Monterey International Wine Competition Announces Awards

KING CITY, CA - The 2019 Monterey International Wine Competition, wrapped up on Sunday, March 10th at the Salinas Valley Fairgrounds in King City. Eighteen judges representing all aspects of the wine industry swirled and sipped through 730 entries, resulting in the selection of 61 Platinum Award winners, 154 Gold Award winners and 43 'Best of' award designations.

Platinum awards are reserved for wines scoring 94 points and above. Gold honors awarded to wines scoring 90 to 93 points. The wines scoring a minimum of 90 points and the highest point total in each category are recognized as the 'Best Of' for the 2019 competition.

Special honors include the Wine of the Year - the 2015 V. Sattui "Paradiso" Red Wine from Napa Valley (97 points), and the Best of Monterey County - the 2016 Ghost Hull Cabernet Sauvignon, San Lucas Vineyard, San Lucas, Monterey County (96 points).

This year's Winery of the Year is awarded to Halter Ranch Winery of Paso Robles, CA. This award recognizes the overall quality of the wines entered in the competition.
