

2023 Sacramento County Fair May 25 – 29, 2023 Farm Garden In A Wheelbarrow



Thank you for choosing to participate in the Sacramento County Fair Farm Garden In A Wheelbarrow Program. This program is designed to educate young children, grades Pre-K to 6th where their food comes from and how it grows. The goal is to reach as many students as possible and educate them on the importance of agriculture and that their food doesn't just come from the grocery store, through a fun hands-on science based curriculum.

Materials:

- 1. A wheelbarrow
- 2. 1 bag of Soil
- 3. Seeds to grow: Green Romaine Lettuce, Carrots, Watermelon Radishes and Beets. (The ingredients of a salad)
- 4. This informational packet contains plans and tips for planting, as well as a listing of links to grade appropriate teaching resources.
- 5. Display Board Tri-Fold
- 6. Binder Any size (supplied by your class)

With these items you now have a complete unit and hands-on activity for you and your students to learn from and enjoy.

Planting your Wheelbarrow Salad Garden

Seeds and Planting Dates:

Carrots - Danvers 126 (73 Days)

Green Romaine Lettuce (70 Days)

Beets - Detroit Dark Red (60 Days)

Watermelon Radishes (30 Days)

Planting Tips:

- 1. Plan the layout of your garden. Take into account the square footage of area that you have for your crops to grow. Remember that carrots are a root vegetable and will need subterranean room to grow.
- 2. Assemble your wheelbarrow, if not already done. First drill a few holes in the bottom of the wheelbarrow to allow excess water to drain.
- 3. Place a layer of paper towels, newspaper, or coffee filters in the bottom of the wheelbarrow to cover the holes. You need to create a filter so that water runs out but not the soil. Fill the wheelbarrow with the good planting mix up to 2 inches from the top. Do not pack the soil tightly. Giving the roots space to grow is essential.

- 4. Water the planting mix and let it stand until water is completely absorbed.
- 5. Make 3 rows, about ½ inch deep in the area that you plan to plant a specific crop of seeds. Drop several seeds a few inches apart in the furrows. Pinch the soil to cover the seeds.
- 6. Set your container in a sunny place. Keep the soil moist.
- 7. When lettuce seedlings are about 3 inches high, choose 6 of the sturdiest and thin out carefully, with equal space between the seedlings. Evaluate all crop seeds for thinning out.

Display Board Rules:

- 1. Your display must include your wheelbarrow, a tri-fold board with photos and information about your project, and your class display of learning.
- 2. Your tri-fold board cannot be extended in any way, and information can only be displayed on one side. Board must include the name of your school, grade level and teacher's name.
- 3. You must provide a binder (any size you wish), containing documentation and photos of the progress of your Farm Garden In a Wheelbarrow. Your display of learning is to be a journal assignment from one of your lessons or activities. Journal must include some form of writing assignment and a picture. Teachers with students in the pre K to Kindergarten grade level can use photo journals if necessary. Journals must be together in a binder. **Assignments should be placed in protective sheets to keep them neat and clean.
- 4. ALL work should be done by STUDENTS. Teachers can assist when necessary.
- 5. Your wheelbarrow should be decorated to the fair theme "Let Eat, Have Fun and Celebrate the Red, White and Blue.
- 6. Student's names must be attached to the handle(s) of your wheelbarrow. Be creative!
- 7. If not continuing in the program in 2023, please make arrangements to return your wheelbarrow to the Sacramento County Fair. Or let us know at drop off that you will not be returning to pick it up.

Delivery of Wheelbarrows

All wheelbarrows **must** be delivered to the Sacramento County Fair by Sunday, May 21, 2023 between the hours of 8 am and 11 am. You will enter through Gate 12 off of Ethan Way, and drop off at Building C. There will be a sign to tell you where to turn.

Judging & Awards

Exhibits are judged based on evidence of education and ribbons are awarded to the top three entries. Ribbons will be distributed directly to the winning classroom.

Wheelbarrows (decorations included) will be emptied, and project supplies will be thrown out, if not picked up by Friday June 2nd.



Teacher's Agreement & Responsibilities

The purpose of this agreement between the Sacramento County Fair and the above named teacher is to make clear our intentions and requirements regarding our Agricultural Literacy Program. The goal of the program is to increase Agricultural Literacy in the classroom. Our method is to develop and assemble learning "kits" that teach students about "food and fiber" through the use of hands-on, in class projects.

- ◆ Agree to return wheelbarrow, after plants are harvested and classroom enjoys salad, for re-use for program in 2024.
- ♦ Agree to have some type of protective underlay for the wheelbarrow to protect the floors at school and to assist the janitorial department in low impact issues arising from the wheelbarrow. (ie: watering leaks)
