Class 1

FFA Market Sheep 94 lbs. – 109 lbs.

1st – Holly Solomon-Fournier – Santa Ynez FFA – A nice speckled wether to win this class. He's wide chested and topped while still offering a lot of features down low. I'd like to see him set better at his knee and be leveler out of his hip.

2nd – Andrea Lopez – Pioneer Valley FFA – A good profiling wether in second. He reads with some shape up high and is wide, stout hipped. I wish he was more genuine in his shape from behind and wider chested.

3rd – Megan Goldsmith – Righetti FFA – From the side, the wether in third is really balanced and good in his lines. He's also neat chested and long fronted. When set in motion, he needs to be leveler hipped and additionally needs to be wider and more opened up off either end.

4th – Kamryn Brooke Inutan – Righetti FFA – Another long sided wether to round out the class. He's elevated in his chest and big footed. He just reads flatter ribbed and needs more muscle through his twist.

Class 2

FFA Market Sheep 120 lbs. – 127 lbs.

1st – Maria Pacheco – Santa Maria FFA – A nice class winner that offers a lot of muscle both up high and from behind while still being bold ribbed. She gets a touch straighter on her hock and picks up in her spine when set in motion.

2nd – Julissa Flores – Pioneer Valley FFA – A complete ewe here in second. Shes good bodied and has a good shape up high and to her rib. She gets a little plainer from behind and could be more extended up front.

3rd – Viviana Nava – Pioneer Valley FFA – A wether in third that I can appreciate up high, as he features good muscle shape behind his shoulder. When set in motion, he gets up in his top and I'd like to see him wider chested.

4th – Araceli Ramirez – Santa Maria FFA – A nice wether in fourth to round out our class. He's got some extension and a good shape to his forearm. He gets plainer in his shape up high and from behind while also being flatter in his rib shape.

Class 3

FFA Market Sheep 130 lbs. – 137 lbs.

1st - Gillian Villa – Pioneer Valley FFA – A really heavy muscled one to go ahead and win this class. Although he's not the most extended up front or neatest chested, he's still got a lot of muscle shape and dimension up high and behind. Additionally, he's stout and big footed.

2nd – Elizabeth Beebe – Pioneer Valley FFA – This wether in second is really wide chested, round bodied, stout hiped, and offers a good shape through his twist. He gets a little straighter about his hock and I'd like to see him more comfortable when set in motion.

3rd – Emily Ward – Nipomo FFA – Another nice one here in third. A good looking wether from the side that's tall and elevated about his front 1/3 and good bodied, while still being level out of a square hip. He needs to be wider and more opened up of either end and needs some more muscle through his twist and lower leg.

4th – Juan Palomares – Santa Maria FFA – This wether in fourth is tall shouldered, good hiped, with a nice shape to his twist from the side. He needs to be more relaxed in his top when in motion and I'd like him to read with a fresher shape over his rack and loin.

5th – Amy Sanchez Reyes – Righetti FFA – This wether in fifth is long sided and has some extension. I'd like for him to be stouter featured and not as plain in his shape up high.

6th – Marvely Gomez – Santa Maria FFA – Another good ewe in sixth. She has a good turn to the outside of her lower leg and is stout featured. Today, she just gets a touch plainer in her shape up high.

7th – Idalis Gill – Santa Maria FFA – A nice ewe in seventh. When stopped and set up, is where I can appreciate her look as she's good fronted and round bodied. I'd like to see her more relaxed in her spine on the go and wider chested.

8th – Mackenzie Thomas – Santa Ynez FFA – Still a good wether to round out this class in eighth. Really long bodied and level hiped, just gets straighter in the angle of his shoulder and needs a shot more muscle through his twist.

Class 4

FFA Market Sheep 140 lbs. – 145 lbs.

1st – Joscelyn Vargas – Santa Maria FFA – This is the combo sheep of the class in first. He's got some look as he's opened up at his chest and robust in his rib shape with a stout hip and muscle from behind.

2nd – Racquel Ramirez – Pioneer Valley FFA – A nice wether in second who's tall shouldered, good bodied, and big footed. Just needs to be fresher about his shape, both up high and from behind and be neater chested.

3rd – Coral Mogavero – Righetti FFA – This one in third is good looking from the side with a good body shape, he needs to read with a fresher shape up high and id like him to hook in stronger behind his shoulder.

4th – Heriberto Mendez – Santa Maria FFA – The ewe in fourth is good in her lower body progression and width up high. She just gets to plain shaped and needs more extension up front.

Class 5

FFA Market Sheep 150 lbs. – 160 lbs.

1st – Mariana Charro – Santa Maria FFA – A good shaped wether that wins this class pretty handedly in terms of freshness. He's got a good shape, is long bodied, although I wish he was a touch more relaxed in his spine.

2nd – Zaira Hernandez – Santa Maria FFA – Got a stout, big legged ewe in second. She's got some muscle and look, I'd like to see her leveler topped and more elevated about her front 1/3.

3rd – Noemi Asunsion – Santa Maria FFA – This ewe is wide and stout hipped with a good shape behind her shoulder. Today she just gets a touch straighter about her shoulder and needs to be stouter legged and bigger footed.

4th – Paola Valdovinos – Pioneer Valley FFA – There's no denying the power and shape that this wether in fourth comes with, I just wish he put it all within a better balanced package.

5th – Ayari Portillo – Santa Maria FFA – The ewe in fifth views with shape and muscularity from behind but needs to offer a better shape behind her shoulder and gets flatter ribbed.

6th – Natalia Sanchez – Pioneer Valley FFA – A solid wether in sixth. He's good in the angle to his shoulder and long hipped, reading with some shape. He gets plainer in his look and needs to be stouter featured and bigger footed.

7th – Lisbeth Ramos – Santa Maria FFA – The ewe in seventh sets up nice from the side and gives a good look, she ultimately just needs more muscle to move up any higher.

8th – Daniela Martinez – Santa Maria FFA – The ewe in eighth is tall fronted and long bodied. She just needs more muscle from behind and needs to be pulled apart up front.
