2022 SILVER DOLLAR FAIR JUNIOR LIVESTOCK AUCTION

Approximately 500 local youth, participating as 4-H, FFA, Grange or Independent Exhibitors, will raise and sell livestock at the 2022 Silver Dollar Fair Junior Livestock Auction on May 28. These Junior Exhibitors have selected, fed & groomed a steer, hog, lamb, goat, or rabbit meat pen, and brought them to the Fair to be judged, graded & sold. These projects provide education and experience in accounting, biology, nutrition, marketing, and personal accountability.

Please join us for the Junior Livestock Auction – Saturday, May 28, at 9:00 a.m. in the Cassady Pavilion.

HOW TO BECOME A BUYER:

Sign up prior to the Auction by calling the Fair Office (530) 895-4436 or printing the New Buyer Application found on this website. Please register by noon on Friday, May 27th.

The Silver Dollar Fair Junior Livestock Auction is a **TERMINAL SALE**. Animals sold at the Auction shall be sent to a contracted processing plant for harvest. **No live animal pick-up of Auction animals.** *No Exceptions*. Once an animal has been shown in a market class and determined by the Judge to be "market ready" or "market acceptable" it is consigned to the Auction and cannot be withdrawn by the exhibitor or the buyer.

- Auction Day: Buyers will receive a catalog listing animal in sale order, weights and owner's name. As each animal enters the ring, the Auctioneer will ask for bids. Animals are sold by the pound, except for Rabbit Meat Pens are sold as a pen of 3. To bid on an animal, raise your buyer number. The bidding continues until the highest bid is reached, with the animal being sold to the highest bidder without reserve. "Bumps", additional price per pound by non-buyer will not be allowed. Whether you win the bid or not, your bidding will help the sale.
- Market animals must meet weight requirements to show & sell in the Jr. Livestock Auction. Although the animal's actual weight from the scale is listing in the sales catalog, exhibitors will be paid to the top weights as listed in the Exhibitor Handbook.

"PAY TO" TOP WEIGHTS:

Steer – 1300 lbs. Hog – 280 lbs. Lamb – 150 lbs. Goat – 105 lbs.

As per the Silver Dollar Fair Board of Directors, the fair will bill up to four (4) buyers in equal amounts per animal. Animals may be purchased by more than 4 individuals; however, the person signing the bill of sale agrees to accept responsibility for payment to the fair for the entire amount of the purchase. A maximum of four (4) buyers shall be acknowledged per purchase during the Junior Livestock Auction.

<u>After Purchase:</u> After you have successfully purchased an animal, please keep your number visible until an Auction Runner has brought you the "Bill of Sale. **Before signing, please**:

- Verify the price per pound you paid.
- PRINT your name, mailing address & phone number. Sign the Bill of Sale. You will be given a copy for your records.
- Indicate whether you wish the animal to be **custom** or **resale** (resold back to the fair).
 - Custom The Fair has made arrangements for the animal to be sent to a federally inspected USDA facility. After processing, the animal will be delivered to the designated locker of your choice. Processing charges will be billed by the Fair. The Buyer is responsible for additional cut/wrap fees from the locker.
 - **Resale** The animal is consigned back to the Fair for Resale. The buyer pays the difference between the bid price and the resale price and receives no meat in this disposition.
- Payment may be made at the time of the purchase at the Livestock Office or you will be billed. Invoices are due and payable within 10 days of receipt. If not paid within 30 days after Auction, 1.5% interest will be accrued monthly.

Complimentary sandwiches and beverages will be available for buyers and their guests from 11 am-3pm at the JLA Buyers Hospitality Tent.
