WHAT'S NEW IN 2022?



The Exhibitor Handbook/Class Listings & Rules will only be on the website. It will be separated in sections and labeled for easier location of information. Be sure to read all rules and regulations before entering.

Any exhibitor that has more than 10 items in the same department must deliver the items BEFORE 3:00 PM on receiving day or contact the fair office to schedule an appointment with the Department Supervisor.

Preserved Foods new classes – canned fruit pie filling and canned juices.

Quilt entry limit has been increased to 2 entries per lot per exhibitor.

Quilt Judging will be open to the public on Sunday, August 7, 2022, starting at 8:00 AM.

Photography new classes – drone and panoramic.

Vocational Education – Advanced Group Project.

Rabbits will be brought in on Tuesday, August 9 from 1:00 to 4:00 PM.

Junior Boer Goat class was added.

Livestock Showmanship will be returning to the way it was run in 2019.

The Adult Small Animal Showmanship Walk On Contest has moved to Friday, August 12th at 5:30 PM.

In Showmanship, 4-H and Independent Exhibitors are encouraged to wear the traditional 4-H uniform. New blue or black jeans may be substituted for the white jeans. A while collared shirt (short or long sleeved) must be worn.

Parent Passes MUST be purchased online through the entry program. Two passes per family of a junior livestock exhibitor may be purchased in advance at a discount. Passes WILL NOT be sold onsite.

Auction Thank You cards must be turned into the fair office no later than September 30th or the seller will have to request their check from the Junior Livestock Auction Committee once meetings resume.

REMINDERS:

- ENTRY DEADLINE IS FRIDAY, JULY 22, 2022.
- All still exhibits premium payouts will be paid out in cash at the fair office during posted hours. A form of identification or exhibit claim ticket and a signature will be required for pickup of premiums. Premiums not picked up within 10 working days of the closing of the annual fair will be considered a donation to the Association. Premiums will be paid out in accordance to State Rule IV Awards and Scoring 4. (Cash awards will be paid only as recorded on the signed judging sheet or judging affidavit and only to the exhibitor).
- Livestock fair premium checks will be available on Sunday at the Livestock Office. Starting Monday, they can be picked up in the main office; any premium checks not picked up within 10 working days of the closing of the annual fair will be considered a donation to the Association.
- The ONLY premiums mailed will be the Senior Horse Show.
