Locals from Monterey selected to serve on Salinas Valley Fair Boards

King City, CA – The Salinas Valley Fair Board appointed three people to the Fair's governing board at their regular monthly meeting held in November at the fairgrounds in King City. Over the course of six months the Salinas Valley Fair Board's Appointment Committee collected letters of interest, selected top applicants and interviewed five finalists for open positions on the board. At the end of the process, the board accepted the committee's recommendation to appoint three South County residents, Oscar Avalos, Matthew Cauley and Travis Domingos to the fair board.
