- The quality desired in these exhibits is the quality that brings the best financial return in the commercial market. Exhibits must be at least equal in maturity as the stage of ripeness required by Section 42513 of the California Agricultural Code in order to be considered for awards.
 - Mature = having reached that state of ripeness that will ensure the completion of the ripening process to a degree which will insure palatability after the removal of the product from the tree, plant or vine.
 - Overripe = having an advanced state of maturity, which causes the production to be undesirable for human consumption in a fresh state.
- The type or variety of products must be provided on the entry form.
- Entries must be presented on a white paper plate with the correct number of specimens, or the entry will be disqualified.
- Short stems should be left on green beans and cherry tomatoes. Leave 1-1.5” stem on beets.
- Bulk = 1 pint in an open jar.
- Sheaves = mature and cured, not less than 4” in diameter at the bottom tie.
