#### Class 1

4-H Market Sheep 118 lbs. – 125 lbs.

**1<sup>st</sup> - Rylie Halsell – Orcutt Hill 4-H** – A close pair but I'm going to go ahead and use the ewe to win. She's wider and more opened up off either end, while also being stouter and bigger footed. She comes wide and stout out of her hip, reading with shape through her twist. I wish she was a little neater and longer fronted and hooked stronger behind the shoulder.

**2<sup>nd</sup> – Kortney Barks – Nipomo Foothill 4-H** – A balanced wether in second that reads with a fresh shape to him. I wish he was stouter featured and wider chested. I'd also like to make him smoother shouldered and read with more true shape through his twist from behind.

#### Class 2

4-H Market Sheep 129 lbs. – 140 lbs.

**1<sup>st</sup> – Wyatt Wonnell – County Line 4-H** - A really nice wether that's going to go ahead and win this class. He instantly hit me with a good look and show ring presence, being stout featured and big footed. He reads really good in his shape up high and behind with a stout and powerful hip. To get picky on him, it's when set in motion where I'd like to see him move with more comfort out of his hip and hind leg, but I still love this one from the side.

**2<sup>nd</sup> – Maeli Ayon – Nipomo 4-H** – Another stout featured wether here in second. From the side he puts together a lot of nice pieces as he's good fronted and good in his lower body balance. He reads a little plainer in his shape and muscle, but still gives a good look.

**3<sup>rd</sup> – Alyssa Guerra – Cinco Campanas 4-H** – A long bodied, tall fronted wether to round out his class. He reads good in his muscle pattern, today just needs to be stouter featured, bigger footed, and more opened up to contend with those ahead of him.
