http://www.sarodeo.com/bbq). The registration fee is \$50 per contestant. Contestant age divisions:
  - Junior (ages 4-10)
  - Senior (ages 11-17)
2. Online registration will close when we reach capacity of 50 Kid Cooks, or on January 14, 2023, whichever comes first.
  - Late entries may be accepted onsite until the start of the event, *if spots are available*.
3. Payment must be made at the time of registration.
4. Refunds and cancellations are subject to the following policy:
  - If SABBQ is notified more than 30 days before the date of event, we will refund 50% of your payment.
  - We will not be able to process a refund of your payment if we receive notification less than 30 days from the event.

5. Each participant includes one Kid Cook and one **Responsible Adult Assistant (RAA)**. The RAA is an adult (18 years or older) who is responsible for the safety and oversight for each child entered.  
**\*\*Responsible Adult Assistants are only allowed to supervise one Kid Cook\*\***
6. If you plan on registering multiple contestants, please indicate so on the registration form.
7. A signed Indemnification Form and Release Form are required for each Kid Cook to participate.

8. Each Kid Cook and their RAA will check in at the Buckaroo Que registration tent to receive their space assignments. Space assignments will be given out in order of Kid.
9. **Cooker check in. Space assignments will not be assigned prior to the contest and no changes of space will be made.**
10. Once cooking is completed, a member of the Buckaroo Que Committee will remove hot pits and items to a designated cool down area.
  - Hot items, including grill grates, cannot be removed until they are cool to the touch.
11. The BBQ pit provided will be available for the Kid Cooker to take home and enjoy and will be available for pick up after the awards ceremony on Saturday afternoon.
  - All BBQ pits left unclaimed will be available for a \$10.00 donation.

## Equipment

### **Kid Cooker will need (not provided by the event organizer):**

- BBQ Rub
- BBQ Sauce
- Cooking Utensils (tongs, spatula, brush, etc.)
- Apron
- Table/ TV Tray (small table to set your supplies on)
- Additional charcoal, woodchips, etc. if necessary (one bag of charcoal will be provided for you and must be used before any of the products of your choosing)

### **Provided by the Buckaroo Que Committee:**

- BBQ Pit
- Charcoal
- Lighters
- Pork Chops for Competition

## Cooking Rules

1. Parents please understand this is a **KIDS' COOK-OFF!** Adult supervision is required; however, the child **MUST** be responsible for prepping, seasoning, cooking and presenting their entry.
2. Kid Cooks will cook on charcoal grills provided by the Buckaroo Que Committee in the Buckaroo Que area.

\*\*Kid Cooks **MUST** use the charcoal provided by the Committee prior to using any other charcoal, woodchips, etc.

\*\*Due to safety concerns and space restrictions, **NO** propane tanks of any size are allowed in the contest area. A BBQ Committee member will be on hand with a small portable propane tank to assist in lighting if needed.

3. The competition pork chops will be provided by the Buckaroo Que Committee.
4. No other pork chop is to be present in the Buckaroo Que area other than the pork chops provided.
5. Pork chops must be prepped in the Buckaroo Que area. Pork chops may not leave the Buckaroo Que area under any circumstance. If a pork chop leaves the Buckaroo Que area, the pit/contestant is disqualified.
6. Pork chop may **NOT** contain decorations, toppings, stuffing or additional items.
7. Sauce must be cooked on; no additional sauce may be added once the pork chop is in the tray. No pooling of sauces or liquids is allowed in the turn-in tray.
8. **NO GARNISH** is allowed. Only the pork chop is allowed in the turn-in tray.
9. Pork chops may not be marked in any way, with the exception of grill marks.
10. Pork chops may be lightly trimmed before, but not after, cooking.
11. Pork chops must be submitted in the turn-in trays distributed by the Buckaroo Que Committee. The foil provided must stay in the tray under the pork chop, unfolded.
12. If the Kid Cook abandons the pit for any reason, other than a medical emergency or to use the restroom, the Kid Cook must notify a Buckaroo Que Committee Member. If at any time, the adult is completing the primary preparation or cooking of the pork chop the pit/contestant may be disqualified. If the pit has been abandoned by the Kid Cook without notifying the Buckaroo Que Committee, the pit/contestant may be disqualified.

*Pork chops will be judged based on 3 categories: **TASTE, TEXTURE and APPEARANCE***
