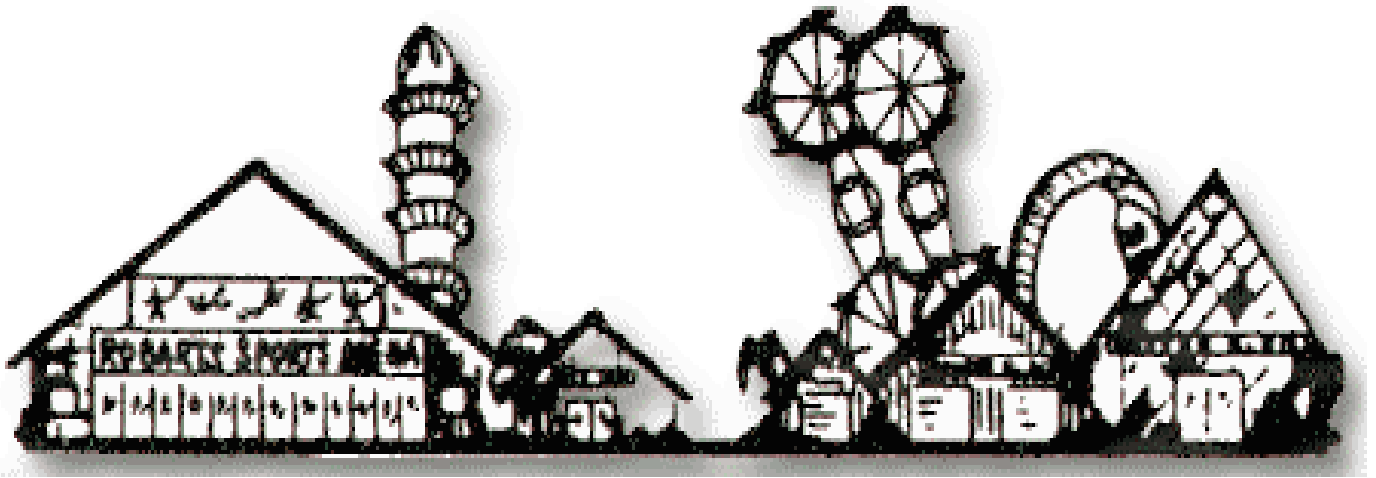

ATTENTION SCHOOLS, FACILITY, ORGANIZATIONAL, AND GROUP ENTRANTS

1. All ribbons that are awarded to items which are entered through a school, either public or private, or through a facility, group, or organizational program will receive ribbons only. There will be no monetary value on these ribbons.
2. ACTIVITY DIRECTORS, SUPERVISORS, LEADERS, TEACHERS, PARENTS etc. must sign for minors or entrants that are incapable of signing for THEMSELVES, and are responsible for entry and pick up of item(s) and premiums if eligible.
3. If the entrant is **participating as PART of an organization, program or group activity** they must use the enclosed **PROGRAM/ORGANIZATION ENTRY FORM** in the back of this book. **Ribbons are awarded only, no monetary premiums can be awarded.**
4. Parents must sign for minors if entering individually and are not part of an organization. Minors cannot sign for themselves whether individual or program/organization entrant.
5. If anyone other than a parent of a minor or the individual themselves signs the entry form, the **PROGRAM/ORGANIZATIONS ENTRY FORM MUST BE USED.**
6. Only parents of minors or an adult individual entrant's **own signature** can be used on the **INDIVIDUAL ENTRY FORM** found in the back of this book.
7. Please use discretion if letting a minor fill out entry forms. **The entry form is an official document. Please take into consideration the need for legibility of this form in order for the data to be entered correctly. These are for clerical use.** Information not included, or misinterpreted is not the responsibility of the Creative Arts Committee or the Fair Office. We appreciate involving children in the process, but we ask parents or teachers to supervise the process where minors are involved.

Official Creative Arts Rules and Regulations

1. The Sarasota County Fair Creative Arts Show is open to all **amateur** artists, hobbyists and crafters who reside within Sarasota County (including winter residents with a local address). There is no fee to enter. All items will be judged on their own merit using the 'Danish Judging System' (with the exception of Rosette winners and Best of Show). Explanation of ribbons and prizes can be found within the Rules and Regulations portion of this booklet. Originality, neatness and adherence to rules will be part of the judging criteria.
2. All entries must be pre-registered. No item will be accepted that has not been pre-registered with the official entry form and received by, or if mailed: postmarked by **Friday, February 3, 2023**.
3. All entries (except baked goods) will be accepted on Saturday, March 11th (9:00AM - 4:00PM) and Sunday, March 12th (9:00AM - 4:00PM) at the **POTTER BUILDING** 2896 Ringling Blvd. **Please enter and exit through the north side doors on Ringling Blvd. only.**
4. All Baked Goods entries will be accepted ONLY on Monday, March 13th (9:00AM-12 Noon) at the **POTTER BUILDING** 2896 Ringling Blvd. **Please enter and exit through the north doors on Ringling Blvd. only. ** ORCHIDS MAY ALSO BE ACCEPTED ON THIS DATE.**
5. Entries will be released on **Monday, March 27th between 12 Noon and 5:30PM ONLY**. There are **NO EXCEPTIONS**. All entries must be picked up during this time **or they become the property of the Sarasota County Fair, and ANY premium money will be forfeited**. No entry will be released from the premises at any other time.
6. Culinary items will be deemed acceptable or not at the time of entry. It will be at the discretion of the CREATIVE ARTS SHOW STAFF to eliminate or accept an entry for judging.
7. All entry forms **MUST** have a **COMPLETE** description of the work (Example: color, subject, etc.). Be specific to your particular item in the description field. Your item needs to be distinguishable in descriptions so that the judges can identify it on their judging sheets. **PLEASE SEE EXAMPLE OF PROPER FORM FILL-IN ON PAGE 10**. You must have specific items in mind when registering. **Enter only work that is completed. Incomplete entry forms are not accepted.**
8. **You may enter in only one of the three (3) classes:**
 - a. Adult (18 yrs and older)
 - b. Youth (5 yrs. To 17 yrs)
 - c. Challenged (physically or mentally challenged persons)
9. **You may enter in any or all of the eight (8) divisions:**
 - a. Fine Art
 - b. Needlecraft
 - c. Crafts
 - d. Horticulture
 - e. Culinary Art/Canning
 - f. Collections
 - g. Class & Group Projects
 - h. Miscellaneous
10. You may enter in any of the lot numbers. **However, you may enter only 15 ITEMS** (one registration form per individual). **You may enter only once in any one lot number.**

Rules and Regulations Continued

11. All entries must be the work of the exhibitor and must have been completed within the last fair year. (March 2022 to March 2023). **ITEMS MUST BE CLEAN, IN GOOD CONDITION, IN GOOD TASTE, FINISHED, AND FINISHES MUST BE DRY.**
12. Pre-registration forms are included on the last page of this booklet. One form is for entrant as an Individual, one is for entrant as a participant from an organization. **You may enter as an Individual only on the Individual form. If you are part of an organization entering items, organizational leaders must enter the group (i.e. "Girl Scout Troop # 118", or "Mr. Billings 4th Grade Class") using Organization Form.**
13. This department of the fair is for exhibition and competition only. The sale of articles is not permitted.
14. If an entry that does not conform to specifications of its particular class or is not in compliance with the rules is inadvertently accepted by one of our volunteers, that entry will not be judged or displayed. **Entry does not guarantee a judgement in this case.**
15. Judging is based on Originality, Neatness, and Adherence to Rules. Please discourage from entering multiple similar items within a group or family. **Culinary recipes repeated within groups or family; or repeated projects that are not distinguishable as original works of the individual may be subject to disqualification.**
16. The blue ribbon winners in each lot will be judged against like items for the Section Rosette. Section Rosettes will be judged against each other for the Division Rosette. Division Rosettes will be judged against each other for the Best of Show Rosettes. Judges will in all cases awarded only such ribbons as they think the merit of the entry may warrant. No ribbons will be awarded to unworthy entries even without competition.
17. All premium money will be paid on the basis of the judges records, not by the ribbon attached to the article.
18. Creative Arts Show Staff will be in attendance when the buildings are open. All possible protection will be given to all exhibits. **The Fair Association is not liable for damages or loss of property.**
19. It is assumed you have read and agreed to the rules and regulations that govern the Fair and Creative Arts Show when you enter your items in the show.
20. The Creative Arts Show Staff, Supervisor, and Board Director reserves the right to screen entries and to make all final decisions.
21. **Please remember every person serving you is a VOLUNTEER who is donating their time in order that your artwork, craft may be showcased at the Sarasota County Fair. Throughout the process of Registration, Judging, Display, and Release, your entry is being cared for with the utmost respect by volunteers. Your patience, understanding, and participation is greatly appreciated.**

Explanation of Ribbons

All ribbons that are awarded to items which were entered through a school either public or private or through a youth program will receive only ribbons. There will be no monetary value on these ribbons. Any youth who enters their art, craft or hobby individually into the fair and the item is awarded a ribbon, will receive the monetary value for the ribbon.

1. Each lot number in each class will have ribbons awarded for first place, second place, third place, and honourable mention.
2. Each blue ribbon lot winner will be in contention for the section winner in each class.
3. Each section blue rosette will be in contention for division winner rosette in each class.
4. Each division winner rosette will be in contention for the best of show rosette for each class.
5. You will only receive premium money for highest award received.

FINE ARTS DIVISION

1. **NO Corrugated Cardboard, Poster Board OR Construction Paper will be accepted. NO FRAMES OR GLASS will be accepted. All paintings and drawings must be mounted on Mat Board OR Foam Board.**
2. All Fine Art items that are mounted on Mat Board OR Foam Board are limited in size to **no larger than 16" x 20"**.
3. All work entered otherwise will be disqualified. No Paint by numbers will be accepted. Any items that cannot be hung will not be judged. Larger pieces on stretched canvas will be accepted without frames only. **No item with glass will be accepted.**

JJJ. CLASS OR GROUP PROJECTS

269. All Types

1. Class room and group projects are to be displayed by Creative Arts Show Staff, not exhibitor.
2. **Only one project will be accepted from each Class/Group of exhibitors. A teacher or leader may enter a project for each group they lead but each group may only enter one project.** (For example Mrs. Smith may enter her 3rd grade Art Class group project and her 4th grade Art Class project etc. or Mrs. Brown can be a leader for Troop 64 and 84 etc. or if different nursing homes have the same art teacher).
3. **Use separate forms for separate groups.**
4. Class or Group projects may be entered under adult supervision only. These projects are done as a group and enter under the supervisor's name, group name and address.

CULINARY ART/CANNING DIVISION

1. Baked goods will be accepted only on **Monday, March 13th, 2023** between the hours of 9:00 AM and 12 Noon at THE POTTER BUILDING, 2896 Ringling Blvd.
2. All baked goods must be on sturdy plastic plates or foil covered cardboard cake boards. Appearance should be appetizing.
3. All baked goods must be placed **INSIDE** a zip lock bag. If the item is too large for a zip lock bag, it must be completely wrapped in plastic wrap.
4. Originality of the recipe, neatness, technique, and difficulty are factors in judging. All ingredients **MUST** be fresh. Most important is fresh flour, oil, and butter.
5. Entries made from mixes or have a mix as an ingredient in the recipe will **NOT** be accepted.
6. **Recipes are to be typed or printed on ONE SIDE of a 4"x 6" card and securely attached to the covering. Do not put your name on the recipe card please.**
7. **ITEMS THAT REQUIRE REFRIGERATION WILL BE ACCEPTED IN THE CREATIVE ARTS SHOW FOR 2023.**
8. Decorated cakes will be judged on decoration only. A form may be used in place of cake under the decoration.
9. All decorated cakes must be on a cake board **FOUR (4)** inches larger than the cake.
10. No artificial flowers.
11. **No machine breads accepted.**

6. Exhibitor's name must be on the **BOTTOM** of the jar **ONLY**.
7. Any entry that does not meet these requirements will be **DISQUALIFIED** and **NOT JUDGED**.
