

Market Goat Judge: Madison Andrade, Manhattan, KS

Class 1

4-H Market Goats 60 lbs. – 67 lbs.

1<sup>st</sup> – Felipe Quezada – Orcutt Hill 4-H – Going to lead off this class with a good looking, stout-featured wether who's really level made and stout hipped. He offers some shape to the outside of his lower leg and still puts his pieces together in a neat package. Really like this one through his from 1/3 as he's long fronted and wide chested, a good one to go ahead and win this class.

2<sup>nd</sup> – Joseph Souza – Orcutt Hill 4-H – The wether in second is really good in term of his body shape while also being big footed, stout hipped, and tucked up neat about his chest floor. He also looks wide-topped and good in terms of muscle shape right behind his shoulder. It's when set in motion where he gets straighter about his hock, and he additionally needs more muscle through his lower leg.

**3**<sup>rd</sup> – **Jessica Souza** – **Orcutt Hill 4-H** – Coming in third is a stout featured wether who I can appreciate how he ties his neck high at the top of a smooth shoulder, is wide chested, and reads with a bigger, stouter hip from behind. I just wish he matched what he offers up high with more muscle down low. He needs a shot more muscle through his twist and I'd also like to square him up at his knee.

**4**<sup>th</sup> – **Jenny Souza** – **Orcutt Hill 4-H** – Going to round out our class with a good fronted, bold ribbed wether who is level and balanced in his lines. Within this class he needs to be wider and more opened up off either end and I'd also like to give him a shot more muscle through his twist and the outside of his lower leg.

Class 2

4-H Market Goats 75 lbs. – 80 lbs.

1<sup>st</sup> – Liana Erenberg – Santa Ynez 4-H – The caped shouldered wether in first offers a striking look from the side in terms of freshness. He's long fronted, stout, and wide hipped, while still being balanced in terms of his lines. Where I'd get critical on him is from behind. He gets flatter twisted and I'd like to see him a little stouter featured to match his shape up high and look from the side.

**2**<sup>nd</sup> - **Marguerite Halsell** – **Knight's 4-H** – This wether in second offers a lot of look and feature in the fact that he's big footed, stout featured while still being bold ribbed and streamline in his look. Get on top of him and that's where I'd like to fix him. I'd like to see him offer a better, fresher shape behind his shoulder and be bigger hipped.

**3**<sup>rd</sup> – **Elizabeth Souza** – **Orcutt Hill 4-H** – I really like this wether in third from the shoulder back on the side profile. Level hipped and robust in his rib shape while still having some stoutness of feature. He gets a little plainer through his front 1/3 and needs to offer more muscle from behind.

## Class 3

4-H Market Goats 91 lbs. – 96 lbs.

1<sup>st</sup> – Ashli Oliver – Santa Ynez 4-H – A nice trio but going to go ahead and use the combination wether of the class to win. He offers a lot of muscle and shape both up high and from behind, while still having a good look from the side. I'd like to make him stronger on his rear pasterns and smoother about his shoulder, but that's getting picky of easily the heaviest muscled one in the class.

2<sup>nd</sup> – Sophia Coleman – Santa Ynez 4-H – A fresh presented wether here in second. He's big-footed and good in his lines, while also being smooth-shouldered and stout, level hipped and wide chested. Get in from behind him and he gets flatter through his twist, and I'd also like to square up his hock.

**3**<sup>rd</sup> – **Kira Scheck** – **Santa Ynez 4-H** – A tall fronted wether who is elevated about his chest and big-footed here in third. Today he just gets plainer in his look and needs to be fresher about his chest and reads with more muscle from behind.
